- 7 Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No 6, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days of a demand being made therefor, the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot

(b) General

- 1 The Government of such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes of the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned
