Such plans, etc, shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Eldoret, for necessary action

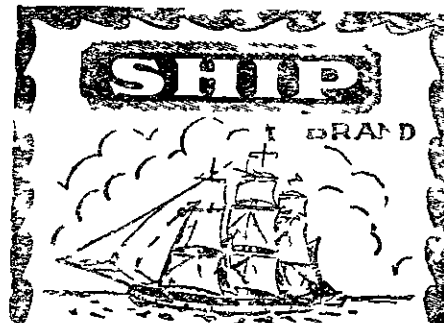
