THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE NO. 11 OF 1980

Parties:

Kenya Chemical Workers' Union and

Kenya Industrial Plastics Ltd.

Issue in dispute:

Dismissal/termination of service of Kidiga, Ashisero and Maina

- 1. The Kenya Chemical Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimans and Kenya Industrial Plastics Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 30th June and 1st July, 1980 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 2nd January, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 4th March, 1980 together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The three employees involved in this dispute started working for the Respondents as follows:

Mr. S. Ashisero: in 1976 as a machine operator later transferred to the duties of storekeeper.

Mr. J. Maina: in 1976 to assist the above in the store.

Mr. I. Kidiga: in 1971 as a stores clerk.

All three of them were arrested on 21st November, 1977 when it was alleged that the general manager at the time, Mr. Brochstein, being suspicious of a package which was to be delivered got it opened and found that there were 82 extra cups and 78 saucers. He called the police.

All three of them were charged with theft by servant but were aquitted by the criminal court on 14th March, 1978.

The Claimants are fighting for their reinstatement without loss of any pay for all the time that they have been out of employment.

The dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour and the following findings and recommendation were conveyed to the parties on 7th September, 1979—

"During the investigation Kidiga was interviewed stated that his duties included issuing invoices and delivery notes against the requisition orders. On the day in question he issued a delivery note before the goods were loaded for delivery. The general manager made a spot check and found an excess of 52 plastic cups and 72 saucers—these were witnessed by Kidiga who was summoned by the general manager. For quite some time the management had been suspecting there was a conspiracy to steal company goods by employees and this was proved on 21st November, 1977. Surprisingly when the matter went to Court the three were acquitted because of lack of evidence although the management felt that there was ample evidence to convict the three employees. The union on the other hand is banking on the fact that the accused were acquitted and therefore were innocent.

"In his testimony Kidiga conceded to the fact that there was an excess when the general manager made a surprise check before the delivery was made. It is rather difficult to believe that such a large excess was as a result of oversight. This is so because the other two employees packed the said items which omitted the excess. It is my considered view that although the three were acquitted for lack of evidence it would appear the employees had the intention of defrauding the employers.

"In view of the doubt cast by the acquittal I would recommend that the dismissal be reduced to normal termination so that the employees can be paid their terminal benefits as stipulated in the parties' collective agreement."

The Claimants rejected the Ministry's findings and recommendation and have strongly argued that their members having been cleared by a competent court of law they should not be punished by the employer for the alleged theft and they were entitled to be reinstated to their former jobs. The Respondents on the other hand have pleaded that notwithstanding the acquittal in hte criminal case they were satisfied as to the dishonesty of the workers involved and maintained that the Industrial Court should come to a decision on balance of probability unlike the criminal court where the guilt of the accused has to be proved beyond every reasonable doubt.

The Claimants submitted that after the arrest of these persons on 21st November, 1977 they were released on bond on 23rd November, 1977 and they reported for duty on 24th when the Respondents refused to let them work.

Once again the Court is confronted with a situation where it is claimed on behalf of the Respondents that they dismissed the employees concerned verbally. The Court was told that the general manager after catching them red-handed summarily dismissed them on the same day. The Claimants on the other had vigorously argued that this is an afterthought on the part of the Respondents because when they approached them after the acquittal of their members for their reinstatement it was only then that in reply to one of their letters that the Respondents on 3rd May, 1978 claimed that their services had been terminated verbally on 21st November, 1977.

As far as the reporting for work on 24th November, by these three employees is concerned the Court can only say that it was indeed presumptuous on their part to expect to continue working while they were facing a charge of theft at the behest of their employer. The Court, however, does not believe in the absence of any evidence produced by the Respondents that the services of these three persons were terminated on 21st November, 1977. In all probability the Respondents, according to them, having caught them red-handed in the act of stealing did not expect them to be acquitted and therefore took no steps whatsoever to terminate their services.

It is common knowledge that criminal trials take a couple of months before they are finalized and it is therefore very much in the interest of the employers that they have to take a firm decision at the time of an incident either to terminate the services of the employees involved irrespective of the outcome or to wait for the verdict of the criminal court before making a decision. In this case the Court is inclined to believe that the Respondents took no action to terminate their services because they did not expect them back.

In these circumstances the Court finds that these three persons continued to be in the Respondents' employment until 3rd May, 1978 when the Respondents informed the Claimants that they had terminated their services. The Court finds that the Claimants have a point that it was an after thought on the part of the Respondents to say that they had verbally dismissed them on 21st November, 1977.

Irrespective of the outcome of the criminal case which resulted in the acquittal of these three persons the Court finds that, if nothing else, they exhibited a great amount of negligence in that they were supplying goods to a customer far in excess of an order. The Court cannot accept that the inclusion of extra 82 cups and 78 saucers was an oversight. This sort of negligence is sufficient for an employer to lose confidence in the employees concerned. The Court has no doubt that they deserved termination but as pointed out above the Court finds that their services were terminated on 3rd May, 1978 and not 21st November, 1977.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that the Respondents should pay all these three persons their salaries from 21st November, 1977 to May, 1978.

Termination of appointment of W. J. Sikinvi

- 1. The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Mombasa Municipal Commission shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 2nd August, 1979 and 31st March and 28th May, 1980 and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Claimants also called W. J. Sikinyi to give evidence on oath:

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 7th February, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 26th March, 1979 together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The case was originally fixed for hearing on 4th July, 1979 and at the parties' request it was adjourned to 2nd August, 1979 on which date the Claimants applied for the dispute to be stood over as they could not trace Mr. Sikinyi. On 10th March, 1980 the Claimants applied to the Court to fix a hearing date of this dispute.

The Minister for Local Government at the time (hereinafter referred to as the Minister) appointed Messrs. James Omollo Kayila and Romesh Chander Kapoor to conduct investigations into the general administration and financial management of the then Mombasa Municipal Council. He did this on 27th August, 1975 in exercise of powers conferred upon him under regulation 245 of the Local Government Regulations 1963.

The Inspectors carried out their work and presented their report to the Minister. This report is privileged under section 131 of the Evidence Act and is a secret document.

On receipt of this report the Minister invoked the powers conferred by section 252 of the Local Government Act and removed the members of the Mombasa Municipal Council. He appointed a Commission to run the affairs of the Council in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Local Government (Mombasa Municipal Commission) Order, 1976. The Minister also issued certain directions under regulation 248 of Local Government Regulations 1963 which directions were marked secret and included among other things the following paragraphs:

"And whereas I am satisfied that the inefficient and wasteful administration is attributed to the conduct of the Councillors, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer and other section heads serving under the Municipality;"

"(2) The Commission terminates the services of any staff who have been found in the report to be inefficient, negligent, and/or unproductive or have reached their retirement age or are considered excess and unnecessary."

Since the Respondents relied on the inspectors' report which they made to the Minister the Claimants asked for the contents of the report to be divulged to them and the Court so that they could answer the charges, if any, made against their member.

The Respondents replied by saying that the inspectors' report and the document giving directions were confidential documents and were privileged under section 131 of the Evidence Act.

After hearing the parties' preliminary arguments on this point the Court made the following order:

"The relevant part of the above two documents i.e. Inspectors' report and the Minister's directive to be made available to the Court and the Claimants. They will be admitted subject to section 15 (1) of the Trade Disputes Act as requested by the Respondents. The documents to be made available within 14 days of the date hereof."

The Respondents accordingly filed a second submission setting out the relevant parts in the inspectors' report that led to the termination of Mr. Sikinyi.

On 28th October, 1976 the Respondents held a meeting and as far as Mr. Sikinyi is concerned resolved:

"that the appointment of Mr. W. J. Sikinyi, Municipal Inspector, be terminated by giving him three months' notice with effect from 1st November, 1976 in accordance with the Terms and Conditions of Service applicable to him and that

he be not required to serve the period of notice but be paid in lieu thereof."

Mr. Sikinyi's services were terminated on 29th October, 1976 when he was given the appropriate notice of termination. He was paid the following amount which included his terminal benefits:

"3 months salary in lieu of notice ... 11,700.00
9 days terminal leave (1-9,2.77) ... 1,385.50
Proportionate leave allowance ... 95.00
13,180.60
Superannuation: 74,314.20
Loss Paye 7,425.50 66,861.70
Total: 80,042.30"

The Claimants' main submissions are that Mr. Sikinyi was not given the opportunity of refuting the statements of persons who gave evidence against him at the crucial meeting which the Respondents held to discuss the question of fruit and vegetable wholesalers being moved to former Raha Leo Canteen and that Mr. Sikinyi had not been asked by the Respondents to give an answer to the affegations made against him by the two investigators appointed by the Minister for Local Government as stated hereinbefore. The Claimants also called Mr. Sikinyi to give evidence on oath and he explained in details the five occasions when he was expelled from the Respondents' service and reinstated four times during his 11 years' service with them.

The Respondents dubbed Mr. Sikinyi as a trouble maker and stated that he had a furbulent career with them and maintained that they were under an obligation to implement the Minister's directives as contained in the secret report and having been convinced that Mr. Sikinyi was not rendering satisfactory service in his capacity as Municipal Inspector they terminated his services in accordance with clause 25 (b). They maintained that the procedure followed was correct and he was given every opportunity to put forward an explanation as to why he had failed to executed his duties properly and diligently.

The Court notes that investigators after making their report on the Licencing and Inspectorate Section concluded by stating:

"In view of Mr. Sikinyi's behaviour and his attitude towards work we felt that his continued employment in the section would not be in the interest of the Council and good management of the Council's enforcement section."

- In brief the inspection report revealed, among other things:
 (a) Mr. Sikinyi's poor leadership in terms of relationship between himself and his colleagues.
- (b) His forceful removal of files and office equipment from office No. 17 in the Town Treasury's Department.
- (c) His failure to ensure that licence application forms endorsed by him were not misplaced and or hidden."

The Court has also gone through very carefully the minutes of the meeting which was held on 28th October, 1976 at which a decision was taken to terminate Mr. Sikinyi's services and the Court is satisfied that he in fact deserved a termination. Despite the Claimans' advocate's vigorous submissions the Court can find no evidence at all whereby to find that the Respondents' decision lacked good faith or was perverse or against the principles of natural justice. The Court does not agree with the Claimants' submission that dismissal was an extreme measure in case of Mr. Sikinyi and probably a warning would have sufficed. The fact is that coupled with the investigators' report and recommendation on Mr. Sikinyi the incident arising out of the failure of the exercise of transferring the fruit and vegetable wholesalers to the Raha Leo Canteen due to the fact that ro sub-inspectors were available because of Mr. Sikinyi's negligence in carrying out his duties properly left the Respondents with no alternative but to terminate his services. The Court is satisfied that the Respondents carried out a full investigation into that incident as is evident from the nine page minutes that appear as one of the appendices in the Respondents' submissions.

The Court finds that Sikinyi having been paid all his terminal benefits amounting to Sh. 80,042/30 the Court can help him no more. The Claimants' demand for his reinstatement and/or payment of compensation is accordingly rejected.

- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 10th and 11th June, 1980, and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses:

Claimants:

- D. Iluku,
- S. Wanjala.

Respondents .- K. K. B. Shah.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 2nd November, 1979, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 12th April, 1980, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The establishment of the Respondents in March, 1978, is rather important to this dispute as this business was previously carried on by one P. G. Shah. The new owner of the Respondents, B. Shah found the five employees (four of whom are the claimants in this dispute) employed in the business.

There are three businesses operating under the name of G & M Ltd., Western Clothing Ltd. and S & P Selections Ltd. The Respondents pointed out that all these businesses were not connected in any way and when the Respondents' present proprietors took over the business the previous owner, P. G. Shah, agreed and confirmed that he will pay, satisfy and discharge all outstanding salaries of the staff employed by the company up to and including the 5th March, 1978.

It is not disputed that these employees although paid weekly were on monthly terms.

The Claimants' witness, Mr. Ikulu, who was the only one of the four employees involved in this dispute present in Court, stated while giving evidence that on 4th April, 1979, Babu Shah had called Peter Mwema to his shop and had warned him that since he was going to buy the business of S & P Selections Ltd. he did not want any staff to be union members and if he found them there he would call the police. This witness further added that on 7th April, Babu Shah had come to the Respondents' shop and asked if they had resigned from the union and was told that they had not after which he, Mr. Shah, went away. On 9th April this witness and the others wanted clarification about this from their employer on the threats of B. Shah. Bhalam Shah was not present so this witness and the others spoke to his son who denied any knowledge of the statements of Babu Shah. This witness wanted permission to go and call Bhalman Shah but his son told him that if he left the shop without his permission then he would not want to see his face again. The witness then worked in the shop till 8 p.m. and went away. The next day he went to the Claimants and told them that he had been sacked. They wanted the Claimants to go to the employer and sort out their terminal benefits. This witness in evidence in chief quite clearly admitted that the and his colleagues did not go back to work for one week as they were afraid of being arrested and after a week when they reported back to the shop with the Claimants' official from the Nairobi branch they were told to get out. They then went to the Special Branch.

The Claimants have demanded terminal benefits on behalf of these four persons without specifying what those terminal benefits are. In addition they have asked that each one of them be paid four months' salary as compensation for wrongful dismissal

The Court was rather surprised at the step taken by S. Wanjala who is the Claimants' organizing secretary attached to the Nairobi branch in taking all these employees to the Special Branch who, as it turned out, after calling the employer to their offices told them to go and see the Provincial Labour Officer. This witness in cross-examination stated as follows:

"I know the rights and duties of my members. I wanted the Special Branch to know what was going on in the shop. "On 18th April we went to Special Branch. The employer was called to Special Branch he was asked if he had sold the shop and if he had sacked. He said he proposed to sell the shop to his cousin Babu Shah. The employees left the shop under threat, they left the employment for their safety, the employer wanted to finish them."

Even without considering the evidence of the Respondents' witness, K. B. Shah, it is obvious from the evidence of the Claimants' two witnesses that all the four employees absented themselves from their duties for one complete week without notifying the Respondents of any reason for their action. The Court cannot fathom the behaviour of a trade union official in involving the Special Branch in what appears to be a purely industrial relations matter unless he had some ulterior motive of suspecting some underhand business going on between the police and the Respondents. He did give a broad hint to this effect but the Court cannot take this sort of insinuation into consideration without proper proof. So the Claimants themselves through their witnesses have established that their members absented themselves from their work because they feared that they would be arrested because they were union members when the business was bought over by Babu Shah. This sort of attitude on the part of workers is incomprehensible especially in the present day Kenya when the workers know only too well what their rights are. The Ministry of Labour Investigator surprisingly came to the conclusion that the employees did not desert their employment and the management actually involved the police in the matter. This finding is completely wrong in view of the Claimants' own witnesses' evidence given during the hearing that they went to the Special Branch where the employer was called. It is most unfortunate for these four people that they abandoned their employment on the threats of a person who had no connexion with the business. The Court cannot attach any weight to the Investigator's recommendation that the four employees should be paid four months' compensation for wrongful dismissal under the circumstances. There is no evidence at all to show that the Respondents dismissed or terminated the service of these employees. The fact is they themselves disappeared from work for one week which was the Easter week with the result that the normal sales expected during that week of Sh. 10,000 to 12,000 dropped to Sh. 3,000 to 4,000. It is obvious that it was a calculated move on the part of these four workers to absent themselves from work during this crucial week when business was expected to be at its peak.

The Respondents' witness, K. B. Shah, confirmed the above and added that they did not intend to sell the business to anyone and they had no intention to do so. He admitted that there was bad blood among their family with their cousins owning the other two businesses. He categorically denied that they had, at any time, dismissed or terminated the service of these four employees.

The Court accepts the Respondents' submission that the Claimants' officials advised these employees not to report on duty and considering all the circumstances of this dispute the Court finds that on the wrong advice of the trade union official concerned these four employees find themselves in this predicament where they themselves abandoned their employment. It is regrettable and a great pity that this should have happened but this trade union official must fully accept the blame for it. The Court accordingly rejects the Claimants' demand for the payment of compensation to these employees for the alleged wrongful dismissal because they themselves abandoned their employment for one full week without any justification.

As far as the terminal benefits are concerned the Court finds that the Claimants failed to prove any such claim and the Court therefore cannot make any award in respect of this claim. The Court must add that except for Mr. Iluku none of the other three persons attended the hearing of this dispute.

In the end the Court would like to comment on the overtime claim which the Claimants had attempted to make on behalf of these four employees amounting to over Sh. 24,000. The Court is very surprised that the Claimants attempted to put forward this claim in such a casual manner in the dispute without taking any trouble whatsoever of proving any part of it. Were the Court to take any notice of such attempts then it would amount to a mockery of justice. The Court expects more responsible approach from the parties to their industrial disputes when they reach the final stage in the Industrial Court.




