## A BILL ENTITLED

## AN ORDINANCE TO LIMIT THE LIABILITY OF **HOTEL-KEEPERS IN RESPECT OF THE GOODS OF THEIR GUESTS AND TO GIVE IN ADDITION** TO THE PRESENT RIGHT OF LIEN A POWER OF SALE UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES UPON AND IN RESPECT OF GOODS AND CHATTELS **DEPOSITED WITH THEM OR UPON THE TENE-**MENTS AND PREMISES OCCUPIED BY THEM

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Hotel-keepers Ordinance, 1950

In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise 2 requires----

"hotel" means any hotel inn or boarding house the 5 keeper of which is responsible in law for the goods and property of his guests

3 No hotel-keeper shall, after the commencement of loss, etc, beyond this Ordinance be liable to make good to any guest of such Sh 2,000 except hotel-keeper any loss of or injury to goods or property 10 brought to his hotel, other than a horse or other live animal, or any gear appertaining thereto or any carriage or motor vehicle, to a greater amount than the sum of two thousand shillings, except—

- (a) where such goods or property have been stolen, lost 15or injured through the wilful act default or neglect of such hotel-keeper or any servant in his employ,
- (b) where such goods or property shall have been deposited for safe custody with such hotel-keeper

Provided always, that in the case of such deposit it 20 shall be lawful for such hotel-keeper, if he think fit, to require as a condition of his liability, that such goods or property shall be deposited in a box or other receptacle, fastened and sealed by the person depositing the same 25

If any hotel-keeper refuses to receive for safe custody, 4 as before mentioned, any goods or property of his guest, or if any such guest is, through any default of such hotel-keeper unable to deposit such goods or property as aforesaid, such hotel-keeper shall not be entitled to the benefit of this 30 Ordinance in respect of such goods or property

Hotel-keeper may dispose of goods left with him after six weeks

5 The hotel-keeper of any hotel shall, in addition to his ordinary lien, have the right absolutely to sell and dispose by public auction of any goods, chattels, motor vehicles, carriages, horses, wares, or merchandise which may have been 35 deposited with him or left in the hotel he keeps, or in the garage, coach-house, stable, stable-yard, or other premises appurtenant or belonging thereto, where the person depositing

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or leaving such goods, chattels, mo or vehicles, carriages, horses, wares or merchandise shall be or become indebted to the said hotel-keeper either for any board or lodging or for the keep and expenses of any horse of other animal left with <sup>5</sup> or standing at livery in the stables or fields occupied by such

hotel-keeper or for the garaging of ary motor vehicle left at such hotel

(a) no such sale shall be made until after the said goods,

chattels, motor vehicles, carriages, horses, wares or 10 merchandise shall have been for the space of six weeks in such charge or cust dy or in or upon such premises without such debt h, ving been paid or satisfied, and

- 15 (b) the debt for the payment of which a sale is made shall not be any other or greater debt than the debt for which the goods or other articles could have been retained by the hotel-ke per under his lien, and
  - (c) that at least one month be ore any such sale is effected the hotel-keeper shall cause to be inserted in one newspaper printed if the English language and circulating in Nairobi ind in one newspaper printed in the English language and circulating in the district where such goods, chattels, motor vehicles, carriages, horses, wares or nierchandise or some of them, shall have been deposited or left, an advertisement containing notice of such intended sale, and giving shortly a description of the goods and chattels intended to be sold, together with the name, if known, of the owner or pe son who deposited or left the same

(2) Where any goods, chattels, notor vehicles, carriage, horses, wares or merchandise have been sold pursuant to subsection (1) of this section the hotel-keeper shall, out of the 35 proceeds of sale, after paying himself the amount of his debt and the costs and expenses of the sale on demand pay to the person depositing or leaving such goods, chattels, motor vehicles, carriages, horses, wares or merchandise any surplus money remaining thereafter

Every hotel-keeper shall cause at least one copy of Notice of 40 6 section 3 of this Ordinance, printed in plain type, to be to be exhibited in a conspicuous part of the hall or entrance to his conspicuously hotel and he shall be entitled to the benefit of this Ordinance in respect only of such goods or property as are brought to his

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

It is a matter of considerable doub whether the Innkeepers Liability Act, 1863, and the Innkeepers Act, 1878, which contain provisions relating to the rights and liabilities of innkcepers in relation to the goods of guests at their inns, apply to hotels in the Colony or not

It is considered undesirable that hotel-ceepers and their guests in the Colony should be left in doubt as to their rights and liabilities This Bill will, accordingly, make statutory provisions similar to those provided in the United Kingdom by the above mentioned Acts of Parliament

Briefly, the effect will be to limit the hability of an hotel-keeper for loss or injury to the goods of his guests trought to his hotel (other than loss or injury caused wilfully or by ne ligence of the hotel-keeper or his staff) to two thousand shillings There is the usual clause peimitting the hotel-keeper to require, as a condition of his liability, deposit of goods for safe custody with hin (Clause 3)

Clause 5 will permit an hotel-keeper to sell, after a certain period, the goods of guests seized for unpaid dues

No additional expenditure of public rioneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill is the result of the Report of the Select Committee appointed by the Legislative Council to consider and make recommendations upon the Public Roads (Amendment) Bill which had been considered by the Council during its previous Session The Report was laid on the table on the 11th o October, 1950, but before its adoption could be moved and before, therefore, the then Bill could become law the Council was prorogued It is felt that the present short title of the principal Ordinance, the Public Roads Ordinance, does not provide a true guide to its purposes since most of its sections are concerned with private roads of access *Clause* 2 of the Bill, therefore, provides for a more suitable title

It is considered that the duties and powers, in the principal Ordinance, of the Governor and the Governor in Council may now be more properly performed and exercised by the Member for Health and Local Government *Clause* 3 of the Bill will, therefore, amend section 2 of the principal Ordinance so as to include the necessary definition of Member It also provides for the inclusion of a definition of the word "board" so that that word may be used in the principal Ordinance where any reference is made to a district road board

*Clauses* 4 and 5 of the Bill will amend the principal Ordinance so that the Member instead of the Governor will have power to appoint district road boards and also, if necessary, to direct them to meet when and where appropriate

Clause 7 will amend section 8 of the principal Ordinance by giving the Member instead of the Governor power to dedicate lines of public travel It will also provide for an appeal to the Governor in Council from any order of the Member made under the powers contained in the section

*Clause* 8 of the Bill will add to section 10 of the principal Ordinance a sub-section giving a board, where it has received more than one application for leave to construct a road of access, power to join any applications in which any common question of law or fact will, in the board's opinion, arise

Clause 9 will substitute for section 15 of the principal Ordinance a new section which gives a right of appeal not only from the order of a board but from the refusal of a board to make an order and also from any decision of a board made under the proviso to section 10 of the principal Ordinance

It has been represented that it is desirable where appeals concerning roads of access are to be heard, for magistrates to be assisted by persons with some knowledge of road matters and farming requirements. The clause, therefore, provides that the magistrates shall be assisted by competent assessors and that while they shall not be bound by the opinions of those assessors, where they do not conform to those opinions, they must record their reasons for not conforming

It is felt that district road boards should not in every case, where there is an appeal from their decision, be the respondents While, in the case of an appeal from a decision made under the provisions of the proviso to section 10 of the Ordinance of where an application was unopposed the board must of necessity be the respondent, the clause provides that where the owner or occupier of the land over which it is proposed the road of access should pass has opposed the application he shall be the respondent and that in the case of an appeal against the making of an order, the respondent shall be the party upon whose application the order was made

The clause also provides that even where a board is not the respondent the court may for good reason order the board to pay the costs of the appeal

--

The effect of *sub-clause* (5) is to give the magistrate power, *inter* alia, to order the giant of a road of access and to make any other supplementary order which may be necessary as the result of the grant

Clause 10 of the Bill will give the Member power to make rules instead of the Governor in Council

Clause 11 will replace section 18 of the principal Ordinance with a section which enables a court to take cognizance of a failure to comply with the order of a district board not only upon the complaint of the chairman of the board concerned or of some person authorized by him but on the complaint of any person who is damnified by the failure to obey the order. This provision will do away with the necessity for a board to become involved in any dispute between a road of access owner and the occupiers of the neighbouring lands

Clause 13 will provide for the substitution of new Schedules for the present Schedules to the principal Ordinance It is considered that these new Schedules are more happily expressed and clearer than the present ones

The employment of assessors to assist magistrates in appeals will involve some slight additional expenditure of public funds Otherwise no additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law
