Advocates should ensure that they are present as required when cases are called and that they have relevant available information concerning their cases. It shall be the duty of the parties to a case to furnish all the necessary information affecting the estimated length of hearing.

In the event of non-attendance, the case may be taken out of the list.

- If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
- If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
- If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

General Conditions

1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.

2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280) of the Laws of Kenya, and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).

3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.

4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.

5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and the proportion of the annual rent together with the legal fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 225), and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent).

Special Conditions

1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the Local Authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

2. The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280), if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said buildings period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand Premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

5. The land and buildings shall only be used for private residential purposes and not more than one private dwelling-house with the necessary offices and outbuildings appurtenant thereto will be erected on the land. No guest house will be permitted.

6. The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the area of the land or such lesser of the land as may be laid down by the authority in its by-laws.

7. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.

8. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President: no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.

9. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving of adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.

10. The grantee shall from time to time pay the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.

11. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

12. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.

13. The President or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

2. Housing allowance.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Clearing Co. Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 23rd day of October, 1974 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 13th June, 1974, was received by the Court on 4th July together with the statutory certificate from the Labour Commissioner in accordance with section 9 (9) (e) of the Trade Disputes Act.

The Respondents are engaged in the business of clearing and forwarding of imports and had 21 persons working for them in March, 1973.

Due to the events that took place in Uganda the Respondents in late 1972 found themselves without their Uganda business which meant the loss of business from some very important clients based in Uganda. This fact is not disputed and the Respondents produced the necessary books of account and their balance sheet as at 31st December, 1973, to show the marked drop in their business entries and the consequent loss of revenue.

The parties have entered into a recognition agreement, and have also negotiated terms and conditions of employment for their employees, although the latest negotiations despite having been incorporated in a collective agreement are without a fixed duration and the collective agreement remains unsigned. On 30th March, 1973, the Respondents informed the Claimants that in view of a considerable drop in their business they had decided very reluctantly to declare the four employees named under Issue No. 1 as specified above redundant as from 30th April, 1973.

The Claimants objected to the method that was adopted by the Respondents in declaring these employees redundant and drew their attention to the Trade Disputes (Amendment) Act, 1971 wherein it was provided that all cases of redundancy shall be subject to the approval of the Industrial Court.

A meeting took place on 18th April, 1973, between the parties in the offices of the Federation of Kenya Employers, Mombasa branch, and it was agreed that nobody would be declared redundant until the laid down machinery had been exhausted. Notwithstanding this agreement the Respondents terminated the services of the said four employees by declaring them redundant on 30th April, 1973.

On 2nd May, 1973, all employees went on strike and did not resume work until a peace formula was agreed upon which provided *inter alia* that a meeting would be held within two weeks' time to discuss the redundancy of the four employees declared redundant on 30th April, 1973 and further that these employees shall be paid up to the date of the meeting not exceeding two weeks. On 9th May, 1973, a meeting was held at the offices of the Ministry of Labour and the Respondents were asked to produce the balance sheet showing their financial position but they did not do so. The Claimants were left with no alternative but to report the existence of the trade dispute to the Minister for Labour. Subsequent conciliation proceedings ended in deadlock and the matter is now before the Court.

During the hearing the Claimants stressed that the Respondents had violated the statutory provisions on the subject of redundancy and they had further disregarded the administrative circular issued by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, dated 31st August, 1971. For these reasons they asked that these employees should be reinstated with full benefits.

The Respondents submitted that they were faced with a crisis and had to take emergency measures in order to remain financially viable and since the four employees concerned had found alternative employment in Mombasa the Claimants' demand should be rejected.

The Court is satisfied that the Respondents did not abide by the procedure laid down by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, for cases of redundancy. Further the Respondents in contravention of section 9 (a) (6) of the Trade Disputes (Amendment) Act, 1971, have declared their employees redundant without the approval of the Industrial Court. Section 9 (a) (6) reads as follows—

"(6) All cases of redundancy shall be subject to the approval of the Industrial Court."

The Permanent Secretary's circular referred to hereinbefore lays down the following procedure—

"(a) Where there is an intended redundancy the employer should consult the appropriate Union (this is provided in the majority of terms and conditions of service agreements);

(b) Where agreement is reached between the employer and the Union, it is only necessary to report the agreement to this Ministry;

(c) Where no agreement is reached between the employer and the Union at their level the matter should be referred to this Ministry for conciliation with a view to voluntary agreement being reached;

(d) Where conciliation results in no agreement, the matter shall be referred by the Ministry to the Industrial Court."

The Court would like to emphasize for the benefit of the employers generally that they should strictly comply with the procedure laid down by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, in cases of redundancy prior to seeking the approval of the Industrial Court to such cases as laid down in the statute.

The Court has no doubt that it is appreciated by everyone in Kenya that the loss of employment suffered by anyone is indeed a very serious matter hence the necessary statutory provisions have been enacted on the subject to ensure that when workers' services are going to be terminated due to redundancy then the employer has to satisfy the union concerned and finally the Industrial Court before it can effect termination.

The Court appreciates the difficulties which some employers have encountered when faced with the unpleasant prospect of declaring some of their employees redundant but the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, keeping in view all the difficulties has amended his circular dated 31st August, 1971 and replaced it with another set of directives dated 20th December, 1973, which should go a long way in helping to resolve speedily and satisfactorily this most sensitive issue of redundancy.

In the present case, after careful consideration of all the submissions, the Court finds that the Respondents have committed a breach of the statutory provisions and have also not complied with the procedure specified by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, at the material time. The Court has taken note of the fact that these four employees have already secured alternative employment in Mombasa although they remained unemployed for a period of time. Therefore the question of reinstatement does not arise.

But since these four employees have suffered wrongful termination as they were declared redundant without the approval of the Industrial Court, the Court awards that each one of them be paid three months' salary by way of compensation. This compensation would be in addition to the other terminal benefits to which they are entitled under the agreed clause on redundancy.

2. Housing allowance

The Claimants withdrew this demand during the hearing stating that they would pursue it afresh with the Respondents.

Issue in dispute:—

Union recognition.

1. The Transport and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Auto Accessories and Tools Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 3rd day of October, 1974 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 10th May, 1974, was received by the Court on 24th July along with the statutory certificates signed by the Labour Commissioner in accordance with section 9 (9) (e) of the Trade Disputes Act.

It is not disputed that the Respondents are a firm engaged in the wholesale and retail trade of motor spare parts. The relevant certificates under the Trade Licensing Act 1967 were produced during the hearing.

At present the Respondents are paying their employees wages and fringe benefits as specified in the Regulations of Wages (Wholesale and Retail Distributive Trades Order).

The Claimants enrolled some 30 employees of the Respondents into their membership sometime in August 1972 and approached the Respondents for recognition in order to enable them to represent their members with a view to improving their wages and terms and conditions of employment. The Respondents rejected the idea on the ground that they were not in the transport industry but part of the wholesale and retail trade.

The Claimants reported a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour first to the Permanent Secretary on 23rd August, 1972 and subsequently in order to rectify the error they reported a dispute to the Minister for Labour on 18th July, 1973, on the issue as stated hereinabove.

After the report of the trade dispute in August 1972 the matter was referred to the Senior Labour Officer, Nairobi for necessary assistance and accordingly after the Senior Labour Officer had made inquiries he wrote to the Claimants on 24th October, 1972, informing them that his investigation had revealed that the Respondents are engaged in wholesale and retail trade of piece goods only and he asked the Claimants to clarify their intent in recruiting the Respondents' employees into their membership.

Thereafter, the Industrial Relations Assistant to the Senior Labour Officer took charge of the dispute and after meeting the parties ruled that the Respondents should continue deducting union dues from the wages of their employees for payment to the Claimants but the Respondents should not recognize the Claimants until such time that their employees can be organized by the appropriate union. The Claimants did not accept this ruling and the matter is before the Court now.

The Claimants rely on rule 4 (a) of their constitution, particularly "allied". For ease of reference the said rule reads as follows—

"Any workman in the Transport and Allied Industry irrespective of sex, creed, race or colour, who is 16 years of age can become a member of the Union, provided that he shall not be enrolled as a member unless he has filled up the application for membership and the same is accepted by the Executive Committee of the Union".

The Claimants further submitted that the business being carried on by the Respondents is that of motor spare part dealer and that such an undertaking falls under Transport and Allied Trades. Further since they had recruited the Respondents' employees into their membership in August 1972, no other union had ever claimed the right to represent the said employees. The employees were still contributing members of the Claimants' union.

The Claimants produced to the Court two collective agreements which they had entered into with two firms involved in the same type of business as the Respondents. These firms are Nairobi Cycle Mart and Auto Electric Services Ltd.

The Claimants asked the Court to award that the Respondents should recognize them as otherwise the Respondents would continue to exploit their employees by paying them low level of wages and fringe benefits.

The Respondents have strongly resisted the Claimants' demand on the ground that they are part of the wholesale and retail trade and not of road transport and that the Claimants had collected contributions from their employees without any legal right or claim. They further argued that the Claimants' demand for recognition was misconceived and irregular and no dispute was in existence in law between them.

The Respondents contended that the membership of their employees in the wrong union could not *ipso facto* bind them to recognize the said union.

After careful consideration of all the submissions, the Court has come to the conclusion that to give an award as demanded by the Claimants would be creating a highly controversial and undesirable precedent as it would be quite contrary to the industrial relations set up which has developed over the years in Kenya. It is immaterial whether or not the appropriate union catering for the type of trade in which the Respondents indulge is objecting to the Claimants' demand or not. It is simply a matter of principle as any award has got to be not only consistent with the present practice but it should also uphold it.

The Court notes that out of very many motor spare part dealers in the country the Claimants have managed to recognize only two of them but one of these firms at one time also operated a petrol station.

In view of the relevant Wages Council Order which is applicable to the Respondents' undertaking as confirmed by the Senior Labour Officer, Nairobi, and the latest General Order which is effective from 1st September, 1974, the allegation of exploitation of workers against the Respondents is considerably toned down.

The Court after having given anxious thought to the parties' submissions and the principles at stake has come to the conclusion that the Claimants' demand should be rejected.

Issue in dispute.—Wrongful termination of Mr. A. W. Karumba.

1. The Kenya Management Staff Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Kenya Meat Commission shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 7th and 8th day of October, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The following witnesses were called by the parties to give evidence in Court:—

Claimants.—A. W. Karumba.

Respondents.—Hassan Ibrahim, G. Silla, E. Wanjohi and I. Nyarega.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 28th May, 1974, was received by the Court on 1st August along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Mr. A. W. Karumba was employed by the Respondents as a Factory Personnel Officer at their Athi River factory on 12th November, 1971, at a salary of £1,570 p.a. plus free housing and fringe benefits.

On 31st March, 1972, he was demoted to the post of Personnel Assistant and on 1st November, 1972, he was reappointed as Factory Personnel Officer.

On 17th December, 1973, his services were terminated and he was paid a sum of Sh. 5,204/25 which included one month's pay in lieu of notice.

His services were terminated for various reasons which will be gone into hereinafter but the immediate cause was his alleged disgraceful behaviour in the Camp Social Hall where he was involved in an incident with two women one of whom is employed in the factory at Athi River. The Claimants took up the matter on his behalf and the matter ended up at the Ministry of Labour whereupon an Investigator was appointed who after conducting an investigation recommended that the Respondents had failed to prove the very serious allegations which they had made against Mr. Karumba but in view of the fact that the Respondents had no confidence in him, he found that reinstatement would not serve any useful purpose and suggested that he be paid two months' additional pay for wrongful termination of service.

The Claimants have relied largely on the findings and recommendations of the Investigator but have asked for Mr. Karumba's reinstatement with full benefits. In fact the Claimants' written submission is no more than a reproduction of the Investigator's report.

The Respondents having rejected the Investigator's suggested compromise and the Claimants' insistence on his reinstatement has brought the parties to the Court.

The allegations which were highlighted leading to Mr. Karumba's termination of services are mainly the following:—

(a) He was not medically fit as he had suffered from high blood pressure and although it may have subsided the tendency still remained.

(b) His knowledge of written English was so poor that he had to enlist the assistance of a clerk who was working under him to correspond on his behalf and it was alleged that when the clerk went on leave no work was done in Mr. Karumba's department, in fact there was a total lack of communication.

(c) Mr. Karumba had abused his position of being the Chairman of the Housing Committee in that he had solicited bribes from employees before allocating them the company houses and further he is alleged to have tampered with the lists which were prepared by the Housing Committee for the allocation of the houses by substituting the names of other employees in place of the ones who had been allocated houses by the Housing Committee.

(d) His conduct and behaviour towards his subordinates was of such a nature that it led to a complete loss of confidence of his subordinates in him. In this regard details were given of his behaviour when he was entrusted with some cash money to pay for the lunches of a group of employees who visited the Nairobi Show last year under the care of Mr. Karumba. It is alleged that Mr. Karumba utilized the sum of Sh. 140, the amount he was to spend for the lunches, in drinking himself with the result that the employees had to spend their own funds. Later on when Mr. Karumba had agreed to spend this money for securing their admission into the arena he had again disappeared and was next seen in a state of drunkenness in the company bus somewhere around midnight.

(e) A serious allegation against Mr. Karumba was his involvement in an incident when he had gone to the Senior Officers Club at Athi River with a female friend and had ordered a chicken to be roasted. While he was waiting at the Club with his friend another lady called Wambui who it is alleged was Mr. Karumba's girl friend, came and found him with his other girl friend. An argument developed over the situation and Mr. Karumba tried to run away through the kitchen followed by both the ladies. Wambui caught him as he was running in the kitchen and in the scuffle Mr. Karumba was thrown into the bucket which contained chicken blood and feathers.

The parties called their witnesses and the Court had the chance of hearing their evidence on oath. The Court was very much impressed by the evidence of Mr. Isaac Nyarega who is the Assistant Factory Manager at Athi River since last two years having served the Respondents for eight years. He told the Court that he knew Mr. Karumba well as for the purposes of day-to-day running of affairs Mr. Karumba was directly under him. Mr. Karumba also used to work directly under him on the Joint Industrial Council where Mr. Nyarega is Chairman. Mr. Karumba had been given the responsibility of being the Chairman of the Housing Committee.

Mr. Nyarega explained to the Court how he started getting complaints from various employees that company houses were being unfairly allocated and went on to state that Mr. Karumba was tampering with the allocation lists as approved by the

Housing Committee. All this had resulted in compelling Mr. Nyarega to suspend the whole Housing Committee and appoint a Caretaker Committee in its place. He went as far as to say that Mr. Karumba was not trustworthy.

Mr. Nyarega also related the incident involving Mr. Karumba and the two ladies referred to hereinabove and added that he was the one who separated Wambui and Mr. Karumba who emerged from the bucket with blood and feathers sticking all over his face.

The Court must say that it has not attached much importance to Mr. Hassan Ibrahim's evidence who is alleged to have given a certain sum of money by way of "tea" to Mr. Karumba for allocating a house to him when he came to Nairobi on transfer from Nakuru. The Court feels that this man's conduct was not above board and his evidence cannot be relied upon.

The Court has no hesitation in accepting the evidence of Mr. J. Silla who related the incidents concerning Mr. Karumba and his conduct at the Nairobi Show last year when he was in charge of a party of employees and how he squandered Sh. 140 entrusted to him for their lunch on his own drinking spree. Mr. Silla's evidence despite a few minor discrepancies was truthful.

The Court has not placed much emphasis on the Respondents' allegation against Mr. Karumba regarding his health because when he was engaged they were told that he suffered from high blood pressure but in due course he was cured after undergoing medical treatment. In any case the Respondents did engage him despite his high blood pressure tendency so they cannot hold this against him now.

Another interesting feature of this dispute is that Mr. Karumba was so inefficient that he was demoted on 31st March, 1972, yet when his old post of Factory Personnel Manager became vacant the Respondents reappointed him on that post on 1st November, 1972. When the Court asked the Respondents about this rather strange development which was inconsistent to the allegations of inefficiency against Mr. Karumba the Respondents gave a vague hint which indicated to the Court that there was some sort of "brotherization" going on in the Respondents' factory at Athi River as far as Mr. Karumba was concerned. In any case Mr. Nyarega quite candidly admitted that despite Mr. Karumba's obvious inefficiency and lack of proficiency of English language it was expected that because of his trade union background he would be of some assistance in handling industrial relations matters at the factory but even in this he had proved to be a failure.

The Court must express its views on the investigation report because if the Respondents did produce all the evidence which they produced in Court to the Investigator then the Investigator's findings and recommendations are clearly wrong and not based on facts.

The Court has given due consideration to the Claimants' submissions that Mr. Karumba had been employed by the Respondents after they had been fully satisfied as to his efficiency and capability and that he was the person who met with their requirements. Further that during the three years of Mr. Karumba's service he had not been warned even once about his poor performance, poor health or any other complaints against him.

The Court notes that Mr. Nyarega stated that he had verbally warned Mr. Karumba on a number of occasions about his various failings in his duties and when it is borne in mind that there is no collective agreement in existence between the parties the Court finds that such verbal warnings are sufficient.

The Court finds that the allegations against Mr. Karumba regarding his activities on the Housing Committee and abuse of power that he indulged in as specified by Mr. Nyarega in his evidence are in itself sufficient reason to merit his termination of employment but there are two other very serious allegations against him regarding his conduct and behaviour at the Nairobi Show and his involvement with two females, one employed at the Athi River factory, which resulted in his getting dipped in a bucket full of feathers and blood in front of his colleagues and subordinates. The Court finds that this sort of behaviour is most unbecoming of a senior officer in any undertaking.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that Mr. Karumba's services were terminated justifiably and properly and the Court accordingly rejects the Claimants' demand.

1. The Kenya Game Hunting and Safari Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Game Ranch Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 16th day of October, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 16th July, 1974, was received by the Court on 3rd September along with the statutory certificate from the Labour Commissioner in accordance with section 9.(9) (e) of the Trade Disputes Act.

In this dispute the Claimants are demanding recognition from the Respondents to represent the Respondents' employees for the purpose of collective bargaining.

The demand dates back to 1970 when the then Respondents' employees were fully paid up members of the Claimants and a check off system was in full operation. At one stage the Respondents recognized the Claimants at the shop steward level and when in due course the Claimants forwarded a recognition agreement to the Respondents for execution the Respondents raised certain objections primarily to certain clauses contained therein giving the Claimants the right of a closed shop system. This was on 24th August, 1971, when out of the Respondents' ten employees nine of them belonged to the Claimants and the Respondents were operating a check off system and remitting the funds to them.

The Claimants agreed to amend the recognition agreement by deleting the clause relating to closed shop system but the Respondents shifted their stand and wanted proof from the Claimants that their employees were in fact the Claimants' members.

With the consent of the parties, the Court perused the relevant Ministry of Labour file and is satisfied that to a large extent what the Claimants put forward during the hearing was true.

At the present time the Respondents' employees did not appear to be the Claimants' members and from the Conciliator's report to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, dated 24th July, 1974, the Court finds that these employees since their resignation from the Claimants' membership are very unhappy due to the fact that they are without any union representation.

The Claimants produced a document dated 2nd August, 1970, in respect of their contention that the Respondents' employees were their members. As against that the Respondents put in several letters of resignation all written in early 1974 in support of their contention that the Claimants did not enjoy the membership of their employees.

There seems to be little doubt that the Claimants are the proper union to cater for the interest of the Respondents' employees and the Respondents while submitting that this was a borderline case between the Claimants and the Agricultural Workers' Union made it clear that there was no demarcation dispute.

The Conciliator's report to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, states that when the Respondents' employees were interviewed, with the consent of both parties, by him, they stated that they wished to rejoin the Claimants provided they are assured of effective union representation this time.

The Conciliator also confirmed what the Claimants submitted in Court that their members had been subject to undue influence and threats of dismissal from the Respondents before resigning from the Claimants' membership.

After careful consideration of all these submissions the Court awards that the Claimants are the proper union that should be recognized by the Respondents to look after the interests of their employees. However, in view of the contradictory submissions made by the parties on whether or not the Respondents' employees are the Claimants' members, the Court directs that the Labour Officer, Nanyuki, should interview the present unionizable employees in the Respondents' employment and ascertain from them whether or not they wish to join the Claimants. He should carry out his investigations in the presence of one representative each from the parties within 30 days of the date of the Court award. In the event of more than 50 per cent of the employees opting for the Claimants' membership the Court awards that the parties should enter into a proper recognition agreement based on the model appearing as an appendix to the Industrial Relations Charter.
