# A Bill to Alter the Time within the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- 1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Alteration of Short title Time Ordinance, 1936
- 2 At and after midnight on the thirty-first day of Alteration of December, 1936, time within the Colony and Protectorate local time shall be deemed to be and shall be two and three-quarter hours fast on Greenwich mean time
- 3 The Alteration of Time (Repeal) Ordinance, 1929, is Repeal hereby repealed No 37 of 1929

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS

At a recent conference of the East African Governors it was agreed that a standard time of  $2\frac{3}{4}$  hours ahead of Greenwich mean time should be adopted in Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika Territory and Zanzibai with effect from the 1st January, 1937

This was in accordance with a recommendation made by the Associated Chambers of Commerce of Eastein Africa

The Bill is designed to give effect to the proposal

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

- 1 The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bid shall be retracted
- Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer, mmediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 10 per cent of his purchase money, and should the same be tendered by cheque, such cheque must be accompanied by a banker's guarantee.
