THE GOVERNMENT LANDS ACT

(Cap. 280)

KILIFI TOWNSHIP PLOTS FOR SHOPS, OFFICES AND COMBINED WITH RESIDENCE

THE Commissioner of Lands invites applications for the plots described in the Schedule herebelow, which are available for direct alienation.

- 2. The plan of the plots may be inspected at the Public Map Office situated in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or purchased there from at Sh. 4 per copy, post free.
- 3. Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands through the District Commissioner, P.O. Box 29, Kilifi, stating the plot required but not direct to the Commissioner.
- 4. Applications must be submitted so as to reach said District Commissioner, not later than noon on Friday, 13th December, 1974.
- 5. Applicants must enclose a cheque for Sh. 1,000 as deposit which will be dealt with as follows:—
 - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
 - (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
 - (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

Ceneral Conditions

- 1. The ordinary conditions applicable to urban grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.
- 2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.
- 4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following notification of the approval of the grant.
- 5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the legal fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

Special Conditions

- 1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2. The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280), if default shall be made in the performance or observance of

any of the requirements of this condition, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period, no refund shall be made.

- 5. The land and the buildings shall only be used for shops and/or offices combined with residence (excluding sale of petrol).
- 6. The buildings shall not cover more than 75 per centum of the area of the land if used for shop and/or office purposes only or such lesser area of the land as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws, and not more than 50 per centum of the area of the land if used for the combined purposes of shops, offices and flats or such lesser area as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.
- 7. The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.
 - 8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.
- 9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands: no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.
- 10. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.
- 11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.
- 12. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard, the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.
- 13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by the Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.
- 14. VOI TOWNSHIP—PLOTS FOR SHOPS OFFICES AND COMBINED WITH RESIDENCE

THE Commissioner of Lands invites applications for the plots described in the Schedules herebelow, which are available for direct alienation.

- 2. The plan of the plots may be inspected at the Public Map Office situated in the Lands Department building, City Square, Nairobi or purchased there from at Sh. 4 per copy, post free.
- 3. Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands through the District Commissioner, P.O. Wundanyi, stating the plot required but not direct to the Commissioner.
- 4. Applications must be submitted so as to reach said district commissioner not later than noon, on Friday, 1st November, 1974.
- 5. Applicants must enclose a cheque for Sh. 1,000 as deposit which will be dealt with as follows:—
 - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
 - (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
 - (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

General Conditions

- 1. The ordinary conditions applicable to urban grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.
- 2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.
- 4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following notification of the approval of the grant.
- 5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the legal fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

Special Conditions

1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

2. The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280), if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period, no refund shall be made.

- 5. The land and buildings shall only be used for shops, offices and flats (excluding the sale of petrol). (Schedule A.) The land and buildings shall only be used for cinema and ancillary purposes thereto (excluding the sale of petrol). (Schedule B.)
- 6. The buildings shall not cover more than 75 per centum of the area of the land if used for shop and/or office purposes only or such lesser area of the land as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws, and not more than 50 per centum of the area of the land if used for the combined purposes of shops, offices and flats or such lesser area as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.
- 7. The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.
 - 8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.
- 9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President: no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.
- 10. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.
- 11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.
- 12. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard, the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

- 13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.
- 14. The President or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay down and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of mains, service pipes, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.
- 15. The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th years of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at a rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 43 of 1974

Parties:--

Domestic and Hotel Workers' Union and

Izaak Walton Inn

Issue in dispute.—Unreasonable dismissal of Mr. Michael Kaberenge.

- 1. The Domestic and Hotel Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Izaak Walton Inn shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 4th day of October, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 5th July, 1974, was received by the Court on 1st August along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Mr. Michael Kaberenge was employed by the Respondents as a barman until 30th June, 1972, when he was suspended from duty due to an alleged shortage of Sh. 754 in the stock that was entrusted to him. On 2nd July, 1972, his services were terminated with effect from 5th July.

The Claimants intervened on his behalf and the matter was subject of an investigation carried out by an officer of the Ministry of Labour stationed at Nyeri.

It is most unfortunate that investigation report was not out for about a year followed by another one year's delay before the parties could sign the Notification of Dispute Form "A" referring the matter to the Industrial Court. This has resulted in a dispute of a dismissal which took place on 2nd July, 1972, being received and registered by the Court on 1st August, 1974. In these circumstances it is not surprising that both the parties were considerably handicapped in presenting the case before the Court. In the event neither Mr. Kaberenge nor the Respondents' Director who dealt with the matter at the time gave evidence during the hearing.

The fact that could be ascertained from the parties submissions is that on 31st May, 1972, Mr. Kaberenge was not at his place of work and the parties are in a conflict on whether or not Mr. Kaberenge was absent from his place of work without leave or whether he did not report for duty because it was his day off. This matter, however, will be commented upon later on.

The Respondents had no alternative but to take stock of the bar and they alleged that it revealed accumulated stock shortage valued at Sh. 754 with the shortage of Tusker beer alone accounting for Sh. 386 of the total.

It is not disputed that on 5th June, 1972, and again on 28th June, 1972, the Respondents' Director wrote letters to Mr. Kaberenge explaining the shortage amounting to Sh. 386/80 in the stock and also alleging that Mr. Kaberenge had failed to offer any explanation of this shortage and that the Respondents would hold him responsible to make good the loss. He was informed that his account had been debited with the sum of Sh. 754 and that the amount would be deducted in monthly instalments of Sh. 100 p.m.

Mr. Kaberenge replied on 29th June, 1972, repudiating any liability for the loss. On 30th June, 1972, he was suspended from duty pending discussions with the Claimants and as stated above on 2nd July his services were terminated.

The dispute at one stage was handled by an official of the Ministry prior to it being officially reported as a dispute, by a Senior Labour Inspector from Embu, A meeting had been arranged which was attended by Messrs. D. Mugo, A. Kariuki, Jeffries and Kaberenge. The Senior Labour Inspector had recorded the following two paragraphs in his file note:—

"Mr. Mugo said inter alia that since his member had failed to give a satisfactory explanation regarding the shortage of Sh. 386/80 he must make good the money. He then submitted that as the employee has not been warned previously and now that he has accepted his responsibility he should be forgiven and reinstated.

In his reply to the submission, Mr. Jeffries said amongst other things that he was not prepared to reinstate the employee on the grounds that, besides being a shopsteward and trusted both by the management and workers, Mr. Kaberenge was given ample time before and even during the meeting held on 5th July, 1972, to give an explanation or to accept responsibility in this case, but he flagrantly refused to do so and as such it will be difficult for the two to work together."

The Permanent Secretary forwarded his recommendation to the parties on 24th July, 1973, after investigation was completed and he found that Mr. Kaberenge became a victim of a shortage for which he might not have been responsible and recommended that he be compensated for the loss of job by the Respondents paying him four months' pay.

The Respondents rejected this recommendation.

The Claimants during the hearing based their case on the submission that the Respondents to begin with were not at all sure of the amount of shortage in that they had reduced the original shortage of Sh. 754 to Sh. 386/50. Further that the stock checking was carried out in the absence of Mr. Kaberenge which made it very suspicious particularly because Mr. Kaberenge on that day was off duty.

The Claimants strongly submitted that Mr. Kaberenge had been victimized because he was their shopsteward in the Respondents' hotel and because of his union activities the Respondents got rid of him. The Claimants also pointed out that during his service with the Respondents he had not been warned even once. The Claimants asked the Court to award his reinstatement without any loss of benefits.

The Respondents asked the Court to uphold their action in dismissing him because he had been grossly negligent and had involved the Respondents in financial loss. Further when ordered to make restitution he refused to do so. The Respondents explained that before the decision to dismiss Mr. Kaberenge for his gross misconduct was taken, he was given sufficient opportunity to defend himself and to offer an explanation which he refused to do.

The Court finds that the crucial point in this dispute is whether or not Mr. Kaberenge was absent without leave on 31st May, 1972, or whether he was off duty on that day. The burden of proof on this point was on the Claimants and they have failed to prove it by not calling Mr. Kaberenge to give evidence during the hearing. In fact Mr. Kaberenge was not even present in Court during the hearing. In these circumstances the Court accepts the Respondents' submission that Mr. Kaberenge was absent without leave on 31st May, 1972, and this necessitated their taking stock at the bar which revealed the shortage already referred to hereinabove.

The Court is not very much impressed by the report of the Investigator and prefers the notes which were recorded by the Senior Labour Inspeptor of a meeting which took place on 26th July, 1972. It is quite clear that the loss in the stock is not disputed and the Court is satisfied after careful consideration of all the submissions that Mr. Kaberenge is the man responsible for it. If the loss was attributable to someone else then Mr. Kaberenge should have at the earliest opportunity stated so and explained the circumstances. This he never did despite ample opportunity having been given to him.

The Court is satisfied that Mr. Kaberenge's services were not terminated because of his trade union activities and the Court finds that the Respondents' action in terminating his services was fully justified. The Claimants' demand is accordingly rejected.
