BRITISH PROPERTY IN ITALY, HUNGARY, ROUMANIA AND BULGARIA

BRITISH owners of property in Italy, Hungary, Roumania and Bulgaria are informed that provision is made in the Peace Treaties with those countries for the return of United Nations property to its owners within six months of the date of the coming into force of the Treaties. Where property has not been returned within that period application for its return is to be made to the Government concerned within the following six months. H.M. Government is therefore making arrangements to forward, as soon as possible after 15th March, 1948, formal applications for the return of property on behalf of owners who wish them to do so.

British subjects in Kenya who have not registered their property in those countries with the Custodian of Enemy Property and who wish H.M. Government to take action on their behalf should apply at once to the Custodian of Enemy Property, P.O. Box 520, Nairobi, for advice and instructions.

VACANCIES IN KENYA GOVERNMENT

Assistant Computers, Department of Lands, Mines and Surveys

APPLICATIONS are invited for two posts of Assistant Computers in the Survey Division of the Department of Lands, Mines and Surveys, and should be sent to the Commissioner for Lands, Mines and Surveys, P.O. Box 89, Nairobi, to reach him not later than 25th September, 1948.

The duties of the posts will be to carry out survey computations of various kinds for cadastral surveys, triangulation and levelling. For the time being, their place of employment will be Nairobi, but assistant computers may later be required to work in other places in accordance with the requirements of the service.

The qualifications required of candidates are that they should be Europeans between the ages of 18 and 27 and must have passed the school certificate with credit in mathematics and English. Preference will be given to candidates who possess a knowledge of higher mathematics and to those who can operate adding and calculating machines. Applications will be accepted from women applicants but the salary payable to women will be 80 per cent of that payable to men.

The scale of salary attached to the posts is £170 by £20 to £210 by £30 to £240 by £20 to £300 by £20 to £360 per annum on Kenya European Civil Service terms, the initial salary of each successful candidate being fixed at a point in this scale in accordance with his or her qualifications and experience.

Successful candidates will be engaged in the first instance on contract for three years. At the end of that period they may be offered further employment on contract, or they may be absorbed into the permanent establishment if vacancies exist. Terms and conditions of service on three-year contract are—

- payment of cost of living allowance varying according to salary, at rates in force from time to time;
- eighteen days' local leave per annum and vacation leave at the rate of 3½ days for each month of residential service;
- free medical treatment by the Government medical service;
- participation in a widows' and orphans' pension scheme;
- when not in occupation of Government quarters, housing allowance is payable to a limit of 10 per cent of salary; in cases of hardship, due to payment of high rental, supplementary assistance may be given.

In addition they include—

- free passages after completion of the three-year agreement for officer and wife to the United Kingdom or to any other place; provided (a) the cost to the Government is not greater than that of a passage by normal sea route to the United Kingdom; (b) the passage must be taken within two months of the date on which the agreement is determined;
- a gratuity of 15 per cent of the total substantive salary drawn during the three years (excluding any cost of living allowance) is paid on determination of the three-year agreement. If the officer is absorbed into the permanent establishment gratuity will not be paid.

The salary scale and terms of service attached to these posts are at present under consideration as a result of the report of the Salaries Commission. The persons appointed will be required to serve on such terms and conditions of service as may be fixed.
