The above index stood at 117.6 points in the first week of February 1967. The base for this index is October-December 1958 = 100.

The above index stood at 345.6 points in the middle of February 1967.

#### WAGE ADJUSTMENT INDEX

The above index stood at 323.3 points in the middle of February 1967.

#### THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 3 of 1967

Parties .\_\_

Kenya Local Government Workers' Union (Claimants) and

#### Nairobi City Council (Respondents)

- 1. On the 11th of January 1967, the Minister for Labour referred this dispute to the Industrial Court in accordance with the provisions of section 30 of the Trade Disputes Act 1965. The issues in dispute as contained in the Minister's reference were as follows:
  - "1. Section 21 of the Trade Disputes Act states as
    - '(2) For the purpose of this section-
    - (a) a trade dispute shall not be deemed to be within a trade or industry unless it is a dispute between employers and employees, or between employees and employees, in that trade or industry, which is connected with the employment or non-employment or the terms of the employment, or with the conditions of labour, of persons in that trade or industry;

In view of the above quotation and in view of paragraph 2 below, was it procedurally and legally correct for the Union to call a strike against the City Council?

- "2. The Local Government Workers' Union questions whether or not it was procedurally and legally correct for a decision concluded between the City Council and the KLGWU on the 17th of October 1966, and confirmed by the City Council on the 1st of November 1966, to be referred back to the Salaries Review Commission by the Ministry of Local Government which was announced subsequently that is, in the month of December 1966."
- 2. The Parties were requested to appear before the Court on the 13th of January 1967, to arrange the preliminaries, but on that day the Deputy Town Clerk told the Court that as far as the Respondents were concerned, they had no dispute with the Claimants and that unfortunately through the intervention of a third party, that is, the Minister for Local Government, they were being prevented from honouring an agreement which they had entered into with the Claimants. He further stated that the Respondents did not need the Minister for Local Government's approval for fixing the level of salaries of their employees although they had to get the Minister's approval to the estimates of their expenses.

The Claimants' representative supported this view pointed out that, the agreement which they had entered into with the Respondents was not subject to the approval of the Minister for Local Government and added that, if the Deputy Town Clerk accepted that the Respondents had to pay the salary increases as agreed, then as far as they were concerned there was no dispute either.

During this mention a Senior State Counsel was present as an observer on behalf of the Minister for Local Government and Minister for Labour along with the Executive Officer, Federation of Kenya Employers on behalf of the Association of Local Government Authorities. At the President's request, the Senior State Counsel undertook to get further information from the Minister for Labour and the matter was adjourned to 24th January 1967

3. On the 24th of January 1967, the Senior State Counsel handed to the Court another reference in this dispute signed by the Minister for Labour and stated that, the first reference should be treated as cancelled. The second reference was as follows:-

#### "Essential Services

In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of the Trade Disputes Act 1965, I refer to your Court the existence of a trade dispute between the Nairobi City Council and the Kenya Local Government Workers' Union (Nairobi Staff Branch) on behalf of workers in the essential services provided by the said City Council (including water services, health services, hospital services, sanitary services and fire services) being subject to the First Schedule to the Act.

The issue in dispute as reported and alleged by the said Union to me in their letter dated 10th December 1966, is the refusal by the said City Council to implement the agreed salary increases for salaried staff.

#### MINISTER FOR LABOUR."

The Senior State Counsel also expressed certain views on behalf of the Minister for Local Government. He said that the Government had felt that, the Respondents' approval to implement the increase had to be endorsed by the Ministry. The Ministry had disallowed the Respondents' supplementary estimate on the ground that the Government had appointed a Salaries Review Commission. It was felt it would be most improper to allow a salary review to become operative while the Commission was still sitting. He further stated that, there were about 40 principal Local Government Authorities in Kenya

and a considerable number of minor authorities, whose staff were represented by the Claimants. The Minister felt that, to allow the Respondents to increase its wages at this time, particularly, with the Commission sitting, might well lead spiral, to a surge of applications for increased salaries which a considerable number could not afford. The Senior State Counsel, however, conceded that, the Minister for Local Government could not be a party to this dispute.

In these circumstances the Court established the Kenya Local Government Workers' Union as the Claimants and the Nairobi City Council as the Respondents. The Deputy Town Clerk then asked for an adjournment to discuss the matter further and to see if it could be settled out of Court. The matter was then stood over to 13th February 1967, on which day no one appeared on behalf of the Respondents and the Court fixed the hearing of this dispute on 20th and 21st March 1967. The dates for the submissions of written memoranda by the Parties were also fixed.

4. On 22nd February 1967, both the representatives of the Claimants and the Deputy Town Clerk on behalf of the Respondents made an application to the Court to make a consent award as follows:-

The following shall be the award of the said Court by consent of the Parties:

(1) That the following new salary scales 5-24 inclusive be implemented by the Respondents.

- (2) That no recommendation be made in respect of the proposed scales 1-4 inclusive.
- (3) That the Town Clerk undertakes to select appropriate salary scales within the new salary scale structure for Health Inspectors and, after consultation with the Union Side, to submit his final recommendations to the next ordinary monthly meeting of the Public Health Committee.
- (4) That the Town Clerk undertakes to submit his recommendations for regrading of staff, where applicable, as soon as possible to the Joint Staff Committee and the Union Side be invited to make whatever comments and submissions they may consider necessary
- (5) That the conversions of the pre-1965 salary scales 26-38 be taken through interim salary scales 33-36 and thereafter converted straight across to new salary scales 21-24 and adjustment be made for the 1965 interim award of the Respondents.
- (6) That the conversion of all salary scales be made on a straight across basis.
- (7) That the date of implementation by the Respondents the new salary scales as outlined above be 1st May

#### General Conditions

The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature as varied hereby shall apply to the grants:—

- (a) The grants shall be made initially for a term of 33 years convertible to 99 years in due course in cases where development has taken place to the required standard as shown in (b) below.
- (b) The grantee will be required to erect within six months of the commencement of the lease buildings in traditional style in accordance with plans previously approved in writing by the Local District Council and the Commissioner of Lands. Should the buildings be of permanent materials and of an approved design and erected within two years of the commencement of the lease to the satisfaction of the authority concerned, the term of the lease, may, on application made prior to the expiry of the 33-year lease be extended to 99 years at such rental and conditions as may then be prescribed.
- (c) The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair all buildings at any time erected on the land,

- (d) To provide on the land to the satisfaction of the local authority, a proper system for the disposal of sewage and sullage.
- (e) The grantee shall erect a fence or plan a hedge on the boundaries of the land other than the frontage and shall keep such fence or hedge in good repair.
- (f) The grantee shall use the land for the purpose of business (excluding the sale of petrol except where specifically permitted) and residence and shall not indulge in any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers dangerous or offensive.
- (g) The grantee shall not transfer, charge or part with the possession of the land without the previous written consent of the Commissioner of Lands.
- (h) The Commissioner of Lands or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of such installations.
- (i) The grantee will be required to pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever descriptions as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contributions or other sums paid in lieu thereof.

- 5. The allottee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 30 days of notification that his application has been approved, the assessed stand premium and proportion of rent, together with the survey fees and fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant and the stamp duty assessed at 2 per cent of stand premium, annual rent and value of the existing buildings, if any, in default of payment of which within the specified period, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot offered.

#### General Conditions

- 1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature shall apply.
- 2. The term of the grant shall be 99 years from the 1st day of the month following notification of the approval of the grant.
- 3. The grant will be issued in the name of the applicant as stated on the application.

#### Special Conditions

- 1. No buildings shall be erected on the land, nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2. The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the Commissioner of Lands through the local authority, plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of a petrol service station and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:




