1. The Kenya Engineering Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Engineering & Allied Industries Employers Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 28th day of November, 1979 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 7th June, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 31st July together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties had appeared before the Court in Cause No. 25 of 1977 on 19 issues and after the Court had made an award they entered into a collective agreement effective from 1st September, 1976 with the duration of two years expiring on 31st August, 1978.

The Claimants merely intimated to the Respondents on 30th June, 1978 of their intention to revise this collective agreement and did not forward their detailed demands until 12th September, 1978. Thereafter negotiations dragged on and the parties narrowed the issues in dispute from 19 to 9 and the matter is now before the Court.

This dispute involves 6,000 permanent employees and 2,000 casual workers employed in the engineering industry, i.e. by the Respondents' 30 member companies. They are the major engineering firms in the country. The Court notes that they have taken on the 10 per cent additional labour in accordance with the Presidential directive.

Not surprisingly, by far the most important issues in this dispute are the ones concerning general wage increase, minimum wages and house allowance. The Claimants have demanded a general wage increase of 20 per cent per year or 40 per cent wage increase for a two year agreement. This implies that the Respondents' average total monthly wage bill of about K.Sh. 4,890,000 will go up by K.Sh. 978,000. In addition the Claimants' demand on housing of K.Sh. 400 would cause the total monthly wage bill to rise by K.Sh. 2,400,000 or 49 per cent, although the Respondents have maintained their stand against deconsolidation of wages. The total wage increase and house allowance adds up to about K.Sh. 3,378,000 or 69 per cent p.m. which is obviously above the indicated compensation ceilings under the Guidelines.

The Respondents on the other hand have offered an increase of K.Sh. 37.86 p.m. for each year applicable to all grades on the basis of a consolidated wage. They have asked the Court that the workers should be compensated in accordance with the wages Guidelines for the period between 1st June, 1977 and 31st August, 1978 and further that the increase for 1979 should be in accordance with the 1979 Guidelines. This would indicate the increase to be K.Sh. 31.75 but they had offered K.Sh. 37.86 in an effort to reach an agreement.

The Court would like to point out that when it made the award in Cause No. 25/77 it had taken into consideration the cost of living increases up to May 1977 and the Court has therefore to determine what is the workers' entitlement as a result of the changes in the cost of living between June 1977 and August 1978. The E.P.D. have worked out the percentage increase at an average of 14 per cent for this period two thirds of which would be 13.2 per cent giving an acceptable annual wage increase of 6.6 per cent. The Court would like to draw the Respondents' attention to the following paragraph which appears on page 7 of its award in Cause No. 25/77:

"The Court feels that there is some merit in the Claimants' argument that the increases which were granted to them under the 1974 agreement and to some extent also on 1st September, 1975 were meant to compensate them for the loss of purchasing power for the period before September 1974 and therefore should not be taken into account to determine the scope for wages and salaries increases in this dispute."

1. General wage increase
2. Minimum wages
3. House allowance

After carefully considering all the arguments and submissions the Court has decided to give the workers the benefit of the 1978 Guidelines in this dispute and further the Court has decided to round off the workers' wage entitlement of 6.6 per cent per year to 7 per cent per year. The Court accordingly awards that all the unionisable employees working for the Respondents should get a wage increase of 7 per cent with effect from 1st September, 1978. The Court further awards that the resultant wage should go up by another 7 per cent with effect from 1st September, 1979.

The minimum wages for the various grades should also go up by the aforesaid increases.

On the issue of house allowance the Court had decided to make this award on the basis of consolidated wages and the Claimants' demand on this issue is therefore rejected.

3. Temporary transfer

The Claimants have demanded that the temporary transfer allowance of K.Sh. 300 should be increased to K.Sh. 450 and the Respondents have offered an increase of K.Sh. 18 only.

The Court awards that the temporary transfer allowance of K.Sh. 300 p.m. should be increased to K.Sh. 350. All other conditions relating to it should remain as at present.

4. Annual paid leave

The Court had made an award on this issue in 1977 and finds that as against the Claimants' demand of 29 consecutive days for all employees the Respondents offer of 28 consecutive days for all employees excluding gazetted public holidays to be quite reasonable under the circumstances. The Court accordingly awards that all Respondents' employees should get an annual leave of 28 days consecutive days excluding gazetted public holidays.

5. Transport for employees

The Court has decided to reject the Claimants' demand on this issue but would like to add that those of the Respondents' members who provide night transport to their shift employees should continue to do so.

6. Tools

The Court feels that the workers are entitled to a tool kit maintenance allowance and accordingly awards that the Respondents should pay a tool kit maintenance allowance of K.Sh. 15 p.m. for those artisans of grade III and above who are required to provide their own tool kits.

7. Safari allowance

The Court awards that the safari allowances should be increased to the following figures:

All other conditions to remain as at present.

The Court rejects the Claimants' demand for a luncheon allowance for employees who work on sites and do not go home for lunch.

9. Effective date and duration

The Court awards that the effective date should be 1st September, 1978 and the duration period should be two years from that date.

- (3) *Bill Supplement* contains Bills which are for introduction into the National Assembly only.
- (4) *Act Supplement* contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:-

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.
