FOREST BOUNDARY COMMISSION

UNDER the provisions of section 4 of the Forest Ordinance (No. XXVI of 1941), the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the Gazette declare unalienated and unreserved Crown land and, subject to the provisions of the Native Lands Trust Ordinance, any area in any native reserve to be a "forest area". In like manner the Governor in Council may declare that any forests or part thereof shall cease to be a forest area. All the so-called forest reserves in the Colony are reserved under this section of the Ordinance as "forest areas" which is their legal title.

2. Under section 5 of the Forest Ordinance it is provided that after plans have been deposited in the District Commissioner's office for public inspection for a period of three months the Governor in Council may proclaim a forest area to be a demarcated forest. No alteration to the boundaries of a demarcated forest is possible except by resolution of the Legislative Council. No forest areas have yet been declared demarcated forests, and it is considered that the time has come when the greater legal security afforded by section 5 of the Ordinance should be accorded to the Colony's forests and finality should be reached with regard to their boundaries.

3. It is felt that the recommendation as to what should be the final boundaries of any demarcated forest is not one that should be made by the Conservator of Forests alone; all interests concerned and not least questions affecting water supplies must be taken into consideration in arriving at the proper recommendation. The Government has therefore decided that to carry out this important work a Forest Boundary Commission shall be appointed composed *inter alia* of representatives of the departments concerned with forests, agriculture and water, with an independent chairman. The terms of reference of the Commission are as follows:—

- (1) To study in detail on the ground, where required, the boundaries of such existing forest areas as the Member for Agriculture may direct.
- (2) To make recommendations, accompanied by full supporting reasons, for the inclusion within any forest area of any land contiguous to it which they deem should properly be included within such forest area, and to indicate the degree of urgency and importance which they attach to the acquisition of such areas outside the existing forest areas.
- (3) To take local evidence and to make recommendations as to any excision from such forest areas as they may deem fit with full reasons for such recommendation.
- (4) To make general recommendations for the declaration of new forest areas.

When implementing the above terms of reference the Commission should take into account that the Government considers that the establishment and maintenance of demarcated forests, both productive and protective, are of the highest importance to the well-being of the Colony. The Government is of the opinion that it is an important part of the duties of the Commission to consider what areas which are now outside the present boundaries of the forest areas should more properly be included within the forest areas to which they are contiguous. The Commission should also examine the question of the reservation of further forest areas and recommend in what manner they should be acquired bearing in mind that it is of the first importance to ensure that all land in the Colony, which under proper land utilization should be under forest, should in fact be reserved for that purpose.

4. The recommendations of the Commission in respect of alterations to existing forest boundaries will be considered by the Government as and when they are received with a view to the boundaries being made permanent and the areas so enclosed being declared demarcated forests.

5. The personnel of the Commission is as follows:—

Sir Guy Pilling, K.C.M.G. (*Chairman*).

A member to be nominated by the Native Lands Trust Board.

A member to be nominated by the Highlands Board.
The Settlement Officer.

The Hydraulic Engineer, Public Works Department.

A representative of the Forest Department.

A member of the Forest Advisory Committee.

6. The work of this Commission will continue over a considerable period as there is a vast amount of work for it to deal with. The Board will issue interim reports dealing with those specific areas to which its attention has been directed, and these interim reports will be considered by the Government and action will normally be taken on them without waiting for the final report of the Commission.

7. Notice will be given in the Press of the dates on which the Commission will visit different forests and the times and place at which it will take evidence on any proposals for alteration of existing forest boundaries. Public bodies or individuals who wish to put forward such proposals should do so through their local Assistant Conservator of Forests giving full reasons and, wherever possible, accompanied by a sketch plan. All such proposals will in due course be dealt with by the Commission and it is the intention of Government to make no further alterations in forest boundaries pending the receipt of the interim reports referred to in the preceding paragraph.

8. In conclusion it should be stated that as the above terms of reference indicate the main task of the Commission is to make recommendations which should ensure for all time the establishment, preservation and adequate maintenance of all forest areas, both protective and productive, which will contribute to the well-being and development of the Colony.
