A Bill to Provide for a European Hospital Services Scheme

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

PART I—PRELIMINARY

Short title and
commencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Hospital Services (European) Ordinance, 1946, and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, appoint.

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires— 5

“Authority” means the European Hospital Authority established under the provisions of section 3 of this Ordinance;

“contributor” means any person who is liable under the provisions of section 12 of this Ordinance, to contribute to the Fund, his wife and any child who is maintained by such contributor as a member 10 of his family;

“Fund” means the European Hospital Fund established under the provisions of section 11 of this Ordinance;

“hospital” means any Government hospital, and any other hospital, nursing or maternity home declared by the Authority, by notice 15 published in the Gazette, to be a “hospital” for the purposes of this Ordinance;

“hospital treatment” means all nursing care and attendance afforded in any hospital to a hospital patient, maintenance in a hospital of any such patient and such other treatment and facilities as 20 the Authority may, from time to time, prescribe.

PART II—CONSTITUTION OF THE AUTHORITY

Establishment
of Authority.

3. (1) There shall be established an Authority to be known as the “European Hospital Authority”, which shall have the powers and perform the duties and functions, conferred upon it by this Ordinance. 25

(2) The Authority shall consist of—

(a) the Member for Health and Local Government;

(b) the Director of Medical Services;

(c) three persons, one of whom shall be a woman, to be appointed by the Governor; 30

(d) one European Elected Member of the Legislative Council of the Colony to be appointed by a majority of the European Elected Members of such Council present and voting at a meeting of such European Elected Members convened for such purpose; 35

(e) one person to be appointed by the Kenya Branch of the British Medical Association;

(f) one person to be appointed by the Board of the Nakuru War Memorial Hospital;

(g) one person to be appointed by the Board of the Eldoret 40 Hospital;

(h) one person to be appointed by the Board of the Kitale Hospital;

(i) such other persons as the Governor, on the recommendation of the Authority, may, from time to time, appoint. 45

(3) The names of the persons appointed under the provisions of paragraphs (d), (e), (f), (g) and (h) of sub-section (2) of this section shall be submitted to the Governor.

(4) The following provisions shall apply to members of the Authority appointed under the provisions of paragraphs (c), (d), (e), 50 (f), (g), (h) and (i) of sub-section (2) of this section—

(i) they shall hold office for a period of two years, but shall be eligible for reappointment;

(ii) any such member who absents himself from four consecutive meetings of the Authority, without the permission of the 55 Authority, shall *ipso facto* cease to hold office as a member of the Authority;

(iii) the appointment of any such member may be cancelled by the person in whom the power of appointment is vested, in like manner as such appointment is made. 60

(5) The powers of the Authority shall not be affected by any vacancy in the membership thereof.

(6) The members of the Authority shall, from among their number, elect a Chairman, who shall hold office as such for one year from the date of such election, and shall be eligible for re-election.

(7) Any member of the Authority, other than a person who is in the Public Service of the Colony, may at any time resign his office by an instrument in writing addressed to the secretary thereof, and from the date of the receipt by the secretary of such instrument, such member shall cease to be a member of the Authority.

(8) The appointment, removal, death or resignation of any member of the Authority shall be notified in the Gazette.

4. The Authority when constituted in the manner provided by section 3 of this Ordinance shall be a body corporate and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal and shall be officially and judicially noticed and the seal shall be authenticated by the signature of the Chairman and secretary of the Authority. The authority may sue and be sued in its corporate name.

Incorporation of the Authority.

5. (1) The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Authority unless he has obtained leave of absence from the Governor, or is absent on duty, or on leave, or is incapacitated by sickness or other cause. In the absence, for any cause, of the Chairman, the members of the Authority shall choose one of their number, who shall, during the absence of the Chairman, act as chairman.

Chairman, quorum and meetings.

(2) The Chairman at any meeting shall, in addition to his deliberative vote as a member of the Authority, have a casting vote.

(3) Five members of the Authority shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Authority and all acts, matters or things authorized or required to be done by the Authority may be decided at any meeting at which a quorum is present.

(4) The Authority shall meet at such time and place and on such days as the Authority may determine.

(5) The Chairman or Acting Chairman may at any time call a special meeting of the Authority.

(6) An extraordinary meeting shall be summoned by the secretary of the Authority within fourteen days of a requisition for that purpose addressed to him by any three members of the Authority.

6. (1) Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Authority shall be regularly entered in a book to be kept for the purpose, and the book shall be kept so as to show proper details of the business conducted or transacted at such meeting. The minutes of the proceedings of each meeting shall be submitted at the next meeting and, if then passed as correct, shall be confirmed by the signature of the Chairman of the meeting, and shall, when so confirmed, be *prima facie* evidence in all courts and places that the proceedings, as recorded in the minutes, were the proceedings of such meeting.

Minutes.

(2) A copy of the minutes, confirmed by the Chairman as provided in sub-section (1) of this section, shall be forwarded to the Chief Secretary.

7. The Authority may, from time to time, make rules for the transaction of its business, including the power to appoint committees to whom it may delegate authority to carry out such portions of the work committed to it as it may from time to time determine.

Powers of Authority to make rules for transaction of its business.

PART III—GENERAL POWERS OF THE AUTHORITY

8. The Authority, in its discretion, is hereby empowered—

General powers of the Authority.

(a) to provide hospital treatment for contributors upon such terms and conditions as it may, from time to time, prescribe;

(b) to make payments out of the Fund to any hospital;

(c) to enter into any agreement with the governing body of any hospital for any of the purposes of this Ordinance;

(d) to pay an allowance not exceeding fifteen shillings per diem for such period as may be prescribed, towards the cost of fees incurred by a contributor, in respect of hospital treatment received by such contributor;

(e) to pay an allowance not exceeding fifteen shillings per diem for such period as may be prescribed, towards nursing and medical expenses actually incurred by a contributor during a disability suffered by him, in cases where hospital facilities are not available;

- (f) to pay any of the following allowances to a contributor in respect of the confinement of a contributor or the wife of a contributor—
- (i) a sum not exceeding five pounds in respect of pre-natal medical attendance; 5
 - (ii) a sum not exceeding five pounds in respect of medical attendance at the confinement;
 - (iii) in cases where, in the opinion of the Authority, exceptional medical or nursing expenses are unavoidably incurred, an additional sum not exceeding five pounds; 10
 - (iv) in cases where hospital facilities are not utilized, a sum not exceeding ten pounds in respect of expenses actually incurred on qualified nursing services;
- (g) to acquire land or buildings or any estate or interest therein for any of the purposes of this Ordinance; 15
- (h) to erect and maintain any buildings for any of the purposes of this Ordinance;
- (i) to acquire land or buildings for the purpose of the lease of such land or buildings, or any portion thereof, to enable any person other than the Authority to provide hospital accommodation and treatment to contributors; 20
- (j) to lease any land or building vested in the Authority, and to accept surrender of any such lease;
- (k) to sell, exchange or surrender any land or building vested in the Authority; 25
- (l) to purchase and, where necessary, to dispose of any equipment, plant and stores for any of the purposes of this Ordinance;
- (m) to invest in any securities authorized by law for the investment of trust funds, any moneys (whether consisting of reserve funds or income) at any time at its disposal, and not immediately required by it for any of the purposes of this Ordinance. 30

Appointment
of officers
and servants
of Authority.

9. The Authority may appoint and employ on such terms and conditions as it may, with the approval of the Governor, determine, such officers and servants as it may deem necessary for the efficient administration of the Authority. 35

Authority may
declare any

10. The Authority may, by notice published in the Gazette, declare any hospital, nursing or maternity home to be a "hospital" for the purposes of this Ordinance.

PART IV—FINANCIAL

40

Establishment
of Fund.

11. (1) There is hereby established a Fund to be known as the "European Hospital Fund," which shall be administered by the Authority in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

(2) The Fund shall consist of—

- (a) the contributions which are required to be paid to it under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 12 of this Ordinance; 45
- (b) such moneys as are required to be paid into it out of the general revenue of the Colony under the provisions of section 13 of this Ordinance; 50
- (c) the proceeds of any loans which may, from time to time—
 - (i) be raised by the Governor, with the approval of the Legislative Council of the Colony, for the purposes of this Ordinance; and
 - (ii) be made, with the approval of the Governor, out of the general revenue of the Colony; 55
- (d) voluntary subscriptions, donations and bequests.

Contributions
to the Fund.

12. (1) Every European resident in the Colony shall, commencing from the year 1947, pay, in every year, as a contribution to the Fund—

- (i) five shillings, where the individual's total income does not exceed sixty pounds per annum; 60
- (ii) ten shillings, where the individual's total income exceeds sixty pounds per annum but does not exceed one hundred and twenty pounds per annum; and
- (iii) twenty shillings, where the individual's total income exceeds one hundred and twenty pounds per annum, 65

and such contribution shall be payable as if it were personal tax within the meaning of the Personal Tax Ordinance, 1940, and all the

provisions of such Ordinance relating to the collection and recovery of personal tax shall apply to the collection and recovery of such contribution.

(2) Every European who, under the provisions of the Income Tax Ordinance, 1940, is liable to pay income tax for any year of assessment commencing on or after the 1st day of January, 1945, shall pay in respect of each such year of assessment a contribution to the Fund as follows:—

Provided that the contribution payable in respect of the year of assessment commencing on the 1st day of January, 1945, shall be reduced by one-half.

(3) The contribution payable under the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section shall be due and payable either wholly or in two instalments as if it were income tax payable under the provisions of the Income Tax Ordinance, 1940, by the individual for the year of assessment, and all the provisions of that Ordinance (other than those contained in paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of section 67) relating to the collection and recovery of income tax shall apply to the collection and recovery of such contribution.

(4) For the purposes of sub-section (2) of this section, sub-section (2) of section 8 of the Income Tax Ordinance, 1940, shall be read as if—

- (a) the figures "1945" were substituted for the figures "1937", which appear in the fifth line of paragraph (a) thereof; and
- (b) the figures "1945" were substituted for the figures "1940", which appear in the seventh line of paragraph (b) thereof.

(5) In this section—

- (a) "chargeable income" and "year of assessment" have the same meaning as that assigned to them by the Income Tax Ordinance, 1940;
- (b) "European" means any person of pure European origin or descent.

13. There shall be paid into the Fund, in every year, out of the general revenue of the Colony, a sum of money equal in amount to that required to be paid, under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 12 of this Ordinance, in respect of chargeable income in excess of £250.

14. The Fund shall be applied towards—

- (a) the payment of all undertakings, allowances and expenses authorized by this Ordinance;
- (b) the creation of such reserve fund as the Governor in Council may, in his discretion, require;
- (c) the payment of interest on loans and the repayment of loans as the Governor may require.

15. The Authority shall keep capital and income accounts, and other books of accounts and abstracts as required by the Governor.

16. The Authority shall furnish to the Governor as soon as possible after the expiration of each year a report upon the administration of the affairs of the Authority, together with a balance sheet and statement of the revenue of the Authority duly audited by the Government Auditor or such other auditor as may be approved by the Governor. The report shall be laid before the Legislative Council of the Colony.

Purposes to which Fund may be put.

Special accounts to be kept.

Report and audited accounts to be forwarded annually.

PART V—GENERAL

Indemnity to members of the Authority.

17. No member of the Authority shall incur any personal liability for any loss or damage caused by any act or omission in the administration of the affairs of the Authority unless such loss or damage be occasioned by an intentionally wrongful act on his part. 5

Allowances to be absolutely inalienable.

18. (1) No allowance payable under the provisions of section 8 of this Ordinance shall be capable of being assigned or charged or of passing to any other person by operation of law: Provided that nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the Authority, with or without the consent of the beneficiary, from paying the whole or any 10 portion of such allowance to any other person for the use of the beneficiary or in satisfaction to the extent thereof of any of his just debts or liabilities.

(2) Any person who demands or accepts from any beneficiary under section 8 of this Ordinance any certificate or any acknowledgment or undertaking that would constitute a legal or equitable assignment of or charge upon any allowance payable under such section if such allowance were capable of being legally assigned or charged, shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on conviction therefor, be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand shillings. 20

Exemption in respect of stamp duties, registration and recording.

19. Notwithstanding anything contained in any other Ordinance, no stamp duty, registration or recording fee shall be payable on any agreement, receipt or other instrument made, given or executed for any of the purposes of this Ordinance.

Authority may make regulations with the approval of the Governor in Council.

20. (1) The Authority may, with the approval of the Governor 25 in Council, make Regulations prescribing anything which may be prescribed under the provisions of this Ordinance and any Regulations which, in its opinion, are necessary for the purpose of giving full effect to the provisions of this Ordinance.

(2) All Regulations made under the provisions of sub-section (1) 30 of this section shall be laid before the Legislative Council of the Colony within fourteen days after the making thereof if the Legislative Council is then in session, and, if not, shall be so laid before the Legislative Council within fourteen days of the next ensuing session. 40

Right to hospital treatment or allowance restricted in cases where person is entitled to claim compensation or damages.

21. (1) If, in respect of any injury, any contributor has recovered or is entitled to recover any compensation under any Workmen's Compensation or other Ordinance, on account of hospital treatment, or has recovered or is entitled to recover special damages in respect of any hospital treatment, he shall not be entitled as of right to claim 45 any hospital treatment or allowance under this Ordinance in respect of the same matter: Provided that the Authority may in any such case provide hospital treatment or make a provisional allowance, under the provisions of paragraph (d) of section 8 of this Ordinance, to any contributor who is entitled to claim payment in respect of any 50 hospital treatment actually supplied.

(2) No hospital treatment provided, or payment made, under the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section shall restrict the right of the contributor concerned to recover the full amount of compensation or damages, and the cost of any hospital treatment provided and any 55 payment made under the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section shall constitute a charge on any compensation or special damages recovered or that may thereafter be recovered in respect of any matters mentioned in sub-section (1) of this section.

(3) Any such charge, as is mentioned in sub-section (2) of this 60 section, may be recovered as a debt due to the Authority from the person to whom any such compensation or damages have been paid or from any person liable for the payment of such compensation or damages.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to give effect to the recommendations contained in the Majority Report of the Hospital Committee dated the 2nd August, 1944, which Report was accepted by the Government and approved of by a Select Committee of the Legislative Council of the Colony.

In paragraph 40 of the above-mentioned Report the Committee recommended, *inter alia*, that the powers of the Hospital Authority, which it recommended should be set up, should be extended from time to time until ultimately it becomes "responsible for the Colony's hospital facilities". The Bill has been drafted with the object of enabling that to be done without the necessity of having to make numerous amendments to the measure after it has been enacted into law.

Attention is directed to the following clauses which contain the main matters of interest in so far as policy is concerned:—

1. The definition of "hospital treatment" contained in clause 2 which enables the treatment and other facilities, which may be given to a contributor, to be extended by regulations made by the Authority, with the approval of the Governor in Council.

2. Clause 3 provides, *inter alia*, that there shall be established an Authority to be known as the "European Hospital Authority", and the proposed personnel of that Authority is set out in sub-clause (2) of the clause.

3. Clause 4 provides that when the Authority has been constituted in the manner provided by clause 3 that it shall be a body corporate, and clauses 5, 6 and 7 contain provisions which are considered necessary to enable the Authority to function properly.

4. Clause 8 sets out the general powers of the Authority. The powers which the clause seeks to confer have been made wide in their scope with the object of making it possible to give effect to the recommendation of the Hospital Committee, referred to above. Particular attention is directed to paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (f) and (e) of the clause, which seek to give effect to recommendations (1) and (3) contained in paragraph 39, and to the recommendation contained in paragraph 46 of the Hospital Committee's Report.

5. Clause 9 enables the Authority to appoint and employ on such terms as it may, with the approval of the Governor, determine, such officers and servants as it may deem necessary for the efficient administration of the Authority.

6. Clause 11 seeks to establish a fund to be known as the "European Hospital Fund", to be administered by the Authority in accordance with the provisions of the measure.

7. Clauses 12 and 13 seek to give effect to recommendation (2) contained in paragraph 39 of the Hospital Committee's Report.

8. Clause 14 sets out the purposes for which the fund may be applied by the Authority.

9. Clause 16 requires the Authority to furnish to the Governor as soon as possible after the expiration of every year a report upon the administration of its affairs, together with a balance sheet and statement of revenue received, duly audited by the Government Auditor or such other auditor as may be approved by the Governor. The clause also requires that such report shall be laid before the Legislative Council of the Colony.

10. Clause 17 seeks to exempt any member of the Authority from any personal liability for any loss or damage caused by any act or omission in the administration of the affairs of the Authority, unless such loss or damage is occasioned by an intentionally wrongful act on the part of such member.

11. Clause 18 seeks to make any allowance payable to a contributor under the provisions of clause 8 absolutely inalienable.

12. Clause 19 exempts any agreement, receipt or other instrument made, given or executed for any of the purposes of the measure from the payment of stamp duty, registration and recording fees.

13. Sub-clause (1) of clause 20 enables the Authority, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make regulations prescribing anything which, under various clauses of the measure, may be prescribed and any others which in its opinion are necessary for the purpose of giving full effect to the provisions of the measure, and sub-clause (2) of the clause requires such regulations to be laid before the Legislative Council of the Colony within fourteen days after the making thereof if the Legislative Council is then in session, and, if not, that they shall be so laid before the Legislative Council within fourteen days of the next ensuing session.

14. Clause 21 seeks, *inter alia*, to restrict the right of a contributor to receive hospital treatment or to receive an allowance under clause 8, if such contributor is entitled to recover compensation under any Workmen's Compensation or other Ordinance, on account of hospital treatment, or has recovered or is entitled to recover special damages, in an action at law, in respect of any hospital treatment.

If the provisions of this measure become law it is estimated that it will result in a charge against general revenue of approximately £10,000 to £12,000 per annum.

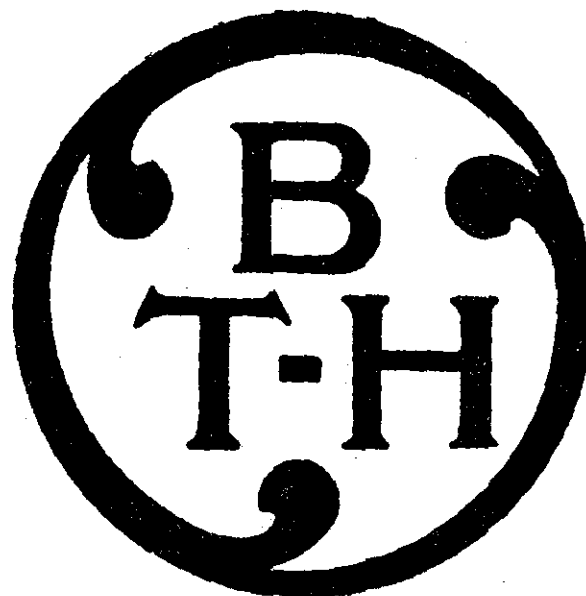
