UNAUTHORIZED BUILDING

THE Public Health (Division of Land) Board is concerned at the increasing frequency of contravention of the provisions of the above Ordinance, particularly on the outskirts of Nairobi, by the construction of houses without the statutory approval or authorization of the Board.

The attention of the public is accordingly hereby drawn to the Ordinance which is applicable to all land in the Colony—exclusive of municipalities and townships.

The Ordinance prescribes that no land shall be subdivided into plots of less than 20 acres, nor shall more than one dwelling-house or shop be constructed on any plot of 20 acres or less nor shall more than one separate dwelling-house or shop be permitted to each 20 acres of land, nor shall separate dwelling-houses or shops be built or permitted to be built less than 300 yards apart without the approval of the Board having first been obtained.

The public are reminded that contravention of the provisions of the Ordinance entails penalties up to £100 and £5 additionally for each day of the continuance of the contravention, as well as liability to the demolition of the unauthorized building.

TOWNSHIP PLOTS—NANYUKI

A plan of the plots contained in the Schedule may be seen at the offices of the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, or at the office of the District Commissioner, Nanyuki, as the case may be, or may be obtained on application to the Commissioner of Lands, P.O. Box 89, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3, post free.

The right to withdraw any plot from the sale is reserved to the Commissioner of Lands.

In the following conditions of sale the term "authority" means the District Commissioner, Nanyuki, or such Municipal Authority as may be hereafter established by law.

(a) General Conditions

1. Each plot will be auctioned separately.
2. The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.
3. The highest bidder will be declared the purchaser of the plot, but if any dispute arises as to any bid the plot will be reoffered at the last undisputed bid.
4. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer, 25 per cent of the amount of his bid. In default of such payment, the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
5. Each purchaser shall, on paying the deposit, inform the auctioneer the name or names of the person or persons on whose behalf the plot is purchased, and any subsequent grant that may be made will be issued in accordance with this information.
6. The amount bid in respect of the plot shall be considered as the stand premium payable thereon.
7. The balance of the amount bid, together with the roads and drains contribution in respect of the plot, the survey fees and the rent due to 31st December, 1948, shall be paid to the Commissioner of Lands within seven days of the date of the auction, together with the fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 120) and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent on the amount bid and the rent). In default of such payments within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit paid by the purchaser to be forfeited and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot; provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter, unless and until the Commissioner of Lands can present the purchaser the grant duly executed.
8. Subject to the proviso contained in Condition 7, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days of a demand being made therefor, the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

(b) Conditions of Grant

1. The purchaser shall erect, within two years of the commencement of his grant, a building of approved design, constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations.
2. No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the authority, and by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Nanyuki, within three months of the date of sale.
3. Grants will be made under the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The term of the grants will be 99 years from the 1st day of May, 1948, at the annual rents specified in the Schedule.
4. The grantee shall not, at any time, subdivide the plot, or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot.
5. Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the authority.
6. The grantee shall not transfer the plot nor enter into any mortgage charge or agreement of sale in respect thereof within five years of the date of commencement of the grant.
7. All out-buildings, offices, etc., shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the authority or such other person as may be appointed and shall be kept so screened during the term of the grant.

8. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

9. Grantees will be required to pay municipal rates upon the whole of the rateable interest and Government's contribution in lieu of rates assessed on the plots. A condition will, therefore, be embodied in each grant providing for the necessary adjustment between the grantee and the Government.

10. Under Government Notice No. 20 of 1945 the permission of the Supply Board is required for the erection of a building exceeding £50 in value, but no guarantee can be given that a building permit will be issued in respect of the building required to be erected under the conditions of the grant.

(c) Special Conditions in respect of Business Plots in Schedule I

1. The plot and the buildings to be erected thereon shall be for business or business cum residential purposes only and at no time during the term of the grant shall any building erected on the plot be used for residential purposes only.
 2. The grantee shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any building or buildings so as to cover more than 90 or 50 per cent of the area of the plot as qualified by three of these special conditions.
 3. If the premises to be erected are exclusively for business purposes then they must not have a site coverage of more than 90 per cent of the plot. In addition, if required, a first floor may be built provided it does not cover more than 50 per cent of the site and that this additional accommodation is used exclusively for residential purposes. If it is required to erect a single-storied building for business cum residential purposes, then not more than 50 per cent site coverage may be built upon.
 4. In no case shall the area of the plot required to remain unbuilt on be less than 10 or 50 per cent of the area, as the case may be, and the said area shall be free from any erection thereon above the level of the ground except latrine accommodation constructed in accordance with all laws and by-laws in force relating thereto, and in accordance with a design approved by the authority.
- Such open space shall be at the rear of the building, and shall extend along the entire width of the building, or for a distance of not less than 30 feet, whichever shall be the less, and the distance across such open space from every part of the building to the rear boundary of the plot shall be not less than ten feet.
5. At no time during the term of the grant shall the plot or any portion thereof, or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any trade or business which has been or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette.
 6. A veranda may be erected within the road reserve with the previous consent of the authority, and must conform to a building line decided upon by such authority.
 7. The purchaser will be required to pay, if demanded, a contribution towards roads and drains.

(d) Special Conditions in respect of Residential Plots in Schedule II

1. Fittings and floor may be of an approved temporary material and construction provided that these be replaced by approved permanent materials within six months of notice being given by the Commissioner of Lands.
2. At no time during the term of the grant shall more than one dwelling-house with necessary offices and out-buildings be erected on the plot without the consent of the Governor.
3. The plot shall be used for private residential purposes only.
4. The grantee shall not at any time during the term of the grant, erect any building or buildings to cover more than one-third of the area of the plot.
