**A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE LIQUOR
ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, and shall be read and construed as one with the Liquor Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Cap 266

Amendment of section 9 of the principal Ordinance

2. Section 9 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for paragraph (7) thereof the following—

(7) A traveller's liquor licence

Amendment of section 10 of the principal Ordinance
Traveller's liquor licence

3. There shall be substituted for paragraph (8) of section 10 of the principal Ordinance the following—

(8) (a) A Traveller's Liquor Licence shall authorize the holder thereof to sell liquor by retail at any railway station or air port refreshment room or at any other railway or air port premises named in the licence to persons bona fide travelling by train or by air, as the case may be, or using the railway or air port premises for railway or air port purposes

(b) An applicant for a Traveller's Liquor Licence shall produce a written recommendation from the manager of the railway or air port, as the case may be that such licence may be granted or renewed to the applicant

Amendment of Schedule to the principal Ordinance

4. The Schedule to the principal Ordinance is amended in the following respects—

(a) by substituting for sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (1) the following—

(i) Traveller's Liquor Licence 300 180

(b) by substituting for the words "Railway Station Liquor Licence" wherever they occur in paragraph (3) the words "Traveller's Liquor Licence" and by substituting for the words "railway rest house" the words "railway or air port rest house"

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Liquor Ordinance does not make any special provision similar to that relating to the sale of liquor at railway stations for the granting of a licence to sell liquor at air ports to bona fide passengers travelling by air. At present, therefore, the only licence which can be obtained at any air port restaurant is a general retail liquor licence under which liquor may only be supplied during certain permitted hours. It is considered that the same facilities ought to be granted in respect of air ports as pertain in relation to railway stations and this Bill will amend sections 9 and 10 and the Schedule to the Liquor Ordinance accordingly.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

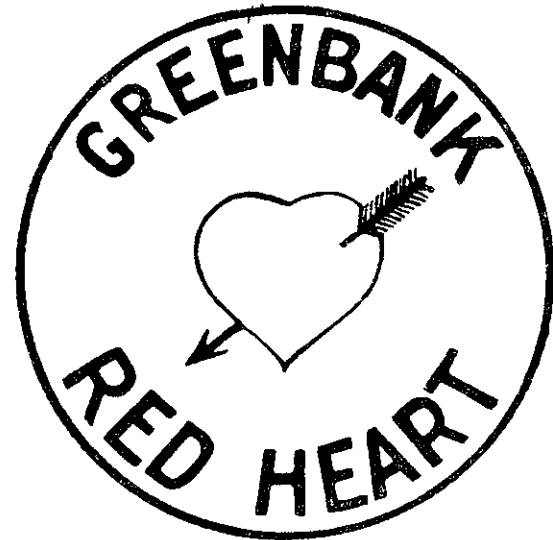
