THE FOREST ORDINANCE (*Cap.* 176)

IN ACCORDANCE with the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 4 of the Forest Ordinance the Member for Agriculture and Natural Resources hereby gives 28 days' notice with effect from the 12th day of August, 1953, of the intention of the Governor in Council to declare that the areas described in the Schedule hereto shall cease to be forest areas.

It is notified for general information that the areas described in the Schedule hereto are the excisions from Forest Reserve approved by the Governor in Council for settlement purposes.

The acreages shown against each excision are approximate only and a brief description of the areas is given as a guide to identification.

All the maps referred to showing the forest excisions are deposited in and may be seen during normal business hours in the following offices :—


