#### NOTICE TO TRANSPORT CONTRACTORS

TENDERS are invited for the transport of Locust Bait and Stores to any part of Kenya (including N.F.D.) and for Southern Ethiopia and for the supply of lorries for work in the field under District Commissioners based on:—

Mombasa, Nairobi, Nakuru, Kitale, Nanyuki.

Tenderers should state:—

- (a) How many lorries will be available on demand.
- (b) The tonnage capacity of each lorry.
- (c) What charge would be made on a load mile basis. (N.B. Loads to be to the satisfaction of the I oading Officer.)
- (d) What charge would be made on a daily rate basis.

The successful tenderers will enter into contracts with Government and it will be an essential condition of the contract that the contractor shall have lorries available for immediate use as and when required by District Commissioners, or by the East African Anti-Locust Directorate.

Contractors will supply their own petrol and oil except when working in the field under District Commissioners, on a daily rate basis, when Government will supply petrol and oil Every assistance on a priority basis will be given by Locust Control officials as regards obtaining adequate supplies of petrol spares and tyres and tubes, though no guarantee can be given that these items (particularly the last two) will be available.

The tender must be on the basis of a load mile delivered and breakdown of a lorry will be the responsibility of the tenderer.

Should a lorry employed on daily rates under a District Commissioner break down, no payment will be made for days during which the lorry did not work.

The successful tenderers will be required to contract from 1st September, 1946, to 31st August, 1947, and will be required to enter into a bond of £2,000. In addition the contractor will be required to agree to a clause in the contract whereby, if he fails to produce the number of lorries required at any one time he will pay to the Government £50 in respect of each lorry he fails to produce.

Present indications are:

- (a) A campaign in the Turkana District from September to October, 1946, requiring possibly one to 80 lorries at any one time, though this figure might have to be exceeded.
- (b) A campaign in any or every part of Kenya and Southern Ethiopia possibly from October, 1946, to February, 1947, requiring possibly one to 500 lorries at any one time, though this figure might have to be exceeded.
- (c) A campaign in any or every part of Kenya and Southern Ethiopia possibly from April, 1947, to July, 1947, requiring possibly one to 500 lorries at any one time, though this figure might have to be exceeded. (No objection will be offered to the employment of sub-contractors.)

Satisfactory guarantee of ability to perform must be given.
