PROVINCIAL ADMINISTRATION REORGANIZATION NYANZA PROVINCE AND RIFT VALLEY PROVINCE

IT IS notified for general information that with effect from the 1st day of January, 1946, that portion of the Kisumu-Londiani District known as the Londiani Ward of the Nyanza District Council and the Londiani Township will be administered from Nakuru and will for administrative purposes be included within the Nakuru District, Rift Valley Province.

Police matters in the area will continue to be referred to Police, Londiani.

Education matters in the area will be referred to the Inspector of Schools, Rift Valley Province, Nakuru.

BELGIAN BANK NOTES

IT IS notified for general information that Belgian bank notes of denominations of 100, 500, 1,000 and 10,000 francs have now been demonetized and any person who, on the 9th October, 1944, was in possession of such notes, is invited to deposit them at the Belgian Consulate General, Nairobi, between the 2nd and 31st January, 1946.

The notes should be accompanied with a declaration, in triplicate, on forms which can be obtained from the Belgian Consulate General, P.O. Box 961, Nairobi.

Any holdings outside East Africa should also be declared.

These notes will be repatriated to Belgium and placed in a special blocked account in the name of the owner. Details regarding the subsequent unblocking of these accounts will be supplied by the Belgian Consulate General at a later date.

Failure to deposit notes within the prescribed time will result in a total loss of the value of such notes.

Any additional information required will be supplied by the Belgian Consulate General.

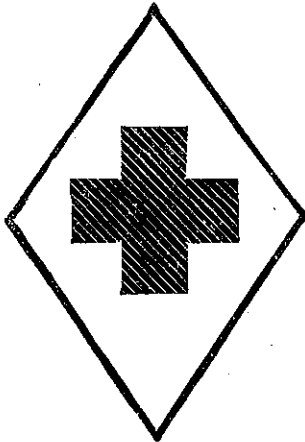
