THE Commissioner of Lands gives notice that the combined plots in Rumuruti Township as described in the Schedule hereto are available for alienation and invites applications for the direct grant thereof.

2. A plan of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office of the Survey Department, Nairobi, or at the Office of the District Commissioner, Thomson's Falls, or may be had on application to the Director of Surveys, P.O. Box 30046, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3 post free in respect of plots in the Schedule.

3. Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the District Commissioner, Thomson's Falls, and should reach the latter not later than noon on 30th January, 1960.

4. Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.

5. Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh. 1,000 drawn on their own banking account made payable to the Commissioner of Lands as a deposit which will be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions below the deposit will be credited to him.
- (b) If the applicant is unsuccessful, the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
- (c) If the applicant is successful and fails to take up and pay for the plot within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions below the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

General Conditions

1. The ordinary conditions applicable to Township Grants of this nature shall apply except as varied hereby.

2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 155 of the revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and title will issue under the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Cap. 160).

3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as given in the letter of application.

4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.

5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been successful the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with survey, conveyancing and registration fees (Sh. 220 and stamp duty approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the claimant shall have no claim to the grant of the plot.

Special Conditions

1. 3. The plots shall be used for shops and offices, or shops and flats or for shops, offices and flats. The erection of a petrol pump or pumps will not be permitted.

4. The grantee shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect buildings to cover more than 50 per centum of the plot or such lesser area as is laid down by the Local Authority's by-laws.

5. The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.

6. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.

11. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by the Government or any Local Authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum payable by the Governor in lieu thereof.

12. The Governor or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes, or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

13. No covenant, condition or requirement will be entered into, imposed or made whereby the ownership or occupation of the land or any part thereof is restricted to persons of a particular race or races or class or classes of race, or whereby such persons are excluded from such ownership or occupation.
