REPORT BY THE CONTROLLER AND AUDITOR-GENERAL ON THE ACCOUNTS OF THE AFRICAN TEACHERS PENSIONS FUND FOR THE PERIOD 1ST APRIL, 1957 TO 31ST DECEMBER, 1957

During the period covered by this Report no Board for the management of the Fund had been established, and the executive work was carried out by the Chairman and the Secretary. A Board was appointed with effect from 1st October, 1958, by Gazette Notice No 3572 of 2nd October, 1958, and held its first meeting on 31st October, 1958.

2 At the date of my audit the Director of Education had not made a declaration in accordance with Regulation 2 of the African Teachers Service (Contributory Pensions Fund) Regulations, 1957, defining "recognized service", the pensions granted have been verified on the assumption that a retroactive declaration will be made covering these pensions. I understand that the Board has now made recommendations on the service which should be declared "recognized service".

3 In certain cases pensions were granted to persons who did not fall within the definition of "teacher" given in the African Teachers Service (Contributory Pensions Fund) Regulations, 1957. I am informed that recommendations for the revision of the definition of "teacher" are to be made by the Board.

4 Owing to a mis-interpretation of the Regulations several contributors have had refunded to them the total amounts standing to their credit when withdrawing from the Fund although they were not in fact entitled to their Employers' contributions. I understand that the Board proposes to make recommendations for the amendment of the Regulations to extend the circumstances under which contributors are entitled to a refund of their Employers' contributions.

5 The figure of interest credited to contributors in the Income and Expenditure Account differs from the figure for the corresponding item in the Contributions and Withdrawals Account by Sh 1/28. The figure of Current Forfeitures of Contributions to the Pensions Fund in the Fund Account exceeds the corresponding figure in the Contributions and Withdrawals Account by £69 16s 25cts. Satisfactory explanations of these differences have been received.

6 The production of accounts for twelve month periods to 31st March as prescribed by the Regulations has been found to be impracticable and the accounts have therefore been prepared to 31st December. I understand that an appropriate amendment to the Regulations will be recommended. An amended form of account has now been agreed and will be adopted for the presentation of the 1958 accounts.

7 At the date of audit the investments of the Fund were held personally in the names of the Chairman and the Secretary. Now that a Board has been appointed I understand that steps are being taken to rectify the position.

8 The actuarial valuation of the Fund in accordance with Regulation 32 has not yet been made and the grant to be paid to the Fund by Government has not yet been assessed.
