Canadian Awards for 1961 1962

THE Canadian Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Committee invites applications from Kenya for scholarships to be awarded for the session 1961-1962

Lligibility

The Canadian scholarships are tenable in Canadian Univer sities and are open to men and women who are Commonwealth citizens normally resident in any part of the Commonwealth other than Canada The scholarships are primarily intended for students who by September, 1961, will be graduates of a recognized University or holders of an equivalent qualification

In exceptional cases a non graduate may be considered for an award, if the programme of studies he wishes to follow is not available in his own country Minimum qualifications for entry to a Canadian University are three principal level subjects in the Higher School Certificate or three advanced level subjects in the General School Ceitificate

Applicants should not have reached their 35th buthday by 1st October 1961

Tenure of Awards

Awards will normally be made for a period of two academic years, although, if circumstances require the period may be extended or abbieviated

Each award will be continued for the period of study or research for which it is granted provided that the student's progress and conduct are satisfactory

Value of Awards

Each scholarship is intended to cover expenses of study living and travel during its tenure and includes all tuition fees. a personal allowance at the rate of \$150 per month, a grant of \$100 for books or equipment and tourist air passage to and from Canada (for a male student married at the time of application an allowance of \$50 per month will be made for his wife while she is in Canada and two thirds of the cost of her air fare to and from Canada)

SUNDRY DEBTORS—PERSONAL CONTRIBUTIONS

- 1 The figure for Sundry Debtors has been obtained from returns submitted by Departments and Ministries Some of these returns do not bear evidence of an independent internal check as requested by the Treasury The matter is being pursued with the Treasury
- 2 Of the sum of £11,043-3-02 cts shown as due to the Fund in respect of Personal Contributions a total of £10 945-8-02 cts has since been received leaving a balance of £97-15-00 cts only, outstanding at the 30th April, 1960 It should be realized that the figure of £11,043-3-02 cts includes amounts paid to ministries or departments but not yet paid over to the Treasury

INVESTMENTS AND CASH ON DEPOSIT

3 The statement of investments and cash balance held by the Crown Agents certified by the Comptroller and Auditor General of the United Kingdom has not yet been received and the Crown Agents investments and cash on deposit in the Joint Consolidated Fund have therefore been verified with uncertified copies of the Statement

CONTRIBUTIONS AND PENSIONS RECORDS

4 With reference to paragraph 1 of the report on the accounts for 1958, pensions pavable have now been recorded in the register. The question of recording details of contributions paid has now been reconsidered and a system of control by returns to Ministries and Departments has been introduced. The effectiveness of this system cannot be fully assessed as yet, as a number of Departments have not yet submitted the necessary confirmation concerning the correctness of the returns, but from the confirmations so far received it is clear that better control over recoveries of contributions is necessary The matter is under correspondence

Contributors from the East Africa High Commission and E A Land Forces Organization

5 With reference to paragraph 3 of the report on the accounts for 1958 it has now been decided to amend the Ordinance to provide for the officers of the East Africa High Commission to become compulsory contributors. It has also been suggested that members of the East Africa Land Forces Organization should be treated in a similar manner. The matter is under correspondence with the law officers. Difficulties may arise owing to the imminent disbandment of the Organization

DEFINITION OF ASIAN OFFICER IN THE ORDINANCE

6 Certain matters in connexion with the definition of Asian Officer" in the Ordinance are at present under correspondence with the Secretary of State This particularly affects a contributor who was permitted to cease contributing to this Fund and to contribute to the European Widows' and Orphans Pension Scheme

VALUATION OF FUND

7 With reference to paragraph 2 of the report on the Accounts for 1958 the proposed legislation amending the period for valuation to not more than ten yearly intervals has not yet been introduced. Meanwhile no revaluation has been undertaken

BASIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS

8 It has been decided that definition of "Salary in Section 2 (1) of the Ordinance requires amendment to provide for contributions to be assessed on basic salary plus the inducement addition if applicable. I have been informed that the necessary amending legislation will be introduced


