Applicants should have been educated up to East African Certificate of Education level or equivalent and hold a Final Proficiency Certificate or a Grade I Trade Test Certificate in a relevant trade, and have at least three years' experience in the maintenance of mechanical services in buildings such as hospitals.

Duties will include practical instruction and demonstration of work involved with Mechanical Building Service.

Assistant Instructor (Construction Plant Mechanic) (Two Posts)

system in conformity with plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act, if default shall be made in the performance or observation of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right or action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner of Lands in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they are/is unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised:

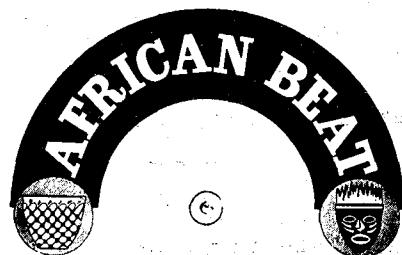

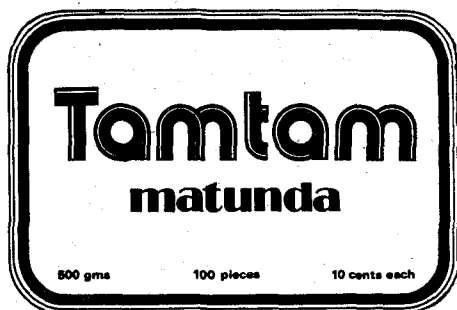

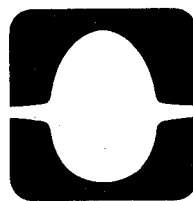
