THE GOVERNMENT LANDS ACT

(Cap. 280)

NAIROBI CHURCH SITE—PARCEL No. BLOCK 60/452, NGEI ESTATE

THE Commissioner of Lands invites applications for plot of land at the above-mentioned estate for church site as described in the Schedule hereto. A plan of the plot may be seen in the Lands Department, or may be obtained on payment of Sh. 4 from the Public Map Office, P.O. Box 30089, Nairobi.

- 2. Applications must be sent so as to reach the Commissioner of Lands not later than noon on Friday, 8th November, 1974.
- 3. Applicants must enclose with their applications a sum of Sh. 100 in cash or send a postal order, money order or banker's order made payable to Commissioner of Lands as deposit. No cheques will be accepted. The deposit will be dealt with as follows:—
 - (a) If applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within the period of 14 days as required by Condition No. 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
 - (b) If the application is unsuccessful, the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
 - (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required by Condition No. 5 below, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.
- 4. Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating—
 - (a) the amount of capital it is proposed to spend on the project;
 - (b) the amount of actual capital available for development with a banker's letter, or other evidence of financial status in support:
 - (c) the manner in which it is proposed to raise the balance of the capital required for development, if any;
 - (d) a sketch plan showing the buildings intended to be constructed;
 - (e) proof of registration is required;
 - (f) the applicant's choice of the plots in the order of their preference.
- 5. The successful allottee of the plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been successful the conveyancing, stamp duty and registration fees, contribution in lieu of rates and provisional service charges. In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allotment and the applicant shall have no claim to the plot.

General Conditions

- 1. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 2. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as given in the letter of application and will be subject to the Special Conditions set out below.
- 3. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the 1st day of the month following the issue of the letter of allotment.

Special Conditions

- 1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2. The grantee shall within six months of the Commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in confirmity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280), if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any conditions herein contained.

- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantees expense) accept a surrender of land comprised herein.
- 5. The land and buildings shall only be used for the purpose of a church, church hall, and one residence for the Minister in charge.
- 6. The buildings shall not cover a greater area of the land than that laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.
- 7. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.
- 8. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President.
- 9. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.
- 10. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.
- 11. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.
- 12. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description, as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.
- 13. - 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period, no refund shall be made.

- 5. The land and buildings shall only be used for shops, offices and flats (excluding the sale of petrol). (Schedule A.) The land and buildings shall only be used for cinema and ancillary purposes thereto (excluding the sale of petrol). (Schedule B.)
- 6. The buildings shall not cover more than 75 per centum of the area of the land if used for shop and/or office purposes only or such lesser area of the land as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws, and not more than 50 per centum of the area of the land if used for the combined purposes of shops, offices and flats or such lesser area as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.
- 7. The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.
 - 8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.
- 9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President: no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.
- 10. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.
- 11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.
- 12. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard, the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

- 13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.
- 14. The President or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay down and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of mains, service pipes, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.
- 15. The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th years of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at a rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 39 of 1974

Parties:-

Transport and Allied Workers Union

and

Air Kenya Limited

Issue in dispute:-

Unreasonable dismissal of Mrs. Chege on 6th March, 1973.

- 1. The Transport and Allied Workers Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Air Kenya Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 5th September, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 8th March, 1974, signed by representatives of both the parties was received by the Court on 18th July, 1974, along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Mrs. A. Chege started working for the Respondents on 27th November, 1967, as a Receptionist/Ground Hostess at a monthly salary of Sh. 700. In due course her salary was increased to Sh. 1,590 which was what she was earning when she was summarily dismissed on 6th March, 1973.

The reason stated in her letter of dismissal is as follows:-

"We understand that you are involved in certain Work Permit negotiations and enjoy close relationships to and with certain friends and members of the Immigration Department.

These relationships and negotiations are not in keeping with your duties and responsibilities with this company and in fact can be construed to be strictly against the best interests of the company and its staff in the light of your recent behaviour. Further there may be certain unlawful associtaions and intentions involved to the deteriment of this company and staff.

A certain Sister Grace Wanjiru of the Government Hospital, Kiambu has been named and is known to be one of your associates. Therefore, as your actions in this, and your past record, has not always been in the best interests of the company and could bring the name of the company into disrepute and damage the career and reputation of company staff, you are hereby summarily dismissed from the staff of Air Kenya Limited."

It is not disputed that Mrs. Chege consulted a firm of advocates and served a notice on the Respondents Managing Director for compensation for defamation of character. This action, however, was not pursued by her; instead she saw the Claimants who took up the matter on her behalf. The Claimants in due course reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour and an investigator was appointed.

On 24th, April, 1973, Mrs. Chege collected a cheque for a sum of Sh. 2,225/70 being pay in lieu of notice, pay for six days of March and pay in respect of prorata leave and leave allowance.

The parties have a collective agreement in force in which clauses concerning "warning" and "termination of employment" are contained.

The Claimants bitterly complained that the Respondents attitude was either to ignore the Claimants representatives or take only a cursory interest in them. The Court gets a clear impression of this and also that the Respondents were not very cooperative with the Investigator appointed by the Ministry of Labour. The Court can only comment that it is very much in the interest of the parties that where a union is recognized its existence should be taken seriously.

The Chief Industrial Relations Officer had this to say in this conclusion and recommendation:—

"It was unfortunate that the Management did not consider it necessary to attend meetings convened by the investigator to submit oral evidence but only relied on their written submission through their lawyer.

The Management did not also consider it necessary to produce the tape-recording of the conversation between Mrs. Chege and the European employee which seems to be the main evidence in support of the Management's action.

The allegations against Mrs. Chege therefore do not seem to have been proved.

Recommendation

After careful examination of all the evidence made avaliable to the investigator, I give Mrs. Chege the benefit of doubt and therefore consider the action taken against Mrs. Chege to be unjustified and it is accordingly recommended that she be reinstated without loss of earning."

The Respondents rejected this recommendation and the parties are now before the Court.

The Claimants maintain that Mrs. Chege was never formally dismissed. In any case no justifiable reason was given as to why her services were being dispensed with after almost six years of loyal service. The Claimants insinuated that an expatriate in Respondents employment was interested in her and since she refused to give in she has been victimized.

The Claimants strongly submitted that the Respondents should accept and honour the recommendation of the Chief Industrial Relations Officer and demanded that Mrs. Chege should be paid her full salary from March, 1973, to the date of the Court award as compensation for her wrongful dismissal.

The Respondents stated that Mrs. Chege had been warned a couple of times in the past although the warnings had lapsed.

The Respondents placed before the Court all the relevant documents and asked for their action in dismissing Mrs. Chege to be upheld as she had indulged in activities which were prejudicial to the firm.

The Court has before it a rather peculiar case where an employee is alleging improper motives on an officer of the Respondent firm who in turn are accusing Mrs. Chege of trying to obtain a bribe from the said officer who was having work permit problems.

The fact that neither party called any witness does not help matters at all and the written and verbal submissions made by them are anything but comprehensive.

There is no doubt that the copies of the warning, sent to Mrs. Chege were not sent to the Claimants as required in the collective agreement.

The Court feels that the Respondents should have drawn the attention of the police to the serious allegation that they have made against Mrs. Chege at the time when Mrs. Chege is alleged to have tried to obtain a bribe to facilitate the issue of a work permit instead of referring the matter to the Immigration Department after terminating her services.

On the evidence before it the Court is not prepared to find that there was any good or justifiable reason for terminating Mrs. Chege's services and the Court finds that her services were wrongfully terminated.

The Court concurs with the findings of the investigator but is not prepared to order Mrs. Chege's reinstatement nor award a heavy compensation.

After careful consideration of all the submissions and the circumstances of the dispute, the Court awards that Mrs. Chege be paid an additional amount of Sh. 3,180 being her two months salary by way of compensation for her wrongful dismissal, she having already been paid one month's salary in lieu of notice.


