(2) they have never been within thirty miles of a rabies infected area, and

(3) they are healthy at the date of examination
Dogs may be permitted to enter the Colony from
Tanganyika if accompanied by a veterinary certificate of health but shall be subject to a quarantine
period of six months from the date of arrival in the

Colony

The movements of dogs from Uganda is permitted by rail only, or by such other means as the Chief Veterinary Officer may from time to time direct The movement by road from Tanganyika is not permitted

- 1 Each farm will be auctioned separately
- 2 These farms are in the Highlands, and purchase will be confined to Europeans only (or their accredited agents), in conformity with the decision of His Majesty's Government
- 3 The highest bidder will be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the farm will be put up again at the last undisputed bid
- 4 The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bid shall be retracted
- 5 Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer, immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 10 per cent of his purchase money, and should the same be tendered by cheque, such cheque must be accompanied by a banker's guarantee.
