MINISTRY OF WATER DEVELOPMENT

CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE GRANTING OF SUBSIDIES FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF STORAGE DAMS

IT IS notified for general information that, with the object of encouraging the development of the water resources of Kenya for agricultural purposes of all kinds by the construction of storage dam, the Government has agreed that the terms and conditions set out in this notice shall govern the grant in all cases of subsidies for dam construction with effect from the date of publication of this notice.

1. For the purpose of these conditions-

"Permanent Secretary" means the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Water Development, or a person deputed by him either generally or for a particular purpose;

"approved" means approved by the Permanent Secretary;

"assessed cost" means the total cost of construction of the dam as estimated by the Permanent Secretary. The estimate shall be based on the Dam Construction Units rates if the works are executed by a Government D.C.V. and or the prevailing contract rates if the works are to be executed by a contractor. It shall include the cost of site preparation and foundations, provision of control sluices and spillway and other necessary ancilliary works but not the provision of any pumping apparatus;

"dam" means a structure built across a depression, or a tank excavated below ground level, for impounding and storing surface and sub-surface water and includes the ancilliary works needed to dispose of flood water, and the conduits and controls necessary for the release of water;

"dam construction unit" means a mechanical dam construction unit financed from public funds;

"farmer" means any member (including body corporate) of community engaged in farming an agricultural holding of not less than five acres.

2. Farmers and local government authorities may apply for a subsidy for the construction of a dam intended for the conservation of wate: for agricultural, livestock, fish culture and domestic purposes. Application (which normally should be accompanied by an application for a water permit) shall be on Form W.A.B. 409 and should be submitted to the Water Bailiff of the area concerned. It should be noted that the procedure for the granting of water permit by the Water Apportionment Board usually takes not less than four months to complete but examination of the application for subsidy shall be undertaken concurrently.

3. Each application for a subsidy shall be in respect of one dam only and shall be accompanied by a non-refundable fee of K.Sh. 1,000 to cover, in part, the cost of the technical examination of the application, except in the case of a group application by one applicant under Condition 4 of these Conditions.

4. Where an individual applicant wishes to construct more than one dam in the same river, water course or depression and the works are to be undertaken as one continuous operation, then all the dams in the group are to be detailed on the application for subsidy and only one fee will be payable.

The term "individual applicati" in this context will include a co-operative society to construct dams paid for out of its own financial resources, but will not include a co-operative society acting as representative of a group of farmers who will pay for the dams themselves. A single group application may be submitted by a group of farmers or local authorities, or by the authorized representative of such a group, for a scheme involving the construction of a group of dams in the same river, water-course or depression where at least one dam of group is to be situated either wholly or partially on the holding of each party of the application. In the case of a group application, whether submitted by the group or by its authorized representative, the stipulated fee shall be payable in respect of each party to the application.

Where a group application has been made the provision of clause 5 to 18 of these conditions inclusive will be deemed to apply to a group of dams wherever "dam" is mentioned.

Group applications are designed expressly to enacourage the development of holdings where for hydrological or other good reasons a system of dams which are individually too small to merit subsidy payments is to be preferred to one or more large dams, for this reason no group application will be considered where the assessed cost of more than one dam in the group is less than K.Sh. 50,000.

5. No subsidy is payable in the following cases :

- (a) Where no water permit or sanction has been granted for the construction of the dam.
- (b) Where it is found that construction on a dam has commenced prior to the approval of the application for subsidy.
- (c) Where the construction of the dam is to financed in whole or in part, by direct grant from Central Government.
- (d) Where the total assessed cost of the dam does not exceed K.Sh. 50,000.
- (e) Where an applicant has not discharged his liabilities to Government in respect of work carried out previously on his behalf by a Dam Construction Unit.

6. Before approving an application for subsidy, the Permanent Secretary shall satisfy himself that-

- (a) the appropriate District Agricultural Committee has certified that the dam is necessary for the full economic development of the agricultural holding to which the application relates, having regard to the existing water resources of that holding;
- (b) the catchment area and runoff are adequate to fill the dam regularly;

(c) the design of the dam is sound and its capacity adequate;
(d) construction of the dam has been authorized in writing by the Water Apportionment Board;

(e) the provisions of the Water Act (Cap. 372), and all rules thereunder have been complied with.

7. If the Permanent Secretary approves the application for subsidy, he shall inform the applicant of the amount of the subsidy to be paid, and assessed cost on which it is based.

8. The opproval of a subsidy shall be valid for a period of one year. An extension of the period of validity of the approval will normally be granted if works are still in progress, provided they proceed continuously to completion. If works have not commenced within the year of validity, a new application will have to made.

9. The Permanent Secretary may require certain additional works which, in his opinion, are necessary for the proper security of the dam to be done before payment of sudsidy.

10. Payment of subsidy will be made only after the work has been completed to the satisfaction of the Permanent Secretary who shall have the right to inspect the site at any time before and after construction in order to check the dimensions, workmanship, or any other matter related to the construction of the dam.

11. The subsidy payable on a completed dam shall be 40 per cent of the assessed cost of the dam but shall not exceed K.Sh. 500,000.

Provided that-

- (i) the amount of any subsidy shall be so adjusted as to ensure that the assessed cost of the dam less the subsidy shall not fall below K.Sh. 50,000;
- (ii) the subsidy payable shall not exceed the sum which be paid if the actual final total cost of construction and not the assessed cost of the dam, were taken as the basis of calculation for subsidy;
- (iii) if during the course of the works increased costs or unforseen difficulties occur, the subsidy payable may be increased at the discretion of the Permanent Secretary for Water Development.

12. The Permanent Secretary may as a condition of payment of a subsidy, require the applicant to permit the installation of a staff gauge and rain gauge at the dam and to make reading of rainfall and water levels at such intervals and over such period as may be directed by him. The gauges will be supplied and installed by the Permanent Secretary free of charge; and will remain the property of the Government.

13. Where a Dam Construction Unit is used for the construction of the dam, the account shall show the full amount payable, and the subsidy, if any, shall be shown as a deduction, allowable only if the account is fully paid within three months. If payment is not made within three months or such other longer period as the appropriate Accounting Officer may in his absolute discretion specify, the cost of the dam shall be payable in full by the applicant, and no subsidy shall be payable or allowable by the Government.

14. Where a contractor is employed for the construction of a dam, he must be a linced dam contractor under section 89 of the Water Act (Cap. 372).

15. No liability whatever shall attach to the Government for any damage or loss of whatsoever nature arising thereof or in

any way attributable to the design or construction if any dam in respect of which an application for subsidy has been made, and the applicant for or the recipient of any subsidy shall at all times keep the Government and any servant of the Government effectually indemnified against all actions, clams, losses and expenses whatsoever arising out of any way attributable to anything done or omitted to be done by the Government or any servant of the Government in connexion with the design or construction of any such dam.

16. If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever shall arise in connexion with or out of these Conditions or the carring out of any works in pursuance of these Conditions, it shall be settled by the Permanent Secretary those decision shall be final and conclusive:

Provided that this clause shall not apply to matters relating to an application for an increased dam subsidy in accordance with clause 12, or any application for extension of payment period specified in clause 14 of these Conditions.

17. Nothing in these Conditions shall bind the Government to approve the granting of subsidy in any particular case.

Issue in dispute:

Parlies:

Wages general increment.

1. The Transport & Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Bhaijee Transport Co. Ltd. and Victory Garage shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 5th June, 1980 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

Award

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 21st January, 1980 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 10th April together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute has arisen during the parties' revision of the collective agreement between them effective from May, 1977 to April, 1979. The parties were deadlocked on the general increase to be granted to the Respondents' employees.

During conciliation the parties agreed that the minimum wage rates as laid down in the previous agreement were to demanded an increase of 15 per cent for the first and second year with the Respondents offering 2 per cent for the first and second year.

The Court notes that the parties are agreed that the new collective agreement will be backdated to 1st May, 1979 and would remain in force for a period of two years.

During the hearing the Claimants submitted that their original demand of 15 per cent had since been overtaken by events mainly because of the increase in the cost of living necessitated by the shortage of the essential foodstuffs and they had therefore decided to ask the Court to award a general wage increase of 25.4 per cent to be divided as follows-

"1.5.79 to 30.4.1980-12.7 per cent.

1.5.80 to 30.4.1981-12.7 per cent (plus 2.3 per cent =15 per cent to take care of the eventualities).

or

A full compensation of 27.7 per cent."

The Respondents on the other hand while submitting that their main source of income which was from Bamburi Portland Cement had increased by K.Sh 3 per ton in April, 1980 they had had to bear all other increases in spare parts, fuel, cost of maintenance and rates of licence fees. Further they had to compete with a number of general transporters whose employees were not represented by any trade union.

They also referred to their state of finances in support of their contention that they were still trying to pay off the loss which had been brought over from the previous years.

In this dispute it is really not necessary to make a finding on the Claimants' contention that there are 43 employees working for the Respondents as opposed to the Respondents' claim that they had a workforce of 28 employees only. The simple fact is that whatever the Court awards it will benefit all those of the Respondents' employees who are unionisable and whose names appear on their muster roll. The Court has to decide what the workers' entitlement under the Guidelines is and whether or not they should fully get it under the circumstances of this dispute. The Employment Promotion Division report shows the following movement in the Nairobi and Mombasa cost of living indices-

The workers are also entitled to GD per capita increases for 1977/78 which are estimated at 3.8 per cent and 2 per cent respectively as a productivity measure. This brings the compensation under the Guidelines to be about 18.4 per cent for the lower income group and 12.4 for the middle income group.

The Court would like to point out that the Guidelines allow compensation up to the maximum rise in the cost of living as may be determined by the Court for employees in the lower income group.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion that it cannot accept the Respondents' offer of 5 per cent wage increase per year because the Court finds that the Respondents have failed to produce any convincing arguments as to why the workers should not get their full entitlement under the Guidelines. The Court has taken into consideration the Respondents' plea re their finances but has come to the conclusion that they can afford to give the workers their entitlement under the Guidelines. The Court accordingly awards that the drivers, mechanics and the clerk should get a wage increase of 6.2 with effect from 1st May, 1979. The Court also awards that the turnboys, tyremen and the watchman should get a wage increase of 9.2 per cent with effect from 1st May, 1979. The Court further awards that another wage increase of 6.2 per cent and 9.2 per cent as stated above should be granted with effect from 1st May, 1980.


