THE Commissioner of Lands invites applications for the alienation of plots in above areas for the purpose of residential flats as described in the Schedule hereto. A plan of the plots may be seen in the Lands Department or may be obtained on payment of Sh 4 from the Public Map Office, P O Box 30089, Nairobi.

2 Applications must be sent so as to reach the Commissioner of Lands not later than noon on Friday, 15th March, 1974.

3 Applicants must enclose with their applications a sum of Sh 1,000 in cash or send a postal order, money order or banker's order made payable to the Commissioner of Lands as deposit. No cheques will be accepted. The deposit will be dealt with as follows—

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within the period of 14 days as required by Condition No 5 below, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.
- (b) If the application is unsuccessful, the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
- (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required by Condition No 5 below, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

4 Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating—

- (a) the amount of capital it is proposed to spend on the project,
- (b) the amount of actual capital available for development with a banker's letter or other evidence of financial status in support,
- (c) the manner in which it is proposed to raise the balance of the capital required for development, if any,
- (d) full details of both residential and/or commercial properties owned by the applicant in Nairobi City.

5 The successful allottee of the plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been successful, the stand premium and proportion of the annual rental together with conveyancing, stamp duty and registration fees, contributions in lieu of rates and provisional service charges. In default of payment within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allotment and the applicant shall have no claim to the plot.

General Conditions

1 The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap 281).

2 The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as given in the letter of application and will be subject to the Special Conditions set out below.

3 The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the 1st day of the month following the issue of the letter of allotment.

Special Conditions

1 No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

2 The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such

buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner.

Provided that if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands may (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein.

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period, no refund shall be made.

5 The land and buildings shall only be used for residential flats.

6 The buildings shall conform to a type plan laid down by the Nairobi City Council.

7 The grantee shall not subdivide the land.

8 The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the President. No application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No 2 has been performed.

9 The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.

10 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.

11 Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard, the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

12 The grantee shall pay such rates, charges, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.

13 The President or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

14 The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th year of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at the rate of 4 per centum of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.

1 The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Association of Local Government Employers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 29th day of January, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The parties negotiated and concluded their collective agreement at a meeting held in Nairobi on 18th November, 1971. The minutes of this meeting were tabled in Court by both the parties. It is clear that agreement was reached on the item of housing allowances after some bargaining during which the Claimants dropped certain of their demands in order to secure the following provision on this item —

"Housing

An officer occupying privately rented accommodation will be entitled to house allowance, on production of the rent receipt or the rent book, subject to the following maxima —

Officers on the undermentioned new annual basic salaries	Maximum house allowance payable p m

£1,494 and over but under £1,866	850

(ii) Married women officers will not normally qualify for house allowance. However, in exceptional cases consideration will be given to granting a married woman officer house allowance on the merits of each case

(iii) An officer living in a hotel, boarding house, hostel, club or as a paying guest with a private family will be eligible for house allowance assessed at 50 per cent of the all-in monthly charge for himself or himself with his family, subject to the maximum house allowance he would have received if he had been living in privately rented accommodation

(iv) Officers living in their own houses will be eligible for the same allowances as paid to civil servants as defined in Personnel Circular No 9, 1969, and amended as shown in paragraph 18 of the 1971 edition of Conditions of Service for the Kenya Civil Service"

The parties subsequently produced their collective agreement in a printed booklet headed "Final Document" covering terms and conditions of service for employees in the salaried grades of the aforesaid nine Municipal Councils comprising Committee No 2 which terms and conditions were applicable from 1st December, 1971

The parties however, encountered considerable difficulty in securing the Minister for Local Government's approval to this agreement. The Claimants pressed the Minister for its implementation and eventually as a result of a meeting held between the Minister for Local Government, his officers, the Claimants' representatives and the Treasurers of all the Municipalities involved, the Minister issued the following circular. The relevant paragraph is reproduced hereinbelow —

"After consultations with H E the President, Mzee Jomo Kenyatta, and with his blessings it has been agreed that the salaries for Nairobi and Mombasa will be those negotiated by the Union and the representatives of Nairobi City Council and Mombasa Municipal Council. In respect of salaries for employees in the remaining Municipalities it was agreed that the salaries negotiated by the representatives of the Union and of those Municipalities will be paid with minor modifications and without any additional housing allowance. It was agreed at the meeting that the whole question of housing policy by local authorities should be a subject for further review at a later date"

The Claimants after having secured the implementation of the new salaries started pressing for the implementation of the agreement on housing allowances soon thereafter but as no progress was made they reported a dispute to the Minister for Labour on 24th November, 1972. A Conciliator was appointed but while conciliation proceedings were in progress the parties had a meeting on 15th May, 1973. The relevant minute on housing allowance reads as follows —

"The representatives of the Union pointed out that no progress had been made over the question of housing allowance for salaried staff but the Municipal Councils pointed out that although agreement had been reached at a Joint Committee level, the Ministry of Local Government had

consistently refused to grant approval therefore, the Union had reported a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour who had appointed a Conciliator. Several meetings had been called by the Conciliator, all of which the Councils had been represented by Mr Richmond but on each occasion no progress was made because of the attitude of the Ministry of Local Government who had always stated that the Ministry were involved in a review of the financial position of all local authorities and until this was completed, no decision could be made on this particular problem.

As the matter was under conciliation it was agreed that the Secretary of the Association of Local Government Employers and the General Secretary of the Union, arrange to meet the Conciliator and if no solution was found to sign Form 'A' so as to refer the matter to the Industrial Court.

Subsequently as the Minister's approval could not be obtained by the Respondents the parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" sometime in September, 1973, although the form had been prepared on 19th June, 1973. The Court received the form together with the Labour Commissioner's Certificate on 18th September, 1973, on that day.

The Claimants' main argument is that since the parties had voluntarily agreed on the issue of housing allowance which appears as clause 40 in the printed booklet of their collective agreement they could see no reason why an award could not be made in their favour by the Court. They stated that as a matter of fact they were expecting the Respondents to come and agree to an award by consent as there was no dispute as the agreement put forward by them was concluded and the only thing that remained was its implementation.

The Claimants rejected the Respondents' contention of financial inability to implement the agreement on this issue saying that if there was any financial deterioration then it was the fault of these Municipal Councils and their senior officers in that they allowed huge amounts to remain uncollected which was legitimately due to them. In any case the Claimants maintained that financial inability was irrelevant to the issue in dispute.

The Respondents on the other hand did not deny that they had entered into an agreement as alleged by the Claimants but pointed out that both the parties were fully aware that before the agreement was implemented it required the approval of the Minister for Local Government. The Respondents made it clear that all of them had pressed the Minister for its approval and as a result of the pressure which they had put on the Minister he had agreed to give his approval to the new salary scales but rejected a separate housing allowance.

The Respondents submitted that the reason for the Minister's decision was that he was fully aware of the serious financial situation which at that time was facing all the nine Municipal Councils and unfortunately during the past 18 months there had been no improvement and the position as at November, 1973, was much more serious and all the Municipal Councils were facing a financial crisis. They strongly maintained that this was still the reason behind the refusal of the Minister for the authorization of institution of a separate housing allowance. The Respondents gave the following details of the actual cost to each council for putting into effect the demands of the Claimants —

The Court forwarded the parties' submissions to the Employment Promotion Division for an analysis to be carried out on its behalf in relation to the Guidelines which had been issued to the Court by the Minister for Finance. The conclusion arrived at by the Principal Economist is as follows —

"The crucial point of the dispute appears to be whether or not the housing allowance should be regarded as part of an existing agreement. If the Court should decide that it is part of the agreement which was signed in November, 1971, then its implementation, even though deferred by Government action, does not seem to contravene the Guidelines. If on the other hand the Court should rule that this part of the agreement was abrogated by Government action then the introduction of a housing allowance must be regarded as a fresh demand by the Claimants, a demand which must be viewed in relation to the Guidelines. In the latter case, allowances of the size proposed appear too high to be accommodated under the Guidelines. Since the room for benefits like housing allowances will depend on the forthcoming revision of wages and salaries in central and local Government, it may be more practical to postpone the question of housing allowances until after such a revision of pay scales has taken place."

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court is satisfied that the parties had voluntarily at their own level entered into an agreement on the issue of housing allowances. The Court is also satisfied that this agreement was a result of a "package deal" whereby the Claimants had to forego certain of their demands before securing this agreement. There is a further implication of this agreement in that it is a recognition of the fact by both parties that the salary structure was not consolidated to include housing.

The Court, further finds that the Claimants did not at any time drop the benefit of housing allowance which they had secured and the Court is also satisfied that this agreement has not been abrogated by Government action. In fact what has happened is that this particular provision was deferred by Government action.

The Court, in the absence of any evidence to the contrary from the Respondents, is left with no alternative but to come to the aforesaid conclusion. The Court is also satisfied that the Claimants have pursued this matter fairly and consistently with the Respondents and the Minister for Local Government but it appears that no one paid any serious attention to their demand. The least that the authorities could have done was to initiate a review of the whole question of housing policy by local authorities or if that was not possible then an indication should have been given to the Claimants when such a review was likely to take place. Since over two years have elapsed since the parties had concluded the agreement on housing allowances and nearly 20 months have passed since the Minister for Local Government stated that it had been agreed that the whole question of housing policy by local authorities should be subject of further review at a later date, the Court finds that the Claimants are now entitled to ask for this matter to be finalized.

The Court awards that the Respondents should pay housing allowance rates as agreed upon on 18th November, 1971, with effect from the 1st of January, 1974.

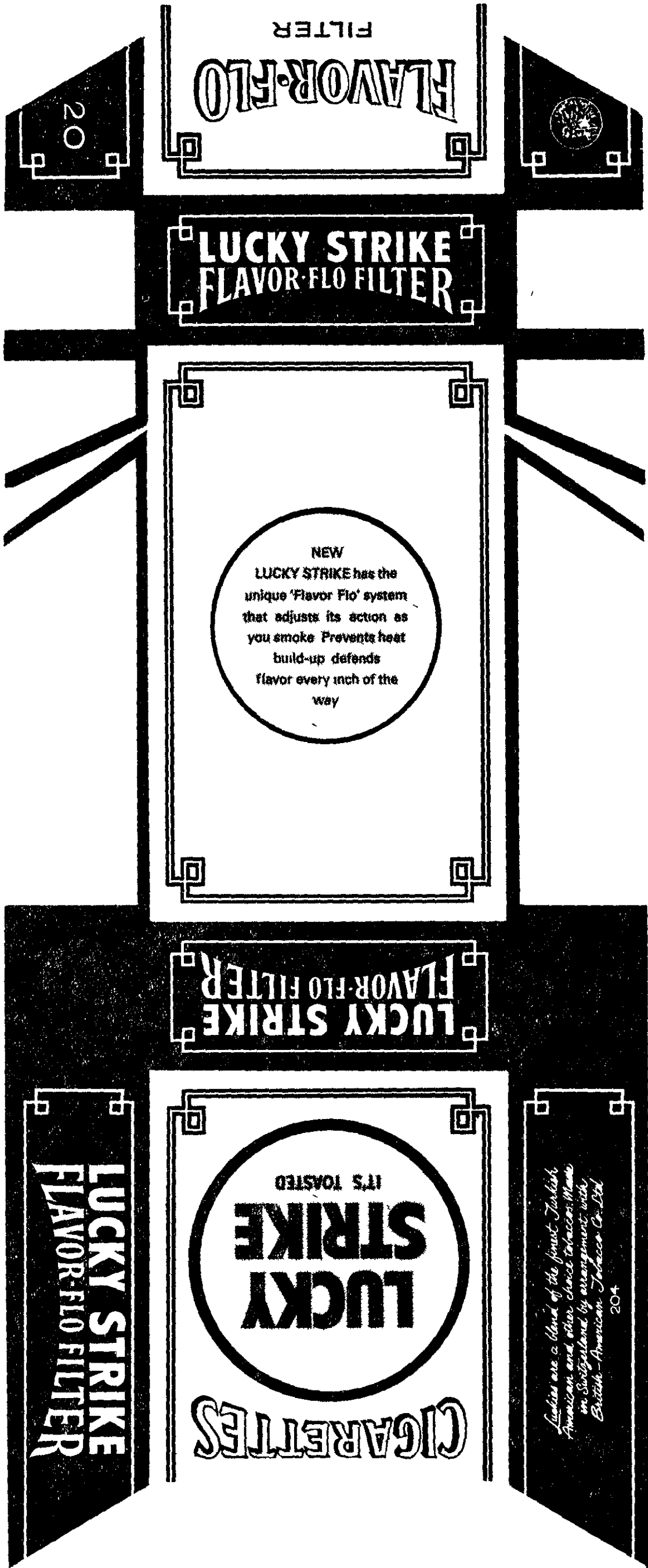

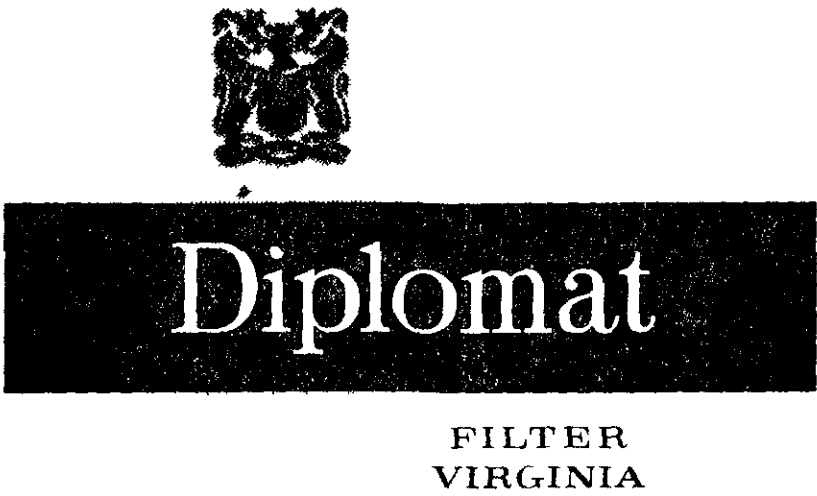

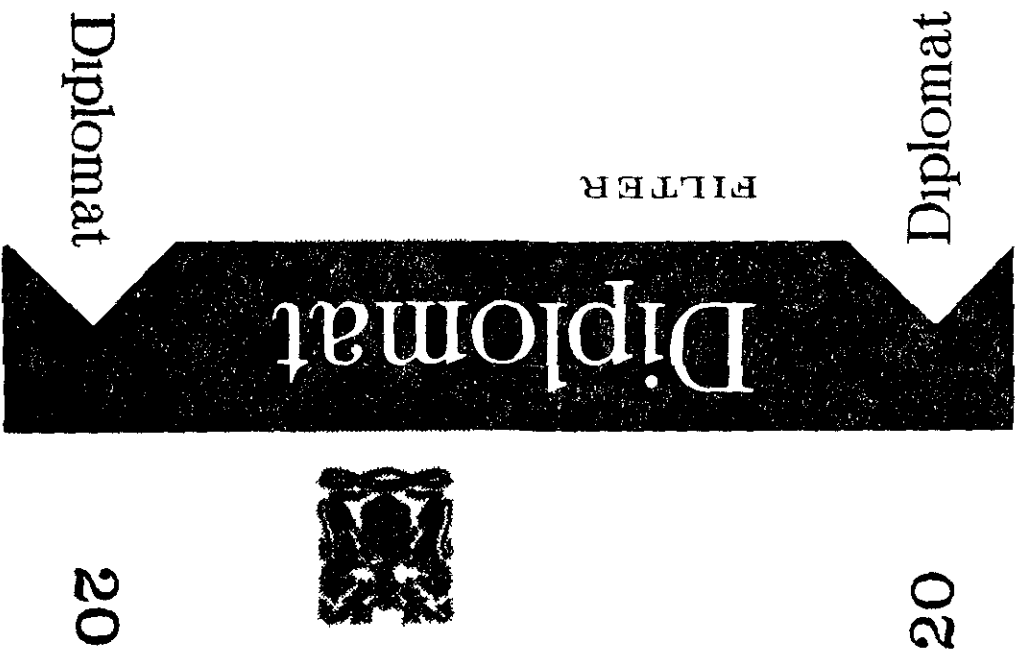
