**A BILL TO APPLY CERTAIN SUMS OF MONEY FOR
THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR ENDING THE
31st DAY OF DECEMBER, 1949**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the 1949 Appropriation Ordinance, 1948.

Public revenue
and other funds
charged.

2. The public revenues for the year 1949 and other funds of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya are hereby charged towards the service of the year ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, with the sum of nine million, four hundred and eighteen thousand, nine hundred and twelve pounds in respect of the Colony, and with the further sum of five million, nine hundred and twenty-three thousand, one hundred and forty-six pounds in respect of the Development and Reconstruction Fund.

3. The moneys granted by this Ordinance shall be applied for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedules hereto.

4. The Accountant General of the Colony is hereby authorized and required from time to time upon the warrant or order of the Governor to pay out of the Revenue and other funds of the Colony for the several services specified in the Schedules hereto the said sum of nine million, four hundred and eighteen thousand, nine hundred and twelve pounds and the said further sum of five million, nine hundred and twenty-three thousand, one hundred and forty-six pounds, which will come in course of payment during the year ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine.

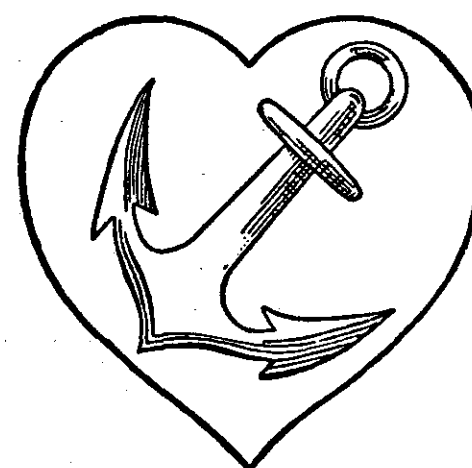
