CAUSE No. 27 OF 1980

Parties—

Domestic &amp; Hotel Workers' Union

and

Kulia Investments Ltd./Sarova Hotels Ltd.

Issue in dispute:

Termination of 26 employees.

1. The Domestic & Hotel Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kulia Investments Ltd. and Sarova Hotels Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 21st and 31st July and 25th September, 1980, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Respondents also called R. B. Richards to give evidence on oath.

## AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 24th January, 1980, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 15th May, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The New Stanley Hotel changed hands in or about February 1978, when Kulia Investments Ltd. (first Respondent) sold it to Sarova Hotels Ltd. (second Respondent). A sale agreement between them was prepared and under Clause (K) it is provided:

"All staff in the hotel at the date of possession shall continue in employment and the vendor shall pay the purchaser for lodging in a trust bank account the total amount of severance pay due to the staff of the hotel as at the date of possession. The purchaser hereby indemnifies the vendor against all claims and demands from the staff of the hotel relating to such severance pay."

At the same time a staff circular was issued dated 28th February, 1978, signed by the representatives of both the Respondents whereby the staff were informed that the new owners would continue employing them on the same terms and conditions as those presently enjoyed and that letters of employment would be issued in due course. In this circular the following paragraph also appears:

"Kulia Investments Ltd. are paying into a fund a sum of money for every member of staff in the New Stanley Hotel being equivalent to the severance pay had each member of staff had his or her employment terminated on 28th February, 1978."

The second Respondent issued to each member of staff with a letter of appointment and included therein a probationary clause of one month. The Claimants resisted this move as they felt that this was contrary to the collective agreement in force between them and the first Respondent and that it also contravened the agreement between the two Respondents. As a result the second Respondent issued another circular to all staff on 31st March, 1978, withdrawing the probationary period clause and also the letters of appointment which they said had

been issued in error. They confirmed in this circular that their services are deemed to have commenced on the effective date of each employee's original letter of appointment.

On 28th April, 1978, the services of 26 employees were terminated with effect from 30th April, 1978, by giving them two days' notice. They were told that they would be paid for all their services with the second Respondent as follows: Salary, service charge, house allowance and leave accrued, all up to and including 30th April, 1978.

The Claimants having reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour, the Ministry's finding and recommendation were conveyed to the parties on 9th February, 1979, in the following terms:

"The agreement between New Stanley Hotel and Sarova Hotels Ltd. had provided for continuity in employment for all employees. The management disregarded this by terminating the services of 26 employees. When the union objected five of the dismissed employees were reinstated.

The union undertook to interview the workers concerned to see whether any of them would be prepared to be made redundant voluntarily but before the union acted the management terminated the services of the 26 employees. I consider these terminations wrongful.

It is recommended that the remaining 21 employees be reinstated without loss of seniority. They should also be paid half wages for the period they were out of employment."

During the hearing the Respondents called Mr. R. B. Richards who is the deputy managing director of the first Respondent to give evidence. He explained that they had negotiated with the second Respondent that they should continue employing all the employees working at the New Stanley Hotel on the same terms and conditions as before. The second Respondent, however, was of the view that the hotel was over-staffed to the extent of 80 employees. Mr. Richards did not accept this although he felt that there was probably an over-staffing of about 40 employees. He had discussed the matter with the Claimants' general secretary, Mr. Mugo, who had favoured continuing employment for his members.

As far as these 26 employees are concerned Mr. Richards confirmed that they received severance pay from them as per the terms of the collective agreement in force and this was in addition to the money which they, the first Respondent, had deposited on behalf of the workers on an *ex gratia* basis with the Housing Finance Company of Kenya (H.F.C.K.). Mr. Richards further stated that these employees who lost the jobs were to get full severance pay plus gratuity. As far as the remaining employees are concerned who are continuing in employment he maintained that the second Respondent has to discharge their liability for all their years of service and cannot set it off against the gratuity which the first Respondent has deposited with H.F.C.K.

At this stage the Court would like to make it quite clear that the issue of the money which has been deposited on account of all the ex-employees of the first Respondent with H.F.C.K. is not an issue in dispute just now before the Court. The Claimants put forward a submission that the first Respondent should have put in these accounts the equivalent of severance pay whereas Mr. Richards said that it was not severance pay but an *ex gratia* payment which represented one month's pay and one tenth of a month's pay for each year of service. The Court believes that there is a dispute between the Claimants and the first Respondent on this point and the Court therefore has decided not to make any ruling on this particular point in this dispute.

Mr. Richards evidence, however, has confirmed that these 26 employees who are affected by this dispute received full severance pay in accordance with the collective agreement as they were declared redundant by the second Respondent plus the *ex gratia* payment which they had set aside for them at H.F.C.K. with one month's notice and leave entitlement.

The Court has seen the receipts which these employees have signed in respect of these amounts and each one of them has confirmed that he has no further claims against Block Hotels relating to their employment.

After going through all the documentary evidence and the parties' submissions the Court is satisfied that the second Respondent agreed to keep in employment on a continuing basis all the former employees of the first Respondent. In these circumstances if they had to declare any of them redundant they had to follow the necessary procedures specified by law before they could do so. There is no evidence to show what steps if any the second Respondent took before declaring these

26 employees redundant. The Court must therefore find that these persons have suffered a wrongful termination. The Court was told that five of them were reinstated by the second Respondent the dispute therefore relates only to the remaining 21.

The Court finds on the evidence of Mr. Richards that each one of these employees has received the full severance pay for having been declared redundant in addition to the amounts lying to their credit with the H.F.C.K. along with one month's notice and leave entitlement. The Court directs that if they have not received these amounts then the Respondents should take immediate steps to see that they are paid accordingly.

Severance pay having been given to these employees for having been declared redundant and the Court having come to the conclusion that they had suffered wrongful dismissal because the appropriate statutory procedures were not complied with the Court has to decide what compensation the 21 of them should get. The Court was told that their salaries when their services were terminated were as follows:

Taking all the circumstances of this dispute into consideration the Court finds that reinstatement would not be beneficial to either party and the Court has decided to award them compensation for the wrongful dismissal that they have suffered. The Court awards that each one of them should get three months' salary by way of compensation from the second Respondent for the wrongful dismissal they have suffered and that this is to be in addition to the amounts they have received from the first Respondent.

*Issue in dispute:*

Dismissal of Miss Florence Jatiaga Tiego.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Barclays Bank of Kenya Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 18th and 19th September, 1980 and in addition to relying on their written and

verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:

*Claimants.*—Miss Florence J. Tiego.

*Respondents.*—D. W. Ooko.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 30th January, 1980 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 10th July together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Miss Tiego was employed by the Respondents in 1971 as a telephone operator and worked for them until 4th April, 1979 when her services were terminated on the ground that she had a close association with Elam Mwanzi who had been dismissed from the Respondents' service and had been imprisoned for theft a few years ago. It was further alleged in the letter of dismissal that Mwanzi was again in prison after having committed a criminal offence against both the Habib Bank and the Respondents and which theft was successful because of a telephone call made from the Habib Bank to someone in the Respondents' bank. The letter also stated that she had been seen conversing on several occasions with Mwanzi outside the bank and that he is known to have telephoned her from the police station. The last paragraph of the letter read as follows:

"We regret that we cannot employ people who consort with known criminals and therefore your services with this Bank are terminated from today's date in accordance with the provisions of clause 4 (d) of the collective agreement covering section heads, clerical, technical and subordinate staff by the payment of one month's salary in lieu of notice. All money due to you including the value of any accumulated leave/leave allowance will be paid to you once the amount has been calculated.

You have the following loans outstanding:

These now become payable immediately and we shall be pleased to have your proposals in this connexion within three months."

The Claimants took up the matter on Miss Tiego's behalf and the dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour and the findings and recommendation were conveyed to the parties on 9th January, 1980 as follows:

"Miss Tiego was dismissed because of the fraud involving a sum of K.Sh. 152,000 and not because of other mistakes she had committed earlier i.e. answering customers rudely on the telephone, overdrawing her staff account without prior arrangement etc. She became party to this fraud solely because of the fact that she associated with the criminals.

The management has not been able to prove beyond any reasonable doubt that Miss Tiego took part in this fraud.

When the fraud took place the cheque in question (K.Sh. 152,000) was marked "payment stopped". For this cheque to be paid therefore would require the authority of a very senior person. Hence I do not see how she could have manoeuvred the payment of this cheque. Furthermore there was no way of proving that it was Miss Tiego whom Mr. Mwanzi rang from the CID offices. It follows that the bank had not enough evidence to incriminate her.

In view of the foregoing I recommend that Miss Tiego's dismissal be reduced to normal termination with normal terminal benefits and she be paid one month's salary in lieu of notice."

At this stage the Court would like to comment that the Ministry of Labour having found that the Respondents did not have enough evidence to incriminate Miss Tiego proceeded to make a recommendation that she should be paid one month's salary in lieu of notice when it is evident from the letter of dismissal that that is what the Respondents had already done. So the recommendation made by the Ministry really is meaningless. The Court must express its regret at this sort of recommendation.

The Claimants have asked the Court to find that Miss Tiego was wrongly dismissed by the Respondents and she should be reinstated without any loss of service and earnings.

During the hearing the Respondents unfortunately because of extremely poor submissions and the evidence of their only witness could not prove any involvement of Miss Tiego in the



alleged fraud. This was mainly due to the poor representation made on their behalf by the Kenya Bankers' Employers' Association and to some extent by the fact that they had involved Miss Tiego in this fraud merely on suspicion and nothing more.

As far as consorting with known criminals is concerned the Court has it in evidence that Elam Mwanzi, the main culprit, used to live in the house of one of the top officers of the Respondents. Even the Respondents' only witness, Mr. Ooko, conceded that people who work together are friendly and it should be noted that Mwanzi used to work for the bank. This witness further added that friendship between Miss Tiego and Mr. Mwanzi was not strange. He further said in cross-examination that in March 1979 there were two telephone operators, Miss Tiego and a Goan lady, both of whom were not supposed to monitor calls. This witness then went on to make a statement which completely demolishes the Respondents' allegations against Miss Tiego when he said that before K.Sh. 152,000 could have been paid an official with signatory A status had to sign the cheque for this amount. It could not have been paid through the instructions of a telephone operator. He added that telephone operators had nothing to do with the payment of cheques.

The Respondents referred to Miss Tiego's previous record dating back to 1972 and 1974 saying that she was rude to customers etc., but then the Respondents themselves sent her for training at the post office in 1974. They also alleged that in 1977 Miss Tiego was living beyond her means but the Court was given no evidence at all of any details of this allegation.

Miss Tiego gave evidence during the hearing and stated that she had gone to Sweden in 1972 at the expense of her Swedish boyfriend. She added that she had some disagreement with Mr. Mwanzi in the middle of 1978 because she had given her wrist-watch to him for repairs which he had failed to return. She admitted she knew Mr. Mwanzi like all other Respondents' employees as Mr. Mwanzi was a messenger in the bank. She denied that she had a brother called B. L. Luhati and she categorically denied that she had assisted Mr. Mwanzi in any fraud that he had committed on the bank.

The Court must dismiss the Respondents' representative's submission that they had tried to change Miss Tiego's character by verbal warnings. If matters are serious then the Respondents should know that written warnings should be given in accordance with the terms of the collective agreement.

The Court must say that this case has been a walkover for the Claimants and the Court agrees with the Claimants' advocate's submission that the Respondents have miserably failed to prove any of their allegations against Miss Tiego and that her evidence on oath was not challenged at all.

The Court has no hesitation at all in finding that Miss Tiego has indeed suffered a wrongful dismissal as the Respondents had absolutely no cause for terminating her services. The Court has carefully considered the question of her reinstatement but has come to the conclusion that compensation would meet the interests of justice in this dispute. Miss Tiego was earning K.Sh. 2,500 p.m. when her services were terminated and the Court awards that in addition to one month's salary in lieu of notice that the Respondents have offered her she should be paid six months' salary by way of compensation for the wrongful dismissal that she has suffered. She should also be given any other terminal benefits to which she is entitled under the collective agreement.

Issue in dispute:

Termination of services of Mrs. Jane Nandwa.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kudu Boutique shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 11th March, 15th April, 27th May and 16th and 17th September, 1980. The long delay in between the hearing dates was caused by the fact that the two ladies involved in this dispute due to personal reasons were not available to appear in Court earlier. In addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions the parties called the following witnesses to give evidence during the hearing:

Claimants.—Mrs. J. Nandwa.

Respondents.—Mrs. S. Omwony.

Mrs. J. Were.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 3rd October, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 27th December together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The Claimants have brought this dispute on behalf of Mrs. Nandwa who worked for the Respondents from 4th May 1975 until 30th November, 1978 when her services were terminated. She was a sales supervisor earning Sh. 1,500 p.m. at the time.

The dispute was reported to the Minister for Labour and the Ministry's finding and recommendation were conveyed to the parties on 7th September, 1979 in the following terms:

"Through an interview with Mrs. Nandwa it was revealed that she was responsible for ordering and selling items for the shop. She was never caught by the employer with smuggled goods. It was also found that when she reported on duty from leave she found that her junior had been promoted to her post and a new employee had already been employed showing that the employee, had already decided to get rid of her.

The employer had no concrete proof for the allegation and therefore no sufficient reason for termination. The termination was therefore found to be wrongful.

It is recommended that in addition to her terminal benefits Mrs. Nandwa be paid six months' salary as compensation for wrongful termination and be issued with a letter of reference."

The Respondents rejected the finding and recommendation and the dispute is now before the Court.

From the evidence of the witnesses it is evident that Mrs. Nandwa was a very competent worker and as far as her work was concerned the Respondents had no complaint whatsoever against her. In fact one of the Respondents' witnesses, Mrs. Jane Were, told the Court that she wept when Mrs. Nandwa was sacked as she was very friendly with her and she was also a very good worker.

The Court has decided not to hold against Mrs. Nandwa the incidents involving mercury and one or two other products of which the Respondents have accused her of secretly dealing in without their knowledge as they had no licence in respect of these items. The Court has done so for the simple reason that even if she was indulging in these illegal activities the fact remains that after having found out the Respondents were content to let her continue working instead of sacking her on the spot which they were entitled to do.

The Court is also not satisfied that the Claimants have succeeded in proving their allegations of nepotism against the Respondents when they say Mrs. Omwony sacked Mrs. Nandwa because she wanted to give the job to her niece Miss Akinyi. This girl had finished her form IV and used to come to the Respondents' shop to pass her time. She was not engaged to replace Mrs. Nandwa who was much valued and respected by the Respondents.

From the evidence that was given by the witnesses the Court finds that the real reason why Mrs. Nandwa's services were terminated was the incident arising out of certain antiques which a Nigerian artist had brought to the shop to be sold by the Respondents on commission basis. Mrs. Nandwa wanted to accept these antiques for sale in the shop but Mrs. Omwony who was the director manageress rejected the proposition on the grounds that they were not fast moving items. This prompted Mrs. Nandwa to get in touch with Mrs. Ojal, another director who bought the antiques from the Nigerian artist on the recommendation of Mrs. Nandwa and placed the goods in the shop for sale. The Court believes the evidence of Mrs. Were on this point. This clearly shows that Mrs. Nandwa's action on this particular incident was tantamount to undermining the authority of the director manageress Mrs. Omwony and in fact it could easily have resulted in a serious difference of opinion between Mrs. Omwony and Mrs. Ojal.

The Court has carefully considered the Respondents' advocate's submission that in the absence of a recognition agreement the Claimants' can't have a cause of action against the Respondents even though they have signed the Notification of Dispute Form

"A" but the Court cannot reject the dispute on this submission. It was up to the Respondents to raise this issue with the Minister for Labour before signing the Form "A". As it is the Court has the Form "A" before it duly signed by both the parties accompanied by the two relevant statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner. The dispute is therefore properly before the Court.

On the facts of the dispute, however, the Court finds that Mrs. Nandwa's conduct arising out of the antiques offered by the Nigerian artist was in itself a sufficient reason for her to be issued with a severe letter of reprimand. Termination considering all the circumstances of this dispute was rather harsh and the Court awards that Mrs. Nandwa should be given two months' salary representing one month's salary in lieu of notice and one month's salary for compensation for the wrongful dismissal that she has suffered. Apart from this two months' salary the Court rejects the Claimants' all other demands made on her behalf for her reinstatement or 12 months' salary by way of compensation.

The Court directs the Respondents to issue Mrs. Nandwa with a proper letter of reference so that her chances of securing another employment are not prejudiced.
