Superintending Architect, Ministry of Works (No. 158/71)

Salary scale.—£1,839 to £2,064. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be Associates of the Royal Institute of British Architects or the East African Institute of Architects; or hold an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Kenya Registration Board of Architects and Quantity Surveyors. They should have extensive experience in a senior capacity as a group leader, be fluent in English and familiar with the British system of mensuration. They must be able to prepare sketch designs and working drawings for major buildings and to undertake job control and supervision, and have the necessary administrative experience to be in charge of a section dealing with one or more groups of buildings, and to control the planning and administration of projects from sketchplan stage to final completion.

Bio-Chemist, Ministry of Health (No. 159/71)

Salary scale.—£810 to £1,710. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should possess a minimum of B.Sc. degree in Bio-Chemistry from an approved University, with at least four years' post-graduate experience in a Hospital Laboratory. Experience of automated techniques is essential. Duties include introduction and testing of new investigations and analyses; improvement of present techniques and methods in use in the Laboratory; supervision of daily and weekly quality control testing and performance of investigations of a specialized nature, where special knowledge and experience is required. The successful candidate will work under a Chemical Pathologist and will deputise for him when necessary. The post is at the Medical Research Laboratory.

*Vacancies in the Ministry of Agriculture:**Lecturer Grade I (Biology, Anatomy and Physiology) (Training Division) (No. 160/71)*

Salary scale.—£1,398 to £1,614. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must possess a degree in either Veterinary Science or Zoology of an approved University, with some field or teaching experience. The successful candidate will be required to lecture on Biology, Anatomy and Physiology of the domestic animals. He will also be required to conduct practical classes, demonstrations, excursions and examinations in those subjects. In addition, he will be required to help in the supervision of some extra-curricular activities of students, and to perform such other duties as will be assigned to him.

Assistant Animal Husbandry Officer Grade I (Training Division) (No. 161/71)

Salary scale.—£1,104 to £1,356. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should possess a diploma in Animal Husbandry, Dairying or Dairy Technology and must have had at least one year's teaching experience in dairy education. They must have administrative ability and be able to give guidance to other members of the teaching staff. The successful candidate will be posted to the Dairy Training School, Naivasha, and will be required, apart from lecturing, to be responsible to the Principal for planning of training programmes, course timetables and the supervision of students on practical training in the field at the rural dairies and at the Mariakani Milk Scheme.

Draughtsman Grade II (Soil Conservations Survey) (Technical Services) (No. 162/71)

Salary scale.—£858 to £1,068. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should have had a good general education, preferably up to Cambridge School Certificate standard, with at least five years' progressive experience preferably specializing in soil conservation survey work. Ability to work from rough sketches and survey field bookings to finished drawings is essential and experience in map preparation would be advantageous. A good command of English is desirable. The successful candidate will be attached to the Soil Survey Unit at the National Agricultural Laboratories, Nairobi, and will be expected to assist the soil surveys in the production of soil maps and related land-use maps.
