A BILL TO AMEND THE TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, 1928

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

No 26 of 1928

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Traffic Ordinance, 1928, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

2. Section 49 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting paragraph (i) thereof and substituting therefor the following —

“(i) (i) prescribing—

(a) the modifications and adaptations of or exemptions from any of the provisions of this Ordinance, relating to the registration and licensing of motor vehicles, in their application to vehicles brought into the Colony by any person who is making only a temporary stay therein and to motor vehicles licensed in any other country under the provisions of any law, for the time being in force in, or of any international convention applied to, such country 10 15

(b) the modifications and adaptations of or exemptions from any of the provisions of this Ordinance, relating to certificates of competency and driving licences, in their application to any person who is making only a temporary stay in the Colony and to any person holding a permit, licence or certificate entitling him to drive a motor vehicle and issued in any other country to such person under any law for the time being in force in, or under any international convention applied to, such country 20 25

(c) the procedure to be adopted, the conditions to be observed, and the fees to be paid in connexion with the issue in the Colony, pursuant to the provisions of any international convention, of any international certificate, permit, or licence, in connexion with the use of any motor vehicle outside the Colony 30

(ii) Any modifications or adaptations of or exemptions from the provisions of this Ordinance which may be prescribed by Rules made under the provisions of this paragraph shall have effect as if they were contained in this Ordinance,” 35

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

At an inter-territorial Conference held in Nairobi in February, 1946, it was recommended that, in the interests of tourist traffic, the law in East Africa, in connexion with the recognition of motor vehicle and car drivers' licences issued in other countries, should be brought into line with the legislation in force in Nyasaland

2 Moreover, before the war both Tanganyika and Uganda introduced legislation to give effect to two International Conventions, one signed in 1926 and one in 1931, on the subject of the recognition and the issue of international driving certificates and car licences, but, although draft legislation was prepared at the time to bring the Colony into line with Tanganyika and Uganda and to conform with the provisions of these two Conventions, the war interrupted its enactment. It was appreciated at the time that, as it was desired to make such provision by Rules under the Traffic Ordinance, 1928, the Ordinance was deficient and would have to be amended

3 This Bill now seeks to amend the Traffic Ordinance, 1928, so as to enable the necessary Rules to be made. If the Bill becomes law, it is proposed to make Rules bringing the law in the Colony into line with that of Nvasaland and providing for the recognition, and for the grant in the Colony of international certificates, driving permits, and fiscal permits. Such rules, it is considered, would greatly facilitate and encourage future tourist traffic.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A BILL TO AMEND THE LAND AND AGRICULTURAL BANK ORDINANCE, 1930

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Land and Agricultural Bank (Amendment) Ordinance, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Land and Agricultural Bank Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

Short title

No 3 of 1931

2. Section 4 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding thereto the following new sub-section —

Amendment of section 4 of the principal Ordinance

“(5) Where any member of the Board is absent from the Colony or, owing to illness or other cause, is unable to perform his duties as a member of the Board, the Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, appoint a person to be temporarily a member of the Board in the place of such member until such time as such member returns to the Colony, or becomes able to perform his duties, or until such member is due to retire, whichever first happens.”

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

There is no provision in the Land and Agricultural Bank Ordinance, 1930, to enable a person to be appointed temporarily a member of the Board when a substantive member is out of the Colony or, owing to illness or other cause, is unable to carry out his duties as a member.

This Bill seeks to remedy this deficiency in the law.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.
