**A BILL TO AMEND THE COFFEE (MARKETING)
ORDINANCE, 1946**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

No. 6 of 1946.

Repeal and replacement of section 18 of the principal Ordinance.

"Power of the Board to sell coffee.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Coffee (Marketing) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Coffee (Marketing) Ordinance, 1946, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

2. Section 18 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

18. (1) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board may sell, within or outside the Colony, any coffee which has been purchased by the Board under the provisions of this Ordinance. 10

(2) All coffee offered for sale by the Board shall in the first instance be offered for sale by public auction in Nairobi, and such sale shall be subject to the rules and regulations, relating to conditions of trading in coffee on the Nairobi market, of the Mild Coffee Trade Association of Eastern Africa, and the Board may place a reserve price on any coffee so offered for sale and shall have the right to bid for and purchase any such coffee: 15

Provided that this sub-section shall not apply 20 to any coffee which—

(a) the Board sells to the Ministry of Food of the United Kingdom or otherwise offers for sale, and sells, in the United Kingdom;

(b) has, in the first instance, been offered for sale by public auction in Nairobi under the provisions of this sub-section. 25

(3) The Board shall employ agents for the sale of all coffee other than coffee which it—

(a) sells to the Ministry of Food of the United Kingdom; or 30

(b) has, in the first instance, offered for sale by public auction in Nairobi, under the provisions sub-section (2) of this section,

and any agent so employed within the Colony shall be subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Mild Coffee Trade Association of Eastern Africa. 35

(4) Where the Board employs agents for the sale of coffee, it shall pay due regard to the claim of any agent carrying on business within the Colony to be so employed, and the Board shall not employ a sole agent to sell coffee except with the approval of the Legislative Council, signified by Resolution: 40

Provided that nothing contained in this sub-section shall be construed as preventing the Board, without such a Resolution, from employing one of its servants or any other person as a sole agent for the sale by auction of coffee in Nairobi. 45

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Ordinance, the Coffee (Marketing) Ordinance, 1946, so as to make it clear that the Board may employ a sole agent to auction coffee in Nairobi, without obtaining the prior consent of the Legislative Council.

The opportunity has been taken to recast the whole of the original section 18 of the principal Ordinance.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

Matron-Designate, Mombasa European Hospital

APPLICATIONS are invited from registered nurses holding midwifery qualifications for the post of Matron-Designate at the European Hospital, Mombasa. 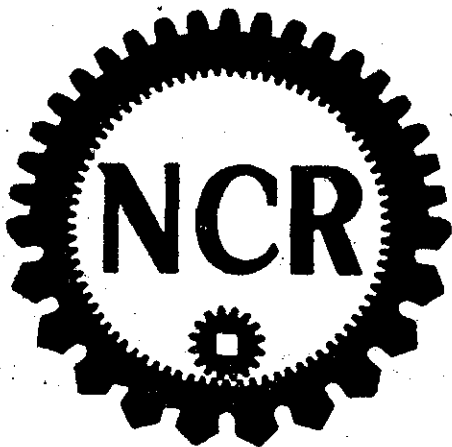
