THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE NO. 14 OF 1974

AWARD

Parties:—

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and

Twentieth Century Fox Organization (E.A.)

Issues in dispute:—

- (1) Refusal by the Management to treat long service increment as wages and their insistence to treat it as an allowance.
- (2) Reinstatement of private provident fund scheme to women workers.
- (3) Underpayment to doormen and ushers.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Twentieth Century Fox Organization (E.A.) shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 23rd day of April, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 2nd February, 1974, was received by the Court on 1st March, together with the certificate from the Labour Commissioner under section 9 (9) (e) of the Trade Disputes Act.

Issues 1 and 3.—The parties appeared before the Court in Cause No. 15 of 1973 and the Court made awards on minimum wage for Grade II and also granted wage increases to employees in the various grades. The parties had agreed to three grades and whereas they had agreed to the minimum wage for Grades I and III, they could not agree on the minimum wage for Grade II and after the Court award the minimum wages for the three grades are as follows:—

	Sh.
Grade I	300
Grade II	425
Grade III	550

The Court also granted wage increases for all employees in the respective grades as follows:—

Grade I	15 per cent and after 18 months another 10 per cent
Grade II	10 per cent and after 18 months another 7 per cent
Grade III	10 per cent and after 18 months another 7 per cent

The Court further directed that workers will not get a double benefit as a result of fixation of minimum wage and the demand for a wage increase and the Court further ruled that no worker will get a lower increase than the increase awarded for the first 18 months.

In the collective agreement between the parties which was effective from 1st September, 1969, for a period of two years the following clause existed under the heading of long service increment:—

"In addition to basic wages there shall be payable to full-time employee a monthly sum calculated as follows:—

	Sh.
(a) On completion of 4 years' continuous service	15
(b) On completion of 8 years' continuous service	20
(c) On completion of 15 years' continuous service	25
(d) On completion of 20 years' continuous service	30

(rise of Sh. 5)."

Apparently this clause continues in force along with the other items and the awards made by the Court on the issues in dispute in Cause No. 15/73.

The present dispute stems from the Claimants' insistence that long service increments form part of the basic wage and therefore should be taken into consideration when deciding the grade within which any particular worker falls.

The Respondents, however, rejected this idea and maintained that the long service increment is in "addition" to basic wage and therefore strictly speaking it was an allowance and not part of the basic wage to determine the grade of any particular worker.

It is quite clear that the parties have no agreed job classification although the Respondents had submitted a job classification in their submission to Cause No. 15/73. During the hearing the parties accepted that a comprehensive job classification exercise was in hand and would be completed before the next round of negotiations.

The Court has some doubt on whether or not the existing job classification forms the basis of the three grades to which the parties agreed. The Claimants maintained that the grading was purely related to the amount of wages earned by workers and was not based on any job classification. The Respondents submitted otherwise.

If the Court were to accept the Claimants' submission then it would lead to many employees who were categorized by the Respondents in Grade I being moved to Grade II and those in Grade II being moved to Grade III with consequent entitlement to the wage increases granted by the Court in respect of those two grades.

The Court has taken into consideration the Claimants' submission that a long service increment and merit increase are closely associated and further that job classification was not an issue in dispute in Cause No. 15/73. The Claimants had put forward suggestions in their written submissions on job classifications for the three grades in Cause No. 15/73 but since this issue was not in dispute they were not allowed to make any submissions on it.

After careful consideration of all the submissions, the Court is satisfied that the long service increment does form part of the basic wage but this does not necessarily mean that those employees who are put in Grade I can be promoted to the next higher grade by virtue of their own wage because notwithstanding any clear-cut agreement on job classification the fact remains that the parties had a working arrangement on this point as is evident from the Respondents' submission in Cause No. 15/73.

The Court therefore awards that the long service increment is part of a workers' wage and it is not an allowance but this in itself does not entitle a worker to be placed in a higher grade. The whole problem is closely linked with the job evaluation exercise which the parties are in the process of concluding and which they informed the Court would be ready before the next wage revision. The Court has no doubt that this problem will be taken care of when such an exercise is completed. In the meantime the Court would like to make it clear that the workers are to be considered to have been graded in accordance with the job classification which appeared in Cause No. 15/73, i.e. unskilled, semi-skilled, skilled and clerical.

2. *Reinstatement of private provident fund scheme to women workers.*—It is common ground that the provident fund scheme was frozen on the instigation of the National Social Security Fund (N.S.S.F.) in 1966. It is also agreed that the services of all workers from the date they commenced their employment was the basis in respect of which the private provident fund scheme operated.

The Claimants maintained that this has resulted in female workers being deprived of any retirement benefits as they are not covered by the N.S.S.F. and since the Respondents are contributing 5 per cent towards retirement benefits for male workers through the N.S.S.F. they have ceased to contribute anything in respect of female workers. The Claimants further added that there is a move to bring female workers within the ambit of N.S.S.F. the Respondents should continue to pay such female workers a gratuity of 5 per cent of the monthly salary to be paid on retirement or they should reinstate the private provident fund scheme in respect of them.

The Respondents have resisted this demand on the ground that there was never any question of an employee's contribution nor did the employer previously pay 5 per cent on a recurring basis. They pointed out that previously they had not discriminated between male and female workers. They reminded the Court that in 1966 certain private provident fund schemes were declared illegal and had to cease on the instigation of N.S.S.F.

After careful consideration of all the submissions, the Court awards that the female workers shall be entitled to a gratuity payment in respect of services rendered from the date the private provident fund was frozen until the date of their retirement at the following rate:—

Ten days' pay for each completed year of service.

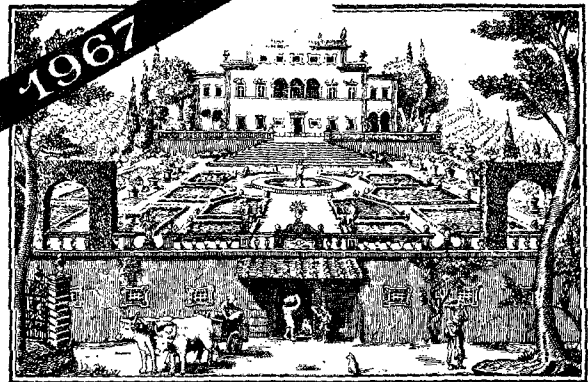
