VACANCIES IN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS

Section Assistant Lands Department

APPLICATIONS are invited from European males for the post of Section Assistant in the scale of salary £480 by £20 to £620. The post is at present of a temporary nature and the usual terms and conditions of temporary service in the Government will apply. Applicants between the ages of 20 and 30 will be given preference. The duties of the post are clerical and offer opportunity for advance to young men. No particular qualification is required other than School Certificate standard of education, but experience in Government office work and routine will be an advantage. Press Officer Secretariat

APPLICATIONS are invited for the post of Press Officer, Secretariat. The appointment will be on a four-year contract in the scale £1,000 by £40 to £1,200, initial salary to be determined in accordance with the candidate's age, experience and qualifications. An entertainment allowance is also payable at the rate of £200 per annum. Terms and conditions of service are as follows—

(a) *Quarters*—When in occupation of Government quarters, 10 per cent of salary will be charged as rent if the quarters are furnished and 7½ per cent of salary if they are unfurnished, subject to a maximum of £150 per annum. When an officer occupies private quarters he may claim an allowance up to the amount by which the rent exceeds 10 per cent of his salary if the quarters are furnished and up to the amount by which the rent exceeds 7½ per cent of his salary if they are unfurnished.

(b) *Passages*—Free passages to the United Kingdom on completion of the agreement for the officer, his wife and children dependent and under the age of 21, subject to a maximum of three adult passages.

(c) *Tour of service*—Four years.

(d) *Leave*—Vacation leave (inclusive of voyage periods) at the rate of 4½ days for each completed month of residential service. Local leave at the rate of 18 days a year.

(e) *Medical*—Free medical treatment by the Government medical service for the officer, his wife and children.

(f) *Gratuity*—A gratuity will be payable on the expiration of the contract at the rate of 15 per cent of 9/10ths of the total substantive salary drawn during the term of engagement.

Qualifications—Applicants must possess sufficient journalistic experience to enable them to be in a position to give constructive advice on technical matters to editors who require such assistance.

Duties—(a) To act as the channel to the Press of all races for the supply of Government hand-outs, communiques and special articles.

(b) To arrange Press conferences and special interviews with senior officers when these are necessary.

(c) To be responsible for the conduct of the two-way channel of information between the United Kingdom and Kenya.

(d) To edit the Kenya Information Fortnightly and Pamoja.

(e) Generally to act as the Government's liaison officer with the local Press.

Applicants in Government employ should submit their applications through the head of their department. Applications from candidates not in Government service should be submitted on the form of application for employment with the Government of Kenya, copies of which can be obtained from the Secretariat of the territory in which the applicant resides. It is preferable that only copies of testimonials should be sent in the first place.

Special Grade (European) Male Clerk Lands Department

(b) Eighteen days local leave per annum and vacation leave at the rate of 4½ days for each completed month of residential service after 48 months' tour for officers under 40, and at the rate of 5½ days for each completed month of residential service after 40 months' tour for officers over 40.

(c) Free passages to the United Kingdom for the officer (and his wife if he is married) after completion of a tour of service, and return passages if returning for further service, in the case of a married officer with dependent children under 21, passages for himself and his family are provided up to the cost of three adult passages or the actual cost of the passages, whichever is the less.

The post is that of Chief Clerk in the department. (7) In the consideration of applications, regard will be had to the relative merits of the proposed plans for construction and the financial sufficiency of the applicant to undertake such construction

(B) General

(1) The term of the grant will be for 33 years from the first day of the month following notification to the successful applicant that his application has been accepted and the grant will be issued under the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Chapter 160 of the Revised Edition)

(2) The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned

(3) No building shall be erected on the plot unless and until plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the local authority and by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Kericho, for necessary action

(4) No buildings erected on the said land may be occupied until the grantee shall have submitted a block plan with the position of such buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage for dealing with sewage and with the surface and sullage water on the said land which shall satisfy the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority that such system of drainage has been properly constructed, such satisfaction in both cases to be expressed in writing

(5) The grantee shall duly and suitably connect such drainage system with any town drainage system when in the opinion of the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority the latter system is so far completed as to enable the grantee reasonably so to do

(6) The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of the plot or any part thereof, without the prior written consent of the Governor. (8) The grantee will be required to pay all rates and taxes which now or may at any future date be imposed upon the

(9) The grantee will be responsible for the proportionate cost of roads and drains serving the plot and will be required to pay the same within seven days of a demand therefor
