A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE RAISING OF A LOAN OF SIX MILLION POUNDS STERLING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN PUBLIC WORKS AND OTHER PURPOSES.

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Development Loan Ordinance, 1950

Authority to raise 'oan

2. The Governor is hereby authorized to raise by loan by the issue of debentures or stock or both under the provisions of the General Loan and Stock Ordinance, 1950, an amount sufficient to produce as nearly as may be the sum of six million pounds sterling and such further sum as may be necessary to defray the expenses of issue

Application of loan

3. The money to be borrowed under the authority of this Ordinance shall be appropriated and applied to the purposes 10 specified in the Schedule hereto

Provided that it shall be lawful for the Governoi, with the sanction of the Legislative Council to be signified by resolution, to utilize any money not spent upon any one purpose specified in the said Schedule to meet any excess of expenditure in 15 respect of any other purpose specified in such Schedule

Commencement of contributions to sinking fund No of 1950

4. Contributions to the sinking fund as contemplated by sections 14 and 28 of the General Loan and Stock Ordinance, 1950, shall commence not later than one year after the date from which the interest on the stock or debenture issued under 20 that Ordinance shall commence to run

Interim power to raise money by issue of Treasury Bills 5. Pending the issue of the whole of any portion of the loan authorized by section 2 of this Ordinance, the Governor may, if he deems this necessary, raise money, up to the amount authorized to be borrowed by this Ordinance, by the issue 25 as and when required of Treasury Bills under the Colonial Treasury Bills Ordinance, and money so raised shall be repaid out of money borrowed under the authority of section 2 of this Ordinance

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will give legislative sanction to the raising, at a suitable opportunity, of the first loan under a programme of borrowing for the purpose of financing the Colony's development projects as set out in the Schedule The Bill also contains in *clause* 5 provision which will enable the Government to borrow, if necessary, on Treasury Bills pending the flotation of a loan on the London market

No additional expenditure of public moneys is expected to be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO DECLARE THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO LOANS AUTHORIZED TO BE RAISED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF THE COLONY AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE CREATION OF REGISTERED STOCK

WHEREAS it is expedient to define in the Ordinance the terms and conditions applicable to loans I erainafter authorized to be raised by the Legislature of the Colony and whereas it is expedient to provide for the creation of registered stock and to enable the Colony to take advantage of the provisions of the Acts of the Imperial Parliament entitled the Colonial Stocks Acts, 1877 to 1948, and any Act amending the same

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as he General Loan and Short title Stock Ordinance, 1950
- 2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise Interpretation requires—
- "Crown Agents" means the persons for the time being acting as Crown Agents for the Colonis in England, or any of them,

"stock" includes both inscribed and registered stock,

"registered stock" means stock transferable by instrument in writing

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Loans to be raised by debentures or stock

3. Whenever by any Ordinance authority shall have been given, or shall hereafter be given, to raise any sum of money for the purposes mentioned in such Ordinance, the Governor, or the Crown Agents acting on his behalf, may from time to time, as he or they may deem expedient, raise such sum either 5 by debentures or by stock, or partly by debentures and partly by stock

Loans to be a charge upon general revenue

4. The principal moneys and interest represented by debenture or stock issued under the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby charged upon and shall be payable out of the 10 general revenues and assets of the Colony

Borrowing upon debentures

5. When the Governor, or the Crown Agents acting on his behalf, shall deem it expedient to raise money by debentures, such debentures shall be issued in London on behalf of the Government of the Colony by the Crown Agents, upon 15 the best and most favourable terms that can be obtained, and shall be signed by any one of them on that behalf

Amount of each debenture

6. Every debenture issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be for the sum of not less than one hundred pounds sterling

Debentures may be redeemed by annual drawings or by purchase in the market or on a date fixed

- 7. The debentures shall be redeemable either—
- (a) at par on a fixed date to be declared on the issue of the debentures, such date not being later than sixty years from the date of issue

Provided that the Governor, or the Crown Agents 25 acting on his behalf, may reserve the option to redeem the debentures prior to such date on such conditions as may be declared at the time of issue, or

(b) by annual drawings at par or at the option of the Governor, or the Crown Agents acting on his behalf, 30 by purchase at or below par

Interest coupons

8. There shall be attached to every debenture coupons for the payment of the interest to become due in each half-year upon the principal represented by the debenture. The coupons shall be sufficient in number to provide for the 35 payment of the interest, either during the whole period for which the debenture has to run, or for such limited period as the Crown Agents, acting on behalf of the Government of the Colony may determine

Form of debenture and coupons

9. The debentures and the coupons relating thereto shall 40 be in such form as the Governor, or the Crown Agents acting on his behalf, may direct or approve

Debentures and coupons transferable by delivery 10. Every debenture and coupon, and the right to receive the principal and interest represented thereby, shall be transferable by delivery

Registry of debentures

11. Every debenture shall, before being issued, be registered in a register book to be kept for that purpose at the office in London of the Crown Agents

Payment of interest

12. The interest upon the principal represented by each debenture shall run from the day named in that behalf in the debenture, and shall be paid half-yearly on the days named in that behalf in the debenture, at the office in London of the Crown Agents

Mode of providing for payment of interest on debentures 13. (1) So long as any of the debentures remain outstanding, the Governor shall, in each half-year ending with the day on which the interest on the debentures falls due, 55 appropriate out of the general revenues and assets of the Colony a sum equal to one-half year's interest on the whole of the debentures issued, including any which may have been redeemed, but exclusive of any which may have been at any time exchanged for stock, and shall remit that sum to the

Crown Agents at such time as will enable them to pay thereout the then current half-year's interest on the day on which it falls due

- (2) Debentures shall not be deemed to be outstanding for • the purpose of this Ordinance by reason only that one or more of the debentures have not been presented for payment on the day appointed for payment and have in consequence, not been paid
- 14. (1) The Governor shall, in the half-year ending on Further sums to 10 the date specified in the terms of issue of the loan as that on which the first contribution to the sinking fund shall be taken of the and in each subsequent half-year, appropriate out of the said revenues and assets of the Colony for the formation of a sinking fund, an additional sum equal to one-ha f of the annual 15 contribution specified in the prospectus or, in the case of a loan not issued publicly, in the terms of issue relating to the loan, in respect of the total nominal amount of all the debentures issued, including any which may have been redeemed, but exclusive of any which may have been at any time exchanged 20 for stock, and shall remit that sum to the Crown Agents with the remittance hereinbefore mentioned

(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in sub-section (1) of this section, if at any time the trustees of the sinking fund of any loan issued under the provisions of 25 this Ordinance are satisfied that the value of the fund will be sufficient with further accumulations of interest but without further payment of contributions to enable the loan to be redeemed out of the proceeds of the sinking fund not later than the final redemption date, the Governor may, with the 30 approval of the Secretary of State, suspend further contributions to the said sinking fund

Provided always that contributions to the sinking fund shall be recommenced if the trustees shall at any time inform the Governor that this is necessary

In the case of debentures redeemable on a fixed date, Creation of sinking fund for the Crown Agents shall place at interest or invest in the redemption of purchase of such securities as may be approved by the debentures 45 Secretary of State so much of the money so remitted to them fixed date as aforesaid as shall not be required for the payment of interest for the current half-year, as a linking fund for the final extinction of the debt, and the Crown Agents shall also place at interest or invest in the purchase of like securities the 50 accumulations of interest or the dividends, interest or produce of such investments and may, from time to time, with the approval of the Secretary of State, change any such investments and shall hold such fund in trust for he repayment of the principal moneys for the time being represented by the 55 debenture

Appointment of day for drawing of debentures 18. After the date specified in the Ordinance authorizing a loan as that on which the contributions to the sinking fund shall commence in respect of that loan, and so long thereafter as any of the debentures remain outstanding and unsatisfied, the Crown Agents shall in every year, unless the whole of the money applicable in that year to the redemption of debentures has been applied in the purchase thereof 10 appoint a day in that year for the drawing by lot of the debentures to be redeemed

Notice of time and place appointed for drawing 19. If a day is appointed for drawing, the Crown Agents shall give, by advertisement in the London *Times* newspaper, not less than fifteen days' previous notice, specifying the day 15 on which, and the hour and place at which, the drawing will take place

Mode of drawing

20. On the day and at the hour and place so specified the Crown Agents shall hold a meeting, at which the holder of any debenture may, if he think fit, be present, and shall 20 then in the presence of such debenture holders, if any, as may attend, and of a notary public, draw by lot, out of the whole number of debentures for the time being outstanding, debentures of the specified nominal amount

Notice of debentures drawn for redemption

21. The Crown Agents shall thereupon declare the 25 distinguishing numbers of the debentures drawn for redemption, and shall, as soon as may be, by advertisement in the London Times newspaper, specify those numbers and appoint a day, not being later as to each debenture than the day on which the then current half-year's interest thereon is payable, 30 on which the principal moneys represented by the debentures so distinguished will be repaid

Payment of drawn debentures

22. On the day so appointed the Crown Agents shall, at their office in London, on demand, pay to the holders of the debentures drawn for repayment the principal moneys 35 represented by those debentures, with all interest payable thereon up to that day

Cesser of interest from day appointed for payment of principal 23. From and after the day appointed for the repayment of any debenture all interest on the principal moneys represented thereby shall cease and determine, whether pay-40 ment of the principal shall have been demanded or not

Redeemed debentures to be cancelled

24. Upon the repayment of the principal moneys represented by any debenture, the debenture, with all coupons thereunto belonging, shall be delivered up to the Crown Agents, to be by them cancelled and disposed of in such 45 a manner as the Governor, or the Crown Agents acting on his behalf, may decide Any debenture redeemed by purchase shall likewise be so cancelled and disposed of

(c) he may authorize the creation and issue of such an amount of stock in exchange for the securities held for such loans as may be necessary,

Creation and sale of stock or debentures to raise loans and for other purposes (d) he may authorize the creation and sale of any such stock or debentures for the purpose of raising money for redeeming any outstanding loans, whether issued before or subsequent to the commencement of this Ordinance, for paying any expense in the creation 25 of stock, and otherwise for carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance,

Arrangements for conversion

(e) any conversion so authorized may be effected either by an arrangement with the holders of existing securities or by purchase thereof out of moneys 30 raised by the sale of stock, or partly in one way and partly in the other

Exchange of securities for stock

- 33. Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall authorize an increase of the capital or of the annual charge on any loan, except—
 - (a) when securities exchanged for stock bear a rate of interest not less than the stock, an additional amount of stock may be created and issued to make up the difference in saleable value between the securities and the stock,

(b) in the case of the conversion of securities into stock the Crown Agents shall issue such an amount of stock as may be required to defray the stamp duties and all other expenses incidental to the conversion,

(c) in accordance with such terms and conditions as may 45 be prescribed under paragraph (a) of section 32 of this Ordinance

34. The securities exchanged or otherwise converted into stock under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be forthwith cancelled by the Crown Agents, and the debentures 50 surrendered shall be cancelled and transmitted to the Governor of the Colony

The General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance (Chapter 46) is out of date and defective in certain respect. It is desirable to replace it by an Ordinance on the lines of a model supplied by the Secretary of State

This Bill will accordingly repeal and replace the General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance The principal departures from the provisions of the previous Ordinance are indicated below

The Colonial Stock Act, 1948, of the United Kingdom was enacted long after the General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance came into effect That Act enables stock to which the Colonial Stock Act. 1877, applies, to be transferred merely by an instrument in writing instead of by inscription, provided that the law of the dominion, colony or territory of whose debts the stock forn's part allows regulations to be made providing for the transfer of s ock in that manner This Bill, accordingly, contains in Clause 39 a provision authorizing the making of such regulations Since stock will no longer be transferred by inscription reference to "inscribed" s ock in the previous Ordinance is no longer appropriate and has accordingly been deleted

Clauses 14 and 28 replace respectively sections 14 and 28 of the previous Ordinance and, in addition, provide that—

- (a) the first and each subsequent appropriation of money for the formation of a sinking fund shall be made on the date specified in the terms of issue of the loan as that on which the first contribution to the sinking fund shall be taken, and
- (b) stock issued in exchange for debentures shall be included in reckoning the to al nominal amount of the stock

The new Clauses also contain provision whereby if the trustees of any sinking fund of a loan issued under the Ordinance are satisfied that the value of the fund will be sufficient with further accumulations of interest, but without further payment of contributions, to enable the loan to be redeemed not later than the final redemption date, the Governor may, with the approval of the Secietary of State, suspend further contributions Provision is made, however for contributions to be recommenced if the trustees at any time inform the Governor that this is necessary

Section 26 of the previous Ordinance imposed an obligation to redeem the entire loan on the specific date of maturity Clause 26 of the Bill will give an option to redeem at an earlier date

Clause 29 replaces section 29 of the previous Ordinance and will enable the Crown Agents to place money at interest as an alternative to investment

Clause 32 replaces section 32 of the previous Ordinance and makes it clear that stock may be created and sold for the purpose of raising money for redeeming outstanding loans whether issued before or after the commencement of this new Ordinance

Clause 37 replaces section 37 of the previous Ordinance and enables the Ciown Agents to make arrangements for registering stock in their books, for issuing certificates of title in respect of stock and for effecting the exchange or conversion of inscribed stock into registered stock

It is not expected that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law
