Assistant Immigration Officer I (Thirty-three Posts) (Immigration)

Deputy Chief Land Registrar (Two Posts) (No. 50/84)

Salary scale.—K£3,408 to 4,428 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must possess legal qualifications from approved institution and preferably be advocates already registered in Kenya. They should have considerable experience since qualifying during which most of the time should have been devoted to conveyancing and land registration. They must be familiar with the provisions of the Government Lands Act, Registration of Titles Act, Land Titles Act, the Applied Indian Transfer of Property Act, 1882, Registered Land Act and Land Control Act, and should have practical knowledge of the running of land registries. They will also be expected to have knowledge of the provisions of the various laws relating to companies, statutory corporations trusts and trustees, administration of estates bankruptcy, limitations of actions, survey, land adjudication and consolidations, trust land and other matters. A knowledge of the English common law and principle of equity and land law will be an advantage.

The successful applicants who will also be deputy principal registrar of titles and deputy senior collector of stamp duty, will be expected to assist the Chief Land Registrar/Principal Registrar of Titles in advising the Commissioner of Lands in matters touching upon conveyancing and registration and effect of new legislation, and to initiate the gradual application of the Registered Land Act, to the whole of Kenya. The job includes supervision of a growing number of district land registries, preparing instructions on practice to all his staff, training of lawyers and subordinate staff, initiating improvements in procedure and amendments to legislation affecting

land and carrying out of all conveyancing on behalf of the government departments and quasi-government bodies.

Senior Valuer (Three Posts) (Re-advertisement) (No. 51/84)

Salary scale.—K£2,712 to 3,540 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be civil servants in possession of bachelor of arts degree in land economics, preferably upper second class honours or Association of Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors and must be members of the Institution of Surveyors of Kenya. The successful candidates will be required to undertake duties of land registrar III and to assist other government departments especially the provincial administration on land registration matters.

They must also be in possession of a professional postgraduate diploma/certificate in archives administration and records management from recognized training institutes. Professionally qualified archivist III with not less than three (3) years' experience in Job Group "H" will also be considered. Graduates without the above qualifications may be considered provided they have served in an archival establishment for three consecutive years during which time they must have displayed talent and industry in the areas of accessioning, description, arrangement, conservation, reproduction and retrieval of documents.

The successful candidates will be responsible to archivist I (archive administration) in the operation of the key areas of archives services especially in repository management and security preparation and publication of finding aids, repair and restoration, reprography and searchroom management.

These emoluments are normally exempt from all direct taxation. Income tax on such remuneration if levied, is reimbursed in accordance with the staff regulations and rules.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 19th July, 1982, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 5th November, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Mrs. Minishi, the grievant in this case, worked for the respondents from 4th December, 1974, up to 11th October, 1979, when her services were terminated and she was offered one month's salary in lieu of notice plus other lawful dues.

The allegation against her was that on 5th September, 1979, while employed as a cashier there was a cash difference in her work on that day which was discovered by the balancing team. It was alleged that on that day Limbo Enterprises had paid to her KSh. 16,000 which she accepted and signed for as being correct but on her cashiers sheet she entered KSh. 6,000 incorrectly. This being the case she should have declared an over of ten thousand shillings which she did not. This error was discovered by the balancing team.

Mrs. Minishi was charged on two counts of theft by servant contrary to section 281 of the Penal Code. She was, however, acquitted on a no case to answer submission.

The first count in the criminal case related to the aforesaid KSh. 10,000 and second count related to KSh. 4,130 regarding the account of F. E. Charnley where it is alleged she had accepted the credit on which two items were listed resulting in the loss of KSh. 4,130. This incident was also mentioned as a reason for her termination. Mrs. Minishi was charged on 28th September, 1979, and was acquitted on 28th January, 1980. Her services had been terminated on 11th October, 1979.

The claimants had reported a dispute to the Minister for Labour and the ministry's finding was that Mrs. Minishi's dismissal was wrongful and recommended that she should be paid four months' salary by way of compensation for the wrongful termination in addition to her terminal benefits. The claimants rejected the recommendation.

Mrs. Minishi stated in evidence that she received KSh. 6,000 from Limbo Enterprises which she entered in her cashiers sheet. The fact that the pay-in slip showed KSh. 16,000 both in figures and in written words was a mystery to her. She suspected that some other bank employees had forged these documents in league with the firm. The court has carefully examined the hand-written pay-in slips and the court immediately suspects at a cursory glance that the figure "1" which is added to KSh. 6,000 is written by a different person than the one who filled the whole form. Similarly the entry in words clearly shows that the words "teen" which have been joined to the word "six" were written later on.

One other intriguing feature in this dispute is that on the day in question Mrs. Minishi reported a shortage of KSh. 200 which led to her till and the cashiers sheet and the other relevant documents being checked thoroughly by the holder of the duplicate key to the till. This check did not reveal an over of KSh. 10,000 which means that the pay-in slip and the entry in the cashiers sheet tallied to show that the amount received was KSh. 6,000.

All these points go in favour of Mrs. Minishi but there is one very important piece of evidence which is very much against her and that is an admission by her in writing in presence of F. S. J. Couto, who at the material time was a sub-manager administration at the market branch where Mrs. Minishi worked which admission read:

"I confirm that the writing of the amount of KSh. 16,000 on the cashiers stamp and the signature is mine."

The court has noted that the pay-in slip has KSh. 16,000 written in figures signed by Mrs. Minishi with the bank stamp thereon.

Mrs. Minishi admitted that she had given her explanation in writing to Mr. Couto and that after she had given the letter to him he called her and showed her the pay-in slip and then he dictated her the words which she wrote and signed. These are the above-quoted words which are admitted by Mrs. Minishi. She said she did not know what she was doing and that she was in a state of panic.

There is one other aspect and that is that one S. D. Muia had been assigned to check the work of certain cashiers including Mrs. Minishi. He stated that on that day he did not check her cashiers sheet because she did not give it to him for checking. He said that the checking was done by ticking the sheet but this did not happen on the material day.

The court is also satisfied that Mrs. Minishi had not strictly complied with the standing instructions issued to the cashiers which required that the whole lodgement must be checked immediately in front of the customer before any cash is sorted into the till and that each item should be ticked as it was checked

and further the cashiers are required to cross out the rest of the section where no entry is made.

It is true that Mrs. Minishi has been cleared of charges of theft by servant on 20th January, 1980. Her services were, however, terminated on 11th October, 1979, and the main reason for this was irregularity in the performance of her duties on 5th September, 1979. The court has carefully considered all aspects of this matter and finds that Mrs. Minishi's work performance on the day in question led to the respondents losing KSh. 10,000. Since she has been cleared in the criminal case she did not steal it but the fact remains that on the pay-in slip which she received even if the total in the money deposited column was written KSh. 6,000 and the amount in words originally "six thousand only" and somebody later on without her knowledge had added the "1" in figures and "teen" in words, Mrs. Minishi admitted having written KSh. 16,000 in figures and signed under that after stamping it with the bank stamp. This she has not denied and even admitted before Mr. Couto and wrote the admission in her own handwriting. How can a reasonably efficient cashier make such errors? The court cannot rule out that probably there were other persons also involved in this fraud but the fact remains that Mrs. Minishi's negligence and poor performance of the duty as a cashier led to the bank losing over KSh. 10,000 in this transaction. Then there was the question of F. E. Charnley's account where again Mrs. Minishi had received some amount from this customer and the bank again lost KSh. 4,130. So it is indeed more than a coincidence that money was lost on these two occasions. This happened only because Mrs. Minishi did not perform her job properly as a cashier.

The court has carefully weighed the points in favour of Mrs. Minishi in this case and the facts established against her and has come to the conclusion that this is not a case where the court should interfere in the respondents' decision in handing out a normal termination to an employee in whom they have lost confidence.

It would indeed be a travesty of justice for the court to award either the reinstatement of or compensation to an employee whose inept handling of two customers' deposits on different dates led to the bank losing over KSh. 10,000. In these circumstances the respondents were entitled to hand out a normal termination to her. The court therefore rejects all demands made on behalf of Mrs. Minishi and she is advised to collect the dues offered to her by the respondents if she has not already done so.
