(1) Advising the director on the planning, content and scope of the archives and records management component of the general information programme.

(6) Maintaining contacts and developing co-operation with related non-governmental and governmental organizations.

(7) Carrying out missions to member states in connection with the above activities.

(8) Providing technical support for the implementation of projects financed by extra-budgetary resources and supervising implementation of operational projects in the field of archives.

(9) Carrying out such other administrative and professional duties as may be assigned.

Qualifications and experience required:

(a) Graduation from a recognized university plus postgraduate qualifications or equivalent experience in the field of archives.

(b) Substantial professional experience and internationally recognized status in the field of archives.

(c) Experience in the administration and management of international programmes and familiarity with Unesco and the United Nations system.

(d) Ability to co-operate with others and experience in co-ordinating activities.

(e) Good knowledge of English and French, including good drafting ability. Knowledge of Spanish desirable.

(6) Monitor I.B.E. activities in relation to the work plan; and prepare progress reports.

(7) Liaise with other international institutions, including non-governmental organizations.

(8) Meet with official visitors and brief them on I.B.E. functions and work programme.

(9) Other duties as assigned by the director.

(a) University degree in education or related fields; teaching or research experience desirable.

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the general supervision of the director of the division of ecological science, secretary of the International Co-ordinating Council of the Programme on Man and Biosphere (M.A.B.), the incumbent of this post will be responsible for activities concerning integrated research on the environment, ecology and the preservation of the natural heritage. His or her specific duties will be as follows:

(1) Collaboration with member states in preparation and implementation of research, training and experimentation projects relating to land-use and rational utilization of the renewable natural resources of humid, sub-humid and semi-arid tropical ecosystems.

(2) Promotion of activities concerning the training of specialists and technicians in land-use and the rational utilization of the resources of those areas.

(3) Organization of panels of experts and technical meetings in the field of integrated research on natural resources, ecology and nature conservation.

(4) Participation in the implementation of the convention concerning the protection of the world cultural and natural heritage (part relating to the natural heritage).

(5) Participation in the preparation of meetings and the work of the International Co-ordinating Council of the M.A.B. programme. Contribution to co-ordination with competent international or regional specialized agencies.

(6) Collaboration in the preparation and implementation of technical assistance project in the field of integrated research on natural resources, ecology and nature conservation.

(7) Collection and collation of information and preparation of the publications and reports of the division.

(8) All other activities connected with the work of the division of ecological sciences.

Qualifications and experience required:

(a) University degree in a main branch of environmental sciences and sound knowledge of modern ecology methods and integrated research on natural resources.

(b) At least five years of scientific activity, with experience of research on the ecology of the natural environment, of integrated research and of training in the field of natural resources.

(c) Wide experience of administration of scientific programmes and of international scientific co-operation.

(d) Excellent knowledge of either French or English and a good working knowledge of the other language.

(5) Keep up to date with the evolution of printing technology, especially in reference to the development of data handling, composition systems and news media.

(6) Accept any specific responsibility which may be delegated by the chief of division and act as replacement during his absence.

Dismissal of Jonathan Alosa.

THE Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and General Motors Kenya Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 7th and 19th March, 1984, and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses:

Claimants.—J. Alosa.

Respondents:

M. Simon.

J. A. Juma.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 9th June, 1983, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 25th October together with the statutory certificate signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The grievant, Jonathan Alosa, worked for the respondents for a period of about four years and it is not disputed that he had no warning letters issued to him during this period. His services were terminated after a mysterious fire in the parts and accessories warehouse which caused damage to the respondents' goods to the value of KSh. 5,011.67. This fact again is not in dispute that there was a fire at the parts and accessories warehouse at about 10.45 a.m. which if it had not been contained would have caused a loss of millions of shillings.

The respondents took the decision to dismiss him with effect from 18th August, 1982, after the fire was investigated by their security/fire officer, F. Okomba, who prior to joining the respondents was an assistant commissioner of police in Kenya.

The claimants took up the matter on Mr. Alosa's behalf and contested his dismissal as they were not satisfied that Mr. Alosa was responsible for starting the fire and the matter was discussed between the parties at their own level and eventually was investigated by the Ministry of Labour. The ministry released its findings and recommendation on 19th May, 1983, and the ministry found that although Mr. Alosa was the man nearest to the fire he did not rush to extinguish it and his behaviour at the material time left a lot to be desired in that he did not shout or rush to extinguish it as soon as possible but instead walked a considerable distance to alert a fellow worker who did the shouting and alerted other members of staff to come to their aid. The ministry further found that Mr. Alosa may have acted suspiciously but the management had not proved beyond reasonable doubt that he started the fire and recommended that the dismissal should be reduced to normal termination and he be paid all his terminal benefits plus two months' salary by way of compensation for the loss of his job.

During the hearing evidence was produced to show that all the respondents' employees are given clear-cut instructions on fire alarm a copy of which was produced in court. The court also saw the written statement made by Mr. Alosa, on 16th August, about this incident in which he states that he noticed some smoke spreading in one corner of parts and accessories warehouse but he did not rush there at once because there were some guys working nearby who would have seen this fire. He further stated "after which I did not believe that it was fire". He added that the second time he sighted again and then saw a lot of smoke go in both sides and called one of his friends Mr. Olonde and started rushing towards where the smoke was coming from and found that it was fire! He took an extinguisher and started shouting fire, fire, after which some guys came to lend hands.

The respondents' investigation established the following:

- Mr. Alosa saw smoke and failed to raise alarm.
- There were two painters working nearby. Mr. Alosa failed to notify them of the existence of the fire.
- The parts and accessories supervisor was present in his office which is about 50 yards from the scene. Mr. Alosa

did not call him and instead went to Mr. Olonde, who was working at a place about 65 yards away from the scene.

- (d) Mr. Alosa failed to follow fire instructions by not shouting fire, fire when he first saw smoke coming from the scene.

The claimants have in the main rested their case on the fact that nobody saw Mr. Alosa starting the fire, he did not smoke and therefore did not have any matches and there was no reason for him to have done so as they challenged the respondents' insinuation that he did so because he was denied permission to go to bank by submitting that there was no need for him to go to the bank because he did not have a bank account. Mr. Alosa and the claimants insinuated that one M. Simon, who had visited the parts and accessories warehouse that morning could be the culprit.

The court heard the evidence of M. Simon, who stated that although he used to smoke, on doctor's advice he had given up smoking and did not smoke at the material time. Moreover, he had visited the warehouse at 8.15 a.m. and he had been back in his office by 8.20 a.m. This statement was confirmed by J. A. Juma, who is the general supervisor, sales department. He also confirmed other aspects of Mr. Simon's evidence.

In the aforesaid circumstances the court has to determine if the respondents' action in dismissing Mr. Alosa is questionable. The court has very carefully considered this dispute and finds that it does not fall within the broad principles which the court has laid down when the court deems it necessary to interfere in the management's decision to terminate the services of an employee. Mr. Alosa was given every chance to defend himself when the respondents carried out their own investigation and the court cannot find any evidence to fault either the respondents' conclusion or even the findings of the ministry. The court, however, does not agree with the ministry's view that Mr. Alosa's guilt had not been proved beyond any reasonable doubt. In civil proceedings the conclusions have to be made on balance of probabilities and on this premise the court finds that the respondents were entitled to dismiss him as he did not act in the best interest of his employer and was guilty of gross misconduct.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE No. 100 OF 1983

Parties:

Kenya Union of Domestic, Hotels, Educational
Institutions, Hospitals and Allied Workers
and
Kenya Science Teachers College

Issue in dispute:

Transfer of Andrew Kamau.

THE Kenya Union of Domestic, Hotels, Educational Institutions, Hospitals and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Kenya Science Teachers College shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 13th March, 1984, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The claimants also called Mr. Kamau to give evidence in court.

AWARD

3. The Minister for Labour referred this dispute to the Industrial Court in accordance with section 8 of the Trade Disputes Act, which dispute was received by the court, on 25th October, 1983, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

It is not disputed that Andrew Kamau worked for the respondents as a carpenter grade 2 from 22nd April, 1968, till 1977 when a new company School Equipment Production Unit (SEPU) was set up which took over all the functions of the production unit department of the respondents. All the

respondents' employees in this department were seconded to the new company. On 27th February, 1978, the managing director of SEPU issued a letter of appointment to Mr. Kamau confirming his appointment as machine operator effective from 1st March, 1978. Mr. Kamau was asked to sign and return this letter. At some date after this letter was issued to him Mr. Kamau accepted the new appointment.

On 29th December, 1978, SEPU terminated his employment as he was absent from work from 15th and 19th December, 1978, without permission. He was given a normal termination.

It is not disputed that SEPU and the Kenya Engineering Workers' Union entered into a collective agreement on 1st March, 1978, covering all employees of SEPU which included Mr. Kamau also.

On 9th December, 1980, the claimants reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour on behalf of Mr. Kamau regarding (1) his transfer and (2) his termination by SEPU. The dispute was investigated on the first issue only by the ministry whose finding was that Mr. Kamau had been declared redundant by the respondents and the fact that he found a job with SEPU only mitigated his plight and recommended that he should be paid redundancy pay in accordance with the collective agreement between the parties. The respondents rejected this on the ground that Mr. Kamau was not their employee.

In determining this dispute the court must look at two letters dated 9th March and 20th April, 1978. The first letter was addressed to Mr. Kamau and read as follows:

"The K.S.T.C. board of governors hereby confirms that your terms and conditions of service/employment have been transferred from those of the K.S.T.C. board of governors to those of school equipment production unit. This transference takes effect retrospectively from the date of school equipment production unit's incorporation as a company."

The second letters dated 20th April was addressed by the managing director of SEPU to the branch secretary of the engineering union which read as follows:

"On each of the appointment letters it was stated the time the staff had been serving the production unit as K.S.T.C. board of governors employees, indicating that this time will be added to the time the staff is serving SEPU from 1st March, 1978, when calculating their time of service with SEPU."

The court finds that this above letter is to be read in conjunction with the letter of appointment issued to Mr. Kamau and the other staff on 27th February, 1978. The court is satisfied that this is a clear indication by SEPU that all the respondents' employees who were seconded or transferred to SEPU and were issued with new letters of appointment would carry with them their previous service rendered to the respondents. As a matter of fact it is obvious that this vital piece of evidence was overlooked during investigation because in the ministry's recommendation the following paragraph appears:

"It is further recommended that the transfer of Mr. Kamau's colleagues from K.S.T.C. to SEPU be regularized by a stipulation that their employment remains continuous. This recommendation is made on the grounds that should any of these "transferees" become redundant at SEPU the length of their service should be reckoned from the date of their first employment by the K.S.T.C."

The court has carefully considered the claimants' submission that Mr. Kamau's transfer from the respondents to SEPU was erroneous as there was no binding agreement between the two establishments to the effect of transfer. The court has carefully considered this point but in the light of the evidence produced during the hearing and which has been mentioned hereinabove the court cannot accept the claimants' submission on this point. SEPU took over Mr. Kamau and issued him a letter of appointment and further confirmed that his previous services rendered to the respondents would be added to his service with SEPU. It would be entirely wrong in view of this to hold the respondents liable for Mr. Kamau's years of service rendered to them between 22nd April, 1968 to 29th February, 1978. The court cannot accept that Mr. Kamau was declared redundant by the respondents because SEPU took over his years of service which he rendered to the respondents when he joined SEPU in early 1978 as they did in respect of all other employees also.

The court notes with interest that the Engineering Union is pursuing the matter of his termination by SEPU and several meetings were held between SEPU and the Engineering Union and the matter is now a trade dispute with the Minister for Labour. It is for this reason that the claimants did not pursue the issue of his termination as that is being taken care of by the Engineering Union.

The court has carefully considered all aspects of this dispute and has come to the conclusion that the claimants' demand is misconceived and the court therefore rejects all their demands made on behalf of Mr. Kamau like three months' wages in lieu of notice, 150 days' severance pay for redundancy and twelve months' salary by way of compensation for the wrongful redundancy. All these claims are unfounded and they are accordingly rejected.

The court would like to add that since Mr. Kamau's case of termination is being handled by the Engineering Union his previous years of service with the respondents which SEPU have accepted to honour will no doubt feature prominently in that dispute.
