**A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE DEVELOPMENT
LOAN ORDINANCE, 1951**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya,
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof,

10 Provided that any balance of such sums remaining
after defraying the expenses of issue may be applied to the
payment of Stamp Duties on transfers of stock issued

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 3 (1) of the Development Loan Ordinance, 1951, provides that any sums raised to defray the expenses of issue shall be applied only to that purpose. There were savings on the amount raised to defray the expenses of issue amounting to £1,401/6/12 cts. but as the Ordinance now stands this money cannot be used for any other purpose. It is considered desirable that these savings should be transferred to the Stamp Duty Reserve Fund, and this Bill amends the Ordinance to enable this to be done.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

VACANCIES IN KENYA GOVERNMENT

*Public Works Department—Engineering Staff Vacancies
New Nairobi Airport*

THE Government of Kenya has decided to construct a modern airport in the vicinity of Nairobi. The present scope of this work includes a bitumen surfaced runway 1,000 ft. long, a taxiway, apron and the terminal buildings. Construction will be carried out by direct labour with a certain number of small contracts. The cost of the scheme is estimated initially at £1,500,000. The main engineering features of the work are the removal of a layer of black cotton (black turf) soil which overlies the basic decomposed and solid rock and the quarrying and crushing of the stone required for the runway, etc.

The staff required for this project will operate as a separate Construction Division under the Roads Branch of the Public Works Department. Housing of a temporary type will be provided free and staff will be required to reside on the site of works.

The working day will be 10 hours including an hour for lunch and staff will be paid a consolidated compensating allowance of 20 per cent of basic salary. In addition to this a cost of living allowance is at present being paid at the rate of 30 per cent of basic salary up to a maximum amount of £300 per annum. Other terms of service are as follows:—

Contract Terms.—40 to 48 months.

Vacation Leave.—4½ days per month (officers under 40 years of age) 5½ days per month (officers 40 years of age and over) on completion of Contract.

Local Leave.—Eighteen working days per annum, with Railway concession ticket to any place within the Colony (return ticket at single fare).

Gratuity.—13½ per cent of total basic salary earned during the Contract, payable on leaving Government employment.

Medical.—Free medical treatment by the Government Medical Service for the officer, his wife and unmarried children under 21 years of age, if living with, and dependent on him. This does not include surgical treatment for the officer's family nor any dental or optical treatment.

Passages.—Free passages will be provided up to three adults to the Colony and on satisfactory completion of the Contract similar passages will be provided for the return journey to country of recruitment.

CIVIL ENGINEERING STAFF VACANCIES

VACANCY IN UGANDA PROTECTORATE

Community Development Officer

APPLICATIONS are invited from serving officers and others for appointment to a vacancy for the post of Community Development Officer, Department of Community Development, Uganda, on the following terms of service:—

(a) *Salary.*—The salary scale for the post is £550: £550: £620 by £35 to £725 (Efficiency Bar): £760: £830: £865 (Promotion Bar) by £35 to £1,005 by £45 to £1,140 (Promotion Bar) by £45 to £1,320. The initial salary will be assessed in accordance with age, experience and service, including war service. In addition, a temporary allowance of 30 per cent of the substantive salary with a limit of £300 per annum, will be paid for so long as such allowance is operative.

In the event of a local candidate being appointed, 3/5ths of the salary scale quoted will, under the present arrangements (now under review), be applicable.

(b) *Terms of Appointment.*—On letter of appointment for admission to the permanent and pensionable staff after two years on probation, such admission being conditional upon the officer appointed passing a written and oral vernacular language examination and being found generally suitable in the performance of his duties.

(c) Government quarters are provided for which rent is payable not exceeding 10 per cent of basic salary if partly furnished and 7½ per cent if unfurnished.

(d) The appointment will be governed by the revised conditions of service for the Civil Service of Uganda.

Applicants should be of good general education. Ability in organizing community activities is essential. Experience in administration in African territories or in adult education or social welfare work would be an asset. A university degree is desirable. Applicants should be between the ages of 22 and 40.

The officer appointed would work under the general direction of the Commissioner for Community Development but would operate in the field under the immediate guidance of district teams. He would act as executive officer in respect of the community development work undertaken by district teams. His duties will include the organization of community development campaigns, exhibitions, shows and training courses. He would be required to encourage and supervise adult literacy and other adult education activities, to promote village industries and to foster community life through local societies, clubs and community centres. He may also be required to undertake some social case work and to advise on the social aspects of housing and town planning. He would be required to tour frequently in rural areas, staying in temporary rest camps. The officer will be required to maintain very close contact with African local authorities and the African population in general.

Applications on the appropriate form (copies of which may be obtained from the Secretariat, Entebbe), should be submitted to reach the Chief Secretary, Entebbe, by 16th July, 1953.

The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, sewers, pipes and drains, telegraph and telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignment of mains, sewers or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

12. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or out-goings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or building erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the Government in lieu thereof.

13. The application for any plot shall be deemed to be upon and subject to the conditions herein contained and the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya).

14. The grantee shall, as aforementioned, make an initial payment for the estimated amount for the cost of construction of roads and drains as shown in the Schedules hereto. On completion of the construction of roads and drains and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate amount payable in respect of each plot, the grantee shall either pay (within seven days of demand therefor) or be refunded the amount by which the actual cost exceeds or falls short of the amount previously paid on account as the case may be.

15. The annual cost of the maintenance of the roads when constructed will be paid by the grantee in such proportion as the Commissioner of Lands may determine.

16. Should the grantees of the plots specified herein or the Local Authority at any time require the roads to be constructed to a higher standard, the cost of this construction will be paid by the said grantees in the proportions determined by the Commissioner of Lands.

(c) Additional Special Conditions Applicable to the Plots in Schedule I

1. The plots shall be used for residential purposes only and for no other purpose whatsoever.

2. The grantee shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any buildings so as to cover more than 50 per cent of the area of the plot.

(d) Additional Special Conditions in Respect of the Business-cum-residential Plots in Schedule II

1. The grantee shall use and permit to be used the land hereby granted for business purposes only, excepting trades which in the opinion of the Commissioner of Lands are dangerous or offensive but shall be at liberty to use the said land for the combined purpose of business and residence notwithstanding, provided that in the event of the said land being used for the said combined purpose, then not more than one-half of the area hereof shall be built upon or if for business purposes only then not more than 90 per cent shall be built upon.

2. A veranda may be erected within the road reserve with the previous consent of the Local Authority and must conform to a building line decided upon by such Authority.
