MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Under the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 135 of the principal Ordinance (the Customs Management Ordinance, 1926) all goods which are imported free of duty on the ground that they are the property of the Crown, or of an officer of the Government, or of any company, firm or individual privileged by contract or otherwise to import such goods free of duty, are liable if such goods are thereafter sold, to be charged with the same duties as would be payable on the importation of similar goods by any person to whom the concession does not apply

During the emergency large quantities of goods were imported by the Crown and it has frequently been found expedient to dispose of such goods without requiring the import duty to be paid. To cover the position the section was temporarily amended, by means of Defence Regulations, to enable the Governor, in proper cases, to exempt such goods from the liability of import duty, and upon expiry of the Defence Regulations in February, 1946, the temporary amendment was continued, until the 31st day of December, 1946, by Ordinance No 20 of 1946

It is considered desirable that the Governor should continue to be vested with the above-mentioned power and this Bill, therefore, seeks to amend the principal Ordinance accordingly

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

As a result of negotiations between the Coffee Board and the Ministry of Food, an agreement was reached whereby the Ministry of Food will take 6,000 tons per annum of Kenya coffee at an agreed price for a period of five years commencing with the 1947/48 crop. If effect is to be given to this agreement it is essential that control over the marketing of coffee be continued to cover the whole term of the agreement, i.e. until the 30th June 1952.

Section 27 of the principal Ordinance (the Coffee (Marketing) Ordinance, 1946) provides that the measure shall continue in force until the 30th day of June, 1949.

As the above-mentioned agreement was considered in the best interests of the coffee industry of the Colony, all coffee planters were circularized by the Coffee Board asking whether they would agree to the life of the principal Ordinance being extended for the whole period of the agreement. An overwhelming majority of those voting agreed to the life of the Ordinance being so extended.

This Bill, therefore, seeks to amend the principal Ordinance by prolonging its life until the 30th June, 1952. It also seeks to amend section 18 of the Ordinance to empower the Board to sell coffee to the United Kingdom Ministry of Food without first offering it for sale by public auction in Nairobi.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

and shall be issued with redeemable preference share(s), of the value of Sh 20 each, in respect of such credit, which share(s) shall be subject to the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the company

2 When the amount contributed to the cess by any pig producer, as arrived at in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 1 of this Schedule, is not a multiple of Sh 20, such pig producer shall elect whether he will receive or pay the difference required to bring such amount to a multiple of Sh 20

3 Redeemable preference shares allotted in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule shall be in the following form —

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Uplands Bacon Factory (Kenya), Limited, (Constitution) Ordinance, 1945, provides, *inter alia*, that the first shareholders of the Company shall be the Pig Industry Board to which all the ordinary shares shall be allotted, and the pig producers who have contributed to the cess to whom preference shares shall be allotted in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule to the Ordinance, and the Schedule provides that every pig producer who has contributed to the cess shall be allotted one redeemable preference share for every twenty shillings contributed by him to the cess up to the date of the coming into operation of the Ordinance

In 1941 when the cess was instituted the necessary staff required in order to keep the records of individual producers in pounds weight was not available. A communiqué was, therefore issued to all producers notifying them that for the purpose of calculating the amount of cess contributed by him, each supplier would be credited with—

150 lb per pig for Baconers,
80 lb per pig for Porkers.

and that the total amount so credited would be divided into the total cess collected and that each individual producer would be credited with a share of the capital subscribed, calculated accordingly

Although pig producers paid a cess of three cents per pound on the actual weight of pigs delivered, in view of the fact that no records exist regarding such weights it is impossible to allocate shares in accordance with the present provisions of the above-mentioned Ordinance

This Bill, therefore, seeks to amend the Ordinance to enable an allocation of shares to be made in accordance with the terms of the above-mentioned communiqué

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
