PROFICIENCY EXAMINATION FOR CLERICAL OFFICERS, 1974

YOUR attention is invited to Personnel Circular No. 10 dated 5th December, 1973, in which the Syllabus for the above-mentioned Examination was published, and in which it was stated that the details of the Examination and the date on which it will be held would be announced by the Public Service Commission of Kenya.

2. It is now notified for general information that this year's Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officers will be held on Thursday, 19th and Friday, 20th December, 1974, in accordance with the following terms and conditions:—

(i) *Eligibility to Enter*

The Examination will be open to Civil Servants only, who are serving as Clerical, Higher Clerical or Senior Clerical Officers,

and who have completed at least four years' continuous service in the cadre. However, Clerical Officers who were appointed at a starting salary of K£354 per annum and above by virtue of their educational qualification or approved experience may enter the Examination after completion of two years' service.

(ii) *Scheme of the Examination*

The Examination will consist of the following subjects, to be taken by all candidates:—

PAPER I—General Paper (3 hours).

PAPER II—Civil Service Regulations (2 hours).

PAPER III—Clerical Procedures (2½ hours).

Part I—Compulsory.

(A) Office Practice (½ hour).

(B) Business Calculations (½ hour).

Part II—(Any one subject only related to officer's duties) (1½ hours).

(A) Accounts

or

(B) Stores

or

(C) Personnel

or

(D) General Office Services.

(iii) *Condition for obtaining a Pass*

Candidates are required to enter for and pass in all the three papers at one and the same sitting. There will be no partial passes allowed.

(iv) *Examination Entry Fees*

Every candidate entering this Examination will be required to pay a Registration Fee of K.Sh. 10 only for the whole examination. The Registration Fee which will be non-refundable, will be payable to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, in either crossed East African Inland Money Order, East African Postal Order or cash. Personal cheques will not be accepted.

(v) *Entry Forms*

Candidates must complete the examination entry forms in triplicate as set out at "Appendix" to this Circular Letter, copies of which can be reproduced and cyclostyled by each Ministry/Department, as required, and the completed entry forms, duly certified correct by the candidates' Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Department and accompanied by the Registration Fees of K.Sh. 10 per candidate, should be submitted to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, Gill House, P.O. Box 30095, Nairobi, so as to reach him on or before Monday, 7th October, 1974. Late entries and/or incomplete, uncertified or wrongly filled in entry forms and entries not accompanied by the correct registration fees, will automatically be rejected.

(vi) *Examination Centres*

The examination will be held in all Provinces at Mombasa, Nyeri, Embu, Nairobi, Nakuru, Kakamega, Kisumu and Garissa Centres. The actual examination venue at each Provincial Centre will be notified to the candidates in due course.

(vii) *General Conduct of the Examination*

Candidates will not be allowed to consult any books, files, notes, magazines, etc., during the examination. Any infringement of this rule will result in immediate disqualification from the whole examination, and may also lead to disciplinary action being taken against the offenders. Examination papers and stationery will be supplied by this office to the Provincial Education Officers who will be in charge of the Examination Centres, and who will be responsible for the distribution of the papers and stationery to the candidates at their centres, appointment of invigilators, arrangement of the examination venues, and return to this office of the candidates' answer scripts when the Examination is concluded, as directly by the Public Service Commission of Kenya.

(viii) *Final Decision*

All in all, the decision of the Public Service Commission will be final in all matters related to this Examination.

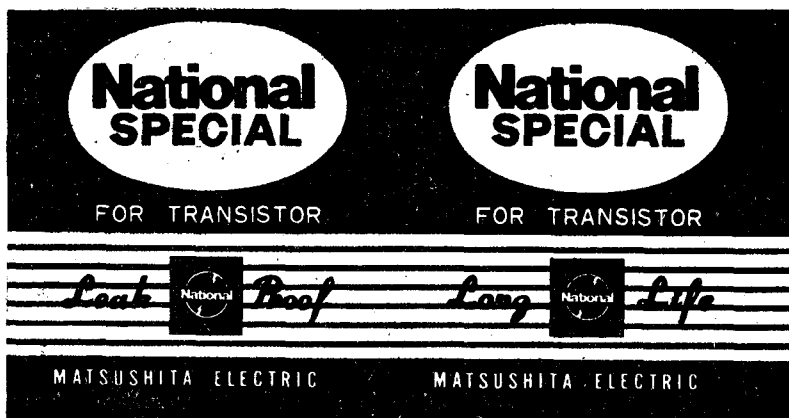
