Applicants are advised to consider the desirability of the "Motel" type of accommodation on this site. No sketch plan is required but the successful tenderer will be required to submit for approval sketch plans of the buildings he proposes to erect before proceeding with the detailed drawings. The outlined proposals should include—

- (i) a site layout plan in sufficient detail to show the siting of the buildings in relation to the plot boundaries
 - (ii) an indication of the number of bedrooms and other rooms to be constructed. This accommodation to be completed and ready for occupation within 36 months of the commencement of the term of the grant. Applicants may if they wish submit their plans for subsequent additional development.
 - (iii) the number and nature of public rooms to be provided
 - (iv) a description of the amenities and recreational facilities to be provided
- (b) the amount of capital available for immediate development which must not be less than Sh 600,000 (£30,000) together with a statement from the applicant's bankers or from the representatives of some other financial institution acceptable to the Commissioner of Lands certifying that this amount is either immediately available or will become available during the course of the construction of the hotel.
