Administrative Officer, Ministry of Lands and Settlement (No. 13/66)

Salary scale.—£1,600 to 1,800. AGREEMENT ONLY.

Applicants must be of mature age and must have considerable background in both agriculture and large co-operative organizations. Knowledge of co-operative organization and methods will be a great advantage. They must be of a high standard of education and preferably should have a degree in Agriculture or Economics or Advanced Training in the principles of Co-operatives. The successful candidate will be responsible for the training of Co-operative Department staff and Co-operative Committees. Appointment from outside the Service can only be made on agreement terms, but should a pensionable civil servant be selected arrangements can be made for his secondment to the post.

Government Printer (Trainee), Printing and Stationery Department (No. 14/66)

Applicants must possess a degree in Arts or Science subjects and preference will be given to candidates with a knowledge of Graphic Arts. The successful candidate will be required in the first instance to absorb the various aspects of printing processes and Government administration prior to admission into an overseas college. The overseas course is of two years' duration and on successful completion of the course, the officer will understudy the incumbent of the post of Government Printer for a suitable period, successful completion of which will lead to substantive appointment to the post of Government Printer at a salary of £2,175 per annum, fixed.

Head of General Service, Voice of Kenya, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (No. 15/66)

Applicants should possess a degree in science of an approved university, including Chemistry and Biology as principal subjects with emphasis on Zoology. Duties include the day-to-day organization and maintenance of a laboratory service to the Police Pathologist and Police Surgeons in connexion with autopsies, exhumations, assaults, etc. This requires knowledge of the general medical laboratory techniques of histology, bacteriology, serology, etc. Also, the successful candidate will be responsible for carrying out forensic serology, microscopical examinations and other physical comparisons in connexion with tool marks, etc., the preparation of photomicrographs, the maintenance of a scientific advisory service to Police Officers in connexion with the selection and collection of materials suitable for scientific examination, liaison with other scientific experts whose services may be required for specialist examinations and the giving of evidence before the Courts on matters arising from his duties.

Applicants must be civil servants, preferably of Cambridge School Certificate standard of education, who must have considerable experience in dealing with staff problems, the maintenance of staff records and in handling labour disputes, and a working knowledge of stores accounting. out inspections of buildings, a knowledge of the working of the airport and experience in dealing with members of the public and tenants will be advantageous. The selected candidate will be responsible to the Airport Manager for the cleanliness and orderliness of the airport and for this reason will be required to carry out extra weekly duties which include calling at the airport after normal working hours.

# EAST AFRICAN POSTS AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS ADMINISTRATION

#### VACANCY

Principal-Post Office Training School

APPLICATIONS are invited from suitably qualified persons for the post of Principal of the East African Posts and Telecommunications Central Training School at Mbagathi, near Nairobi. Salary.-£1,764 by £75 to £1,989 p.a.

Qualifications.—Candidates should hold an approved degree, preferably with a scientific bias, and should also have a teaching diploma. In addition, they should have had experience of education administration, teacher training and examination techniques. Experience in a boarding institution would be an advantage.

Duties.—The Principal is responsible for the efficient organization and administration of the school and is expected to actively participate in some teaching. The duties include the planning and direction of training programmes at the Central Training School and the organization of teacher training for instructors. He may also be called upon to advise the management on formal training at the Central Training School.

The School.—The function of the Central Training School is to give vocational training in a wide range of Post Office occupations and skills the main ones being in Electrical Engineering, Postal and Telecommunications fields. The School is situated at Mbagathi, approximately ten miles from Nairobi. It has residential accommodation for 270 students and some 1,600 students pass through the School each year. There is an instructing staff of 40, plus administrative, catering and maintenance staff, most of whom reside on the School premises. The School also has fully equipped classrooms, engineering apparatus rooms, a Post Office and Telephone Exchange for practical lessons, and extensive playing fields. A nursery school and playground are provided for the use of the children of staff living on the site.

- 1. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 21st and 22nd December 1965. The parties relied on their written and verbal submissions but the Twentieth Century Fox Organization (E.A.) called two witnesses in support of their case.

#### GENERAL BACKGROUND

2. The Kenya Distributive and Commercial Workers' Union is now a part of the Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers and shall hereinafter be called the Claimants. The Twentieth Century Fox Organization (E.A.) shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents. The Respondents have recognized the Claimants in their new garb. The Respondents consists of nine separate companies, six of which are operating, two non-operating and one dormant. They employ a total of 175 employees. The Claimants were recognized by the Respondents in 1962 and the first agreement between the parties on terms and conditions of service was signed on 28th June 1962. This was followed by an agreement having effect from 1st July 1963, which was to remain indefinite until terminated by a month's notice by either party with a proviso that no such notice should be before 1st April 1964. The Claimants forwarded their demands to the Respondents on 26th April 1965, which included amendments to the agreement then in force. Negotiations commenced on 17th May 1965, followed by subsequent meetings with long breaks in between. Eventually deadlock having been reached on the six issues in dispute the matter was referred to the Industrial Court under the Trade Dispute Act, 1965.

# MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE CLAIMANTS

3. (i) Wage Increases.—The Claimants made it clear that the wage was inclusive of house allowance Respondents had not agreed in previous negotiations to have house allowance negotiated as a separate benefit. They submitted that although a job classification had been carried out minimum rates for these various jobs had not been agreed and a system of percentage increases had been adopted previously and the Respondents wanted the same system to be followed even now. They drew the Court's attention to the fact that no annual increments were being granted to the employees at present. The cost of living had gone up since the last agreement and the Respondents' employees, especially in the lower grades, were grossly underpaid considering the fact that there was no separate house allowance. They maintained that the Respondents were in a position to meet their demands. The Claimants expressed very strong views on the fact that the Respondents were aligning themselves, as far as the catering department was concerned, with the Hotel and Catering Trades Wages Council Order which was primarily designed to fix wages for small employers. They wanted the Respondents to compare their terms and conditions of employment with the leading hotels in the city of Nairobi. The Claimants drew the Court's attention to various other industries which were paying higher rates than the Respondents. The Claimants, therefore, submitted that although, originally, their demands ranged for the lowest paid employee to Sh. 300, and the highest paid employee to Sh. 2,000, they had come down during negotiations and had demanded the following increases:

For those earning up to Sh. 200 per month-35 per cent.

For those earning up to between Sh. 201 and Sh. 400 per month—25 per cent.

For those earning from Sh. 401 upwards per month—15 per cent.

Their demands, the Claimants submitted, were very reasonable. The Claimants submitted that the Respondents' offer of 4 per cent increase to all employees was extremely low. They requested the Court to make an award in line with their demands. The Claimants intimated to the Court that, in the very near future, they would get in touch with the Respondents and finalize the job classification by fixing the rates for the various jobs.

- (ii) House Allowance.—The Claimants demanded house allowance for every employee and to be based on 50 per cent of his monthly salary as they alleged that after an employee had paid his rent from his wage he was left with very little money on which to feed himself, his wife and children. They submitted that as the wage level was so low the Respondents should subsidize the employees' housing. They maintained that they had constantly tried for house allowance to be paid in addition to wages but with no success. They felt that the time had now come when employees should be paid a house allowance.
- (iii) Increased Leave.—The Claimants stated that although their demand was considerable they had decided to accept the Respondents' offer made during the hearing of the dispute in a spirit of compromise, the Respondents' offer being 24 consecutive days' !eave per year with a proviso that if a Gazetted Holiday fell within this period then an additional day would be added to the leave entitlement. They also accepted that employees would be allowed to accumulate seven days of their leave entitlement for two years only.
- (iv) Retirement Benefits.—The Claimants demanded some benefit for their members in respect of services rendered up to the time the National Social Security Act started functioning. They pointed out that although the Respondents had agreed to explore a Provident Fund Scheme they had dropped it when the Government had announced the National Social Security Scheme. The Claimants wanted payment by way of gratuity based on the formula for severance pay in respect of years of service of an employee up to the implementation of the National Scheme.
- (v) Working Hourse for Catering Staff.—The Claimants made it clear that they had no complaint under this issue but that the Respondents wanted the working hours for the catering staff to be increased from 45 hours per week to 50 hours per week. They stated that there was no merit in this demand as the 45 hours per week had been agreed between the parties.
- (vi) Paid Maternity Leave.—The Claimants submitted that most of the employers in the country were now allowing paid maternity leave to their female employees. They requested the Court to bring the Respondents into line with the general practice on this issue in the country. They further wanted this benefit to be extended to all female employees and not restricted to married females only.

#### MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE RESPONDENTS

- 4. (i) Wage Increases.—The Respondents submitted that the profitability of their Group had dropped very considerably since 963 mainly due to decreased attendances at theatres, increased costs and low turnovers. This was an a result of an exodus of Europeans, including the army, leaving the country and very severe competition from television. They pointed out that the Claimants had conceded in the Industrial Court in Cause No. 22 of 1965 that cinema workers in Nairobi doing similar duties were being paid considerably higher wages and that this could be established from their agreement with the Respondents. They drew the Court's attention to the fact that they had granted an increase of 38 per cent to their employees between the period 1962 to 1964. The demand by the Claimants far exceeded any previously made. They pointed out that the Claimants were fully aware of the fact that in May 1965, they had declared six employees redundant mainly at the Drive-In Cinema. This was done after discussion with the Claimants. They stated that the majority of their employees did not work during the day and quite a number of them worked elsewhere by employing themselves or in paid employment. In spite of this they had always wanted to progress and to raise the lowest paid and to give an increase to all without creating further redundancies. They increase to all without creating further redundancies. They produced evidence as to their financial position through Mr. Heckett. In considering all the above circumstances they maintained that their offer of 7½ per cent for the bottom rates tapering to 3 per cent at top or a 4 per cent increase to all employees was very reasonable and requested the Court to endorse it. They also pointed out that arrangements existed between the parties for the payment of long service increments although only a few were in receipt of these increments. But although only a few were in receipt of these increments. But quite a number of employees would be entitled to them next
- (ii) House Allowance.—The Respondents strongly urged that as all their negotiations were on a clean wage basis they should be allowed to continue with it as any departure from it would be a retrogate step. They called Mr. W. L. Harragin, the Chairman of their Group, to prove that although the Claimants had demanded house allowance separately on two previous occasions, negotiations were finalized on a clear wage basis and the housing element was taken into consideration when the wage was fixed.
- (iii) Increased Leave.—The Respondents stated that they were prepared to allow additional days off for the Gazetted Public Holidays falling during the 24 days' consecutive leave period. They also offered seven days of such leave to be accumulated for two years.

(iv) Retirement Benefits.—The Respondents during the 1963 negotiations had agreed with the Claimants to introduce a Provident Fund Scheme for their employees. However, the Government had announced its intention to introduce a Social Security Scheme to embrace most of the employed people following the Turner Report. In view of this the Respondents had not pursued this any further. The Respondents stated that even if they had had produced a scheme it could only have started on the effective date embodied in the regulations and by-laws approved by the Authorities. In any case it was never made clear to them whether the Claimants wanted a Gratuity or a Provident Fund under this issue. They stated that both original demands and the present version had no foundation and should be rejected by the Court.

(v) Working Hours for Catering Staff.—The Respondents pointed out that after the 1963 agreement the Hotel and Catering Trades Wages Council Order was issued by the Minister for Labour and Social Services. This Order, by its definition and coverage, covered the Respondents' catering department and they were obliged to comply with this Order which stipulated, among other things a 54-hour week and considerably high wages. They stated that the employees got the benefit of these high wages without having to work 54 hours a week. This they maintained was very unfair and as their employees never did any more than 50 hours a week once or twice a month they requested the Court to award a 50-hour week for catering staff.

(vi) Paid Maternity Leave.—The Respondent had agreed to grant their female employees six weeks' leave prior to, and six weeks subsequent to, delivery, to married female employees. The Claimants demand, as it stood, required the Respondents to undertake services which were rightly and appropriately those of the Government of the Republic. The I.L.O. at this year's Conference re-confirmed its recommendation that employers were not responsible for payment during confinement. Finally, the Respondents stated that the effective date of the Court's award should be lst September 1965, which was the first day after the expiry of the 14 month wage standstill under the Tripartite Agreement.

#### AWARD

- 5. After a careful consideration of the submissions of the parties, the Court awards as follows:-
  - (i) Wage Increases
  - (a) All those employees getting a wage of Sh. 200 per month and less shall get an increase of 20 per cent: Provided that the new wage of these employees shall not be more than Sh 225 per month;
  - (b) All those employees getting a wage between Sh. 201 per month and Sh. 350 per month shall get an increase of 10 per cent;
  - (c) All other employees shall get an increase of 5 per cent.
  - (ii) House Allowance.-Nil award.
- (iii) Increased Leave.—In accordance with the parties' expressed desire the Court awards an annual leave of 24 consecutive days:

Provided that if a public holiday falls within the leave period the employee shall get an extra day for such public holiday.

Employees may accumulate 7 seven days of their annual leave

- (iv) Retirement Benefits.—During the hearing the Claimants made it clear that their demand was for Gratuity for the years of service up to the implementation of the National Social Security Act. The Respondents conceded that there was room for negotiation in these circumstances. The Court, therefore, refers this issue back to the parties for further negotiations.
  - (v) Working Hourse for Catering Staff .- Nil award.
- (vi) Paid Maternity Leave.—The Court rules that female employees shall be entitled to sick leave under this issue to the extent of 15 days with full pay and 15 days on half pay only out of the current sick leave entitlement. Any leave in excess of 30 days shall be unpaid maternity leave:

Provided that the total maternity leave does not exceed twelve

6. Commencement and Duration.—This award shall be with effect from 1st September 1965 and shall remain in force for one year.

# THE CROWN LANDS ACT

(Cap. 280)

#### PLOTS FOR MEDIUM DENSITY RESIDENTIAL

THE Commissioner of Lands, on behalf of the President of Kenya, gives notice that the plots in Nandi Hills Township as described in the Schedule hereto are available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grants of the individual plots.

- 2. A plan of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office situated in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or at the office of the District Commissioner, Nandi, or may be obtained from the Public Map Office, P.O. Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3 post free.
- 3. Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the District Commissioner, Nandi, stating the plot required in order of preference.
- 4. Applications must be sent so as to reach the District Commissioner, Nandi, not later than noon on the 8th day of February 1966.
- 5. Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.

Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh. 1,000 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
- (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
- (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

#### General Conditions

- 1. The ordinary condtions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.
- 2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Crown Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya) and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.
- 4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notifications of the approval of the grant.
- 5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

# $Special\ Conditions$

- 1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the Local Authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2. The grantee shall within six month of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him or behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the

President of the Republic of Kenya or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and conditions all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

- 5. The land and buildings shall only be used for medium density residential.
- 6. The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the area of the land or such lesser area as may be laid down by the Local Authority in its By-laws.
- 7. The land shall not be used for the purpose of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.
  - 8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.
- 9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the President of the Republic of Kenya no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.
- 10. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.
- 11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.
- 12. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.
- 13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President of the Republic of Kenya in lieu thereof.
- 14. The President of the Republic of Kenya or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments or main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.
