CAUSE NO 15 OF 1972

*Parties —*

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers  
and

Agricultural Finance Corporation

*Issues in dispute —*

- 1 House allowance for married women
- 2 Application of leave allowance to all employees

1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Agricultural Finance Corporation shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 31st day of July, 1972, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

## AWARD

3 The parties have concluded and signed the Collective Agreement relating to the Respondents' employees with the condition that the provisions in this agreement regarding the issues in dispute would be amended in accordance with the Industrial Court award. The Collective Agreement is effective from 1st June, 1971, and is to run for three years from that date

The clauses which have been incorporated in this agreement on House Allowance and Leave Travelling Expenses and which are subject to the Industrial Court award in this dispute are as follows —

*'Housing Allowance'*

- (i) Female staff who are single, widowed or legally separated from their husbands and who can prove to the General Manager that they maintain their own independent establishment can be considered for housing allowance at the rates laid down in subsection (1) (a) of this section
- (ii) The Corporation may, at its discretion, exercised through the General Manager waive the condition relating to 'independent establishment' to award house allowance to a single girl living with her parents to cover her contribution to family house keeping expenses subject to a maximum of £25 per month

*Leave Travelling Expenses*

An officer proceeding on annual leave, may claim leave travelling expenses to and from a destination within Kenya up to the maxima set hereunder. Payment shall be against receipted carrier bills and shall not extend to expenses covering travel in the course of leave

Notwithstanding the foregoing, officers using their own private cars may be paid mileage allowance at the rates provided under section 5, subsection (4) of these Rules subject to the maxima set herein. In all respects, no more than one claim shall be paid in any one period of twelve consecutive calendar months."

*House allowance* — The Claimants' demand in respect of house allowance is that all married women should be paid the agreed house allowance. They submitted that as women workers were entitled to equal pay for work of equal value if married women were denied house allowance then it would amount to discrimination against them. Moreover since in the case where consolidated salaries were paid women received the same as men, there was no reason why when house allowance was paid in addition to salary they should be denied it. They argued that the payment of double house allowance to a married couple did not arise because the house allowance which was generally paid was not to cover the full rent but was only a subsidy. Finally they produced several agreements where married women were entitled to the same house allowance as men.

The Respondents admitted that there were several agreements where married women were granted house allowance and that there were also very many agreements where consolidated rates of pay were in existence without any distinction. But they argued that they were following the Civil Service terms and conditions of employment closely although in some cases their salary scales were much better. They produced a letter from the office of the Directorate of Personnel Management confirming that in the Civil Service married women do not receive a housing allowance unless they are widowed or divorced. The Respondents pointed out that the existing provisions where under certain circumstances married women officers could be considered for housing allowance were exactly the same as those in the Civil Service.

The Court is aware that there are very many agreements where when consolidated rates of pay are agreed female workers, whether married or unmarried, are entitled to same without any distinction. The Court is also aware that there are some agreements where married women are also entitled to a house allowance like other workers. But the fact remains that by and large where house allowance is paid in addition to salary married women usually are not entitled to it. Moreover, although Ndegwa Commission has recommended that the statutory boards should continue to negotiate with the unions as before they are required not to fall too much out of step with the Civil Service.

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that the existing provisions of the Collective Agreement are quite fair and reasonable under the circumstances and the Court therefore rejects the Claimants' demands.

*Application of leave allowance to all employees* — On this item the Claimants want the agreed rates on leave travelling expenses as set out hereinbefore to be paid to various employees without requiring them to produce receipts for expenses incurred in travelling while on leave. In fact they want these amounts to be considered as 'leave allowance' to be paid to workers when they proceed on leave. The Claimants argued that there were many agreements under which leave allowance was paid to workers as against a system of reimbursement of actual expenses incurred while travelling. They also submitted that in some cases although the workers travelled they could not obtain the necessary receipts. Finally the Claimants pointed out that some of the other statutory boards paid a leave allowance. They added that under this system workers may be tempted to commit offences in order to make claims.

The Respondents on the other hand strongly resisted this demand also because they felt that if they departed from the present arrangement then it would be nothing else but an increase in salaries. They submitted that in their current Collective Agreement adequate salary increases had been granted and it would be quite wrong in principle, therefore, to give additional allowance where no expense is incurred. They asked the Court to uphold the present principle which was not unusual.

The Court has carefully considered this demand but feels that it cannot make an award in the present circumstances as although the demand is for payment of leave allowance the fact is they want the existing leave travelling allowance expenses to be turned into a leave allowance. It is obvious that there is some confusion on this issue. The Court, therefore, recommends to the parties that on the expiry of the current Collective Agreement mentioned hereinbefore in para 1 of the award they should negotiate this item again.

With this recommendation the Court must reject this demand also.

## AWARD

3 The current collective agreement between the parties became effective from 1st January, 1969, and although it should have expired on 31st December, 1970, it was extended by another one year because of the Tripartite Agreement on the Relief of Unemployment.

On 20th September, 1971, the Claimants, on behalf of their members, submitted their proposals for new terms and conditions of employment to be incorporated in the new agreement. The Respondents did not put forward their counter proposals until 8th December, 1971, and suggested the implementation date of the new agreement to be 1st January, 1970.

The parties held negotiations on 20th and 21st January and 8th February, 1972, and agreement was reached on several items and nine items were referred to the Ministry of Labour for conciliation. At conciliation agreement was reached on another five items leaving the four items which are the issues in dispute.

The parties' respective positions when deadlock was recorded on the four items were as follows —

1 *Wages and Salaries* —

2 *Housing and House Allowance* — The Claimants demanded the payment of housing allowance being 25 per cent of the wage of each employee. The Respondents maintained that since the wages paid were consolidated they could not entertain this demand.

3 *Minimum Rates of Pay on Jobs Classified* — The Claimants demand was as follows —

4 *Implementation of Agreement* — The Claimants demanded the effective date of the new agreement to be 1st January, 1972, with the Respondents proposing the said date to be the date of the Court award.

The Claimants' arguments were presented at length through a comprehensive written submission with further verbal submissions during the hearing and supported by the evidence on oath of four witnesses.

Briefly the Claimants based their demands on the current cost of consumer items which they submitted had gone up since 1969 by more than Sh 25. The Claimants stated that strictly speaking they could have asked for a minimum wage of Sh 406/90 as they have produced all the relevant statistics supporting that the basic essentials needed by a worker and his family cost that much but since they have approached the problem realistically they had made their aforesaid demands. The Claimants rejected that the Respondents' members had suffered any appreciable loss in their turnover due to the loss of the Tanzanian market. All the Claimants' witnesses stated that they had not worked on any Tanzanian orders for their employers, neither had they seen any of their colleagues working on such orders. They said that they were not only fully occupied during the working hours but worked regular overtime going up to 7 or 8 p.m. every day of the week. Some of them said that they were not paid overtime at the end of the month but such payments were made every day.

The Claimants strongly submitted that although their previous agreement clearly stated that wages were consolidated, that is, including housing element, they were entitled to raise this issue as a separate item on the expiry of the existing collective agreement. They maintained and were supported by the evidence of their witnesses in this that the workers found it a great hardship to live in decent accommodation from their current low wages. In fact one witness said that although he had been lucky to secure a municipal house at a rental of Sh 140 per month he had to give it up because he could not afford this rent which was being deducted by his employer from his monthly wage.

On the rates for the various jobs the Claimants asked the Court to rule that all the employees working for this group were skilled artisans and as such they were entitled to rates which took into account their necessary skills, ability and experience. They referred the Court to their agreement with the Master Printers' Association in Nairobi and added that some printers in Kitale and other places paid the same rates as this Association. They could find no reason why the Respondents could not be brought in line with the Nairobi Master Printers.

Finally the Claimants stated that as far as they were concerned since the Respondents had themselves suggested that the effective date of the new collective agreement should be 1st January, 1972, there was no dispute on this item. They rejected the Respondents' argument that they had suggested this date on condition that their offers on the various items were accepted.

The Respondents gave the details of the additional benefits which they had conceded to their employees during negotiations and conciliation and strenuously argued that due to these additional costs and owing to the fact that they catered for a very limited market in Kisumu and further because they had suffered a loss of Tanzanian market they could not go beyond their final offer which they had made during conciliation. They asked the Court to find that their offer was realistic under the circumstances because they had also suffered a significant loss in sales in Nyanza Province and part of Western and Rift Valley Provinces when the Government decided to centralize the supply of books from Nairobi. The Respondents gave the following summary to the Court regarding the extra cost to them as a result of their offer and the one based on the Claimants' demands —

The Respondents strongly resisted the Claimants' demand for the introduction of a housing allowance and rejected the Claimants' contention that the legal provisions in the Employment Act stipulated that all employers must necessarily provide accommodation for their employees. They referred the Court to section 23 of the Act which made the position clear that if an employer did not provide reasonable housing accommodation he shall pay to the employees such sufficient sum as rental in addition to his wages as will enable such employee to obtain reasonable accommodation. They added that their housing element had been consolidated in the wages and therefore they were in line with the law.

The Respondents produced several other collective agreements in other industries operating in Kisumu and asked the Court to find that their offer was in line with the comparable rates in Kisumu.

The Court has carefully considered the various submissions made by the parties and the evidence given by the Claimants' witnesses in coming to its conclusions. The Court can find no good reason why the Respondents should have delayed their counter offer to the Claimants' demands made in September until December 1971. There seems to be some truth in the Claimants' allegation that their General Secretary was not accorded due respect and facility by some members of the Respondents group.

Regarding the allegation by the Claimants that the Respondents had not carried out their obligations under the Tripartite Agreement, the Court must point out that the representative of the Ministry of Labour in Kisumu had issued the relevant certificate to the effect that the Respondents had complied with the provisions of the Tripartite Agreement. This point, however, is not very material as the Claimants used it to strengthen their argument that the Respondents had funds available which they had saved by not complying with the Tripartite Agreement.

The Court has decided to reject the Claimants' demand for a separate housing allowance because there is absolutely no doubt that the existing wages included housing and are consolidated. The Court is of the view that if there is any additional money to be given to workers then it should be added to their wages and the Court has taken into account the arguments on the question of housing and house rents in arriving at the wage increase.

The Court awards as follows —

1 *Wages and Salaries*—All employees should get an increase of Sh 30 per month on their current wages and salaries.

The Court also rules that all employees should get a further increase of Sh 15 per month after a period of 12 months from the effective date which is awarded hereinafter.

2 *Housing and House Allowance*—Nil award.

3 *Minimum Rates of Pay on Jobs Classified*—The court awards the following new rates of pay —

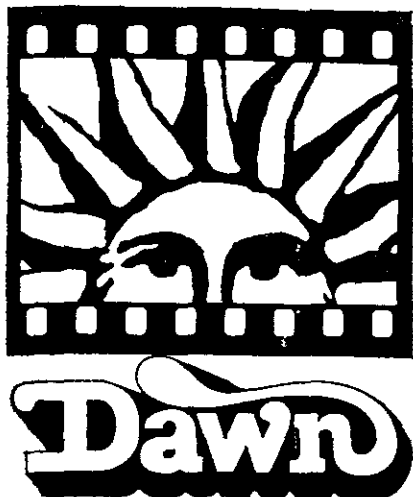
