A BILL TO AMEND THE TRANSPORT LICENSING ORDINANCE, 1937

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Transport Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Transport Licensing Ordinance, 1937, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

2. Section 23 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor —

23 (1) Any person who—

(a) being an applicant for the grant or variation of a licence, is aggrieved by the decision of the Licensing Authority on the application, or 15

(b) having duly made an objection to any such application as aforesaid, being an objection which the Licensing Authority is bound to take into consideration, is aggrieved by the decision of the Licensing Authority thereon, or 20

(c) being the holder of a licence, is aggrieved by the revocation or suspension thereof,

may within the time and in the manner prescribed appeal to the Appeal Tribunal appointed under the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section 25

(2) For the purposes of hearing appeals under the provisions of this section, the Governor in Council may appoint an Appeal Tribunal (hereinafter referred to as the Tribunal) consisting of such persons not exceeding five, as he may determine 30

(3) The members of the Tribunal shall hold office for such term and under such conditions as the Governor in Council may determine

(4) Save as may be prescribed, the Tribunal may regulate its procedure and proceedings as it may think fit 35

(5) Three members of the Tribunal shall form a quorum

(6) The Tribunal may, on any appeal, affirm or reverse the decision of the Licensing Authority, or make such other order as to the Tribunal appears necessary 40 and just

(7) Where the Tribunal has received an appeal under the provisions of this section, it shall peruse the same and, if it considers that the grounds of appeal are frivolous or vexatious or do not disclose sufficient reason 45 for interfering with the decision of the Licensing Authority, may summarily reject the appeal. The decision of the Tribunal under the provisions of this sub-section shall be final and conclusive”

3. The principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein the following new section —

Addition of new section 32 to the principal Ordinance

5 “32 Notwithstanding anything in this Ordinance contained, where an application has been or is made, on or after the first day of January, 1947, by any person for a licence under the provisions of this Ordinance and has been refused, no subsequent application made by the same person for a similar licence shall, except at the discretion of the Chairman, be entertained or adjudicated upon by
10 the Licensing Authority until a period of twelve months from the date of such application has expired. The decision of the Chairman under the provisions of this section shall be final and conclusive.”

Applications if refused, not to be entertained again for twelve months

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to amend the Transport Licensing Ordinance, 1937, in two respects

2 At the present moment the law provides for an appeal to the Supreme Court from the decision of the Transport Licensing Board. As the appeals are really on questions of fact, it is considered that it would be more suitable and less expensive for the appellant if appeals lay to an Appeal Tribunal. *Clause 2* of the Bill therefore seeks to provide for the establishment by the Governor in Council of an Appeal Tribunal to which applications on appeal from the decision of the Transport Licensing Authority may be made. In order to prevent the Appeal Tribunal from being inundated with appeals which are frivolous or vexatious or without merit, the *Clause* seeks to empower the Tribunal summarily to reject such appeals.

3 The Transport Licensing Board is experiencing great difficulty in dealing with the present volume of applications. This difficulty is heightened because many applications which have been refused after due consideration by the Board, are resubmitted by the applicants within a short time. Under the law as it stands, the Board is bound to give full consideration to a renewed application, although there may be no fresh ground for granting it. *Clause 3* of the Bill therefore seeks to amend the principal Ordinance by debarring the Transport Licensing Board from considering any application which is resubmitted within twelve months from the date of the original application, except at the discretion of the Chairman.

4 It is not possible to state what additional expenditure of public money will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.
