The court arranged for the dispute to be heard on 21st November, 1983, but as the parties had defaulted in submitting their memorandum on the dates arranged the court fixed a fresh hearing date for 27th February, 1984.

On this date E. A. Sugar Industries Ltd. (respondents) raised a preliminary objection to the dispute being heard on the ground that the grievant is now a very senior civil servant and since civil servants are not allowed to belong to any trade union he was not entitled to be represented by the Kenya Management Staff Association (claimants). They argued that membership of the claimants goes against the presidential directive and further stated that Mr. Odera should have filed an action in the high court as civil servants are denied trade union representation.

The claimants have strongly resisted this application on the ground that when the cause of action arose Mr. Odera was not a civil servant and his dispute is against his former employers—the respondents. The fact that he was lucky to get a job in the civil service was no ground to bar him from pursuing his remedy through the claimants in accordance with the provisions of the Trade Disputes Act. They asked the court to reject the respondents' preliminary objection and proceed with the hearing.

The court notes that the respondents had not raised any objection either during investigations or when the former minister referred the dispute to the Industrial Court. In any case the court has carefully considered the respondents' objection and finds that there is no merit in it. If an employee who claims that he was wrongfully dismissed by an employer in the private sector is lucky to get a job in the government this fact in itself cannot bar him from pursuing his remedy against his former employer. The claimants are pursuing this dispute on his behalf because the cause of action arose prior to Mr. Odera joining the civil service and he is claiming compensation for the wrongful dismissal from the respondents. In these circumstances his being a civil servant now cannot deprive him of his rights under the Trade Disputes Act, through the claimants. The court therefore rejects the respondents' preliminary objection and directs the parties to appear before the court for a mention on 18th July, 1984, for fixing a fresh hearing date.

B.A.T. Kenya Ltd.

Issue in dispute:

Termination of services of C. Njeri Thumbi.

RULING

IN this dispute once again the respondents (B.A.T. Kenya Ltd.) have raised a similar preliminary objection as in cause No. 64 of 1983, on the ground that the grievant is now a civil servant and therefore not entitled to be represented by a trade union. They asked the court to discontinue the hearing on the same ground as the other case and direct the grievant to pursue his remedy in the high court.

The claimants have again strongly resisted this preliminary objection and stressed that at the material time the grievant was their member when she alleges she was wrongfully dismissed by the respondents and she is therefore entitled to pursue her remedy under the provisions of the Trade Disputes Act, through them. They again pointed out that the respondents had not raised this objection during investigations or prior to the minister referring the dispute to the Industrial Court, on 19th October, 1983.

The court rules that there is no merit in the respondents preliminary objection which is substantially the same as in cause No. 64 of 1983, and the court accordingly rejects their objection and orders that the hearing should proceed. The parties are required to attend a mention on 18th July in order to fix a new hearing date.

CAUSE No. 107 OF 1983

Parties:

Domestic and Hotel Workers' Union
and
Egerton College

Issue in dispute:

Misinterpretation of clause 5 of the minutes of meeting between the parties held on 16th March, 1972, over payment of KSh. 100 to employees as annual bonus.

THE Domestic and Hotel Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Egerton College shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 12th April, 1984, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 18th July, 1979, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 6th December, 1983, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

This is a most unusual case because as at the time of the hearing and even going back to about 1980 the claimants have lost practically all their membership of the respondents' employees. This is evident from the fact that after the first collective agreement between the parties signed on 25th September, 1968, which was amended slightly following the Ndegwa Commission report in 1971 in respect of wages in 1972 and further minor revisions in 1978 the claimants have not been active at all as far as terms and conditions of employment of the respondents' employees are concerned.

The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers attempted to recruit the workers into their membership but were restrained from doing so by the Registrar of Trade Unions.

With the above pattern of relationship between the parties the claimants have based their claim on the minutes of a meeting held on 16th March, 1972, over payment of KSh. 100 to employees as annual bonus.

The relevant minute which is recorded under minute B (5) reads as follows:

"A bonus of Sh. 100 was agreed for all middle grade and subordinate staff who had been in the service of the college for 4 years or more as at 1st July, 1971, service in either grade counting towards the 4 years."

The claimants have submitted that the respondents have failed to honour the above agreement. The claimants' interpretation of the above minute is that the respondents were to pay this bonus to all employees concerned at the rate of KSh. 100 per year per worker every year and accused the respondents of having committed a breach of faith. They referred the court to a minute of a meeting held on 16th and 17th February, 1978, between the parties where it was agreed as follows:

"College would pay the Sh. 100 bonus for all middle grade and subordinate staff who had been in the service of the college for 4 years or more as at 1st July, 1971, which was agreed at the meeting held on 16th March, 1972. The payment will be effected with salary of March, 1978."

The claimants alleged that after the above two meetings the respondents changed the interpretation in the agreement on bonus and maintained that it was to be paid once only and not annually as claimed by them. The claimants could not accept this interpretation and asked for this matter to be suspended until the dispute could be resolved. The claimants then reported the dispute to the Minister for Labour which could not, however, be resolved and the matter is now before the court. The claimants have urged the court to uphold their interpretation and order the respondents to pay the employees concerned their KSh. 100 bonus per worker per year from March, 1972, to date.

The respondents' main submissions are that the claimants' demand does not constitute a trade dispute as the item of bonus was never incorporated in the collective agreement which incorporated all the other items that were agreed between the parties in the 1972 meeting. Without prejudice to this the respondents pleaded that the only logical interpretation of the payment of the said bonus was once only payment of KSh. 100 to all the employees then in the service of the respondents who had completed at least four years as at 1st July, 1971. They have relied on minute No. C of March, 1972 meeting where it was clearly recorded and pointed out that the proposals would require the approval of both the board of governors and the government. They further added that the board of governors approved once and for all payment of bonus to the selected employees in the middle and subordinate grades.

The court has very carefully considered this matter and finds it most unusual that a claim has been formulated on an agreement recorded in the minutes of the parties meeting but which was not incorporated in the collective agreement. This fact alone makes the claimants' demand very weak because if it was the intention that this bonus was to be paid every year then it should have been so stated in the minutes and after that the claimants should have taken care to make sure the agreement was incorporated in the collective agreement which they failed to do.

The court feels that under the circumstances of this dispute the respondents' offer of making once and for all payment of KSh. 100 to their employees who had served them for four years as at 1st July, 1971, as a gesture of goodwill towards their employees is very fair and the court awards that they do so. The court finds that the claimants' interpretation is misconceived and the court appreciates the gesture of goodwill that the respondents have made in this dispute.

CAUSE No. 103 OF 1983

Parties:

Kenya Union of Domestic, Hotels, Educational Institutions,
Hospitals and Allied Workers
and
Banda School Ltd.

Issue in dispute:

Failure and refusal to negotiate with the union on collective agreement.

THE Kenya Union of Domestic, Hotels, Educational Institutions, Hospitals and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Banda School Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 14th March, 1984, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Minister for Labour referred this dispute to the Industrial Court in accordance with section 8 of the Trade Disputes Act which dispute was received on 25th October, 1983, together with the statutory certificates signed by the minister and the Labour Commissioner.

In this dispute the court has been asked to resolve whether the respondents who had been bound by another collective agreement for nearly over twenty years should be ordered to negotiate with the claimants simply because they have now signed a recognition agreement with them.

The simple facts are that the respondents are members of the Christian Churches Educational Association (C.C.E.A.) which body is in turn a member of a group of the Federation of Kenya Employers known as the Churches and Institutions associated with them. Other members of this group are other Christian associations like Y.W.C.A., Y.M.C.A., N.C.C. and so on. This group has negotiated a single collective agreement with the claimants and the latest agreement was registered by the Industrial Court under R.C.A. 32/83. The respondents are founder members of the C.C.E.A. and have therefore for nearly twenty years implemented the churches group collective agreement.

On the advice of the Federation of Kenya Employers the respondents signed a recognition agreement with the claimants on 26th March, 1982, and it is claimed that this was done in order to establish procedures for dispute settlement at shop floor level which otherwise are not covered under the collective agreement. Once the recognition agreement was signed the claimants approached the respondents for negotiating and signing a collective agreement with them. The respondents naturally refused to do so on the ground that they were members of the C.C.E.A. and therefore bound by the churches agreement.

The above facts are established and the point that has emerged is that the respondents are not a new institution and were established in Nairobi in 1966 and were not approached by the claimants for a recognition agreement until September, 1981, and it was after the signing of the recognition agreement on 24th March, 1982, that they are seeking to negotiate a collective agreement as distinct from the churches agreement. The claimants have stressed that the respondents are not by any means a religious organization or a church institution as they had wanted to know from them their denomination that qualified them to join the C.C.E.A. but got no satisfactory reply from them. The claimants put forward the argument and which to some extent has merit, if the respondents knew that they were members of the C.C.E.A. then they should have refused to sign a separate recognition agreement with them as the other members of the C.C.E.A. did not have separate recognition agreements with the claimants.

The respondents on the other hand stressed that at one stage the claimants' representatives had asked for proof of the respondents' membership of the C.C.E.A. and stated that on it being produced they would withdraw the demand for a separate collective agreement. They criticized the claimants for not being consistent in their approaches and pointed out that they had at no time denied that the respondents are implementing the churches agreement. Their attitude was that the claimants should try to go and improve the churches agreement if they wanted to improve the terms and conditions of the claimants' members and not pick on one member to do so.

The court notes that the respondents have about 450 students enrolled in their school and they claim that all the profits they make are ploughed back in the school. It is also not denied that they are registered under the Companies Act.

Notwithstanding the aforesaid points the court notes that in the recognition agreement the respondents under clause 2 (a) have conceded to the claimants the right to represent the interest of workers who are in their employment in all negotiable matters concerning rates of pay, overtime, hours of work, etc. including all negotiable conditions of employment. Further in the same recognition agreement in clause 3 (b) under the heading collective claims under which it is stated that these claims mean any claim for alteration to terms of service regarding matters specified in clause 2 (a) of the recognition agreement. It is further specified that these claims are to be raised and in the event of failure to reach a settlement of the dispute it would be processed in accordance with the Trade Dispute Act.

The court has carefully considered this dispute and has come to the conclusion that technically and legally the claimants' demand requiring the respondents to negotiate with them a collective agreement after signing the aforesaid recognition agreement is valid and the court has no option but to direct the respondents to start negotiations with the claimants on the expiry of the current churches group collective agreement. It is not for the court to advise the respondents as to the stand they should adopt during the collective agreement negotiations as they are no doubt competent in this regard and will also be assisted by the F.K.E.

The court would like to stress that once the parties have signed a recognition agreement then they have to abide by it and it would be most undesirable for the court to create a precedent which might give either party a liberty to negate certain important provisions of the recognition agreement after signing it.

Parties:

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and
Coffee Board of Kenya

Issues in dispute:

Annual leave.
Leave allowance.
Salaries increment.

RULING

IN this dispute the respondents have submitted that they were not prepared to make any offer or to negotiate with the claimants because their hands are tied by the government's directive through the Parastatals Advisory Committee (PAC) issued to all parastatals in category E to which they belong.

The respondents pointed out that after the Waruhiu Commission report salary scales were approved by the PAC which were implemented by them along with the other parastatals in their category. They submitted that they could not now submit or make any offer until they were authorized by the PAC and asked the court to stand over the dispute generally.

The claimants were very bitter at the respondents' attitude and referred to various other parastatals who had continued to negotiate with them. They specifically mentioned National Cereals Board and Post Office Savings Bank, both of which were in category E and also referred to Kenya Airways and Kenya Power & Lighting Co. Ltd., which were in category C and which had again negotiated collective agreements with their respective unions. They maintained that they had been given authority to negotiate and appeal to the government through the court that they should be told clearly whether or not they had a right to negotiate with the parastatals or with the PAC. They stressed that they were under pressure from their members totalling nearly 471 to press ahead with the dispute.

The court has carefully considered the matter and has come to the conclusion that the claimants have a right to negotiate with the respondents but since the salary scales which are currently in force were approved by the PAC after the Waruhiu Commission report the negotiations should be strictly based on these salary scales and terms of employment as approved by the PAC. The court cannot allow any negotiations which will take the respondents out of line with other parastatals in their category.

With the aforesaid directive the court orders the claimants and the respondents to embark on negotiations on the three items in dispute but the court would stress once again that these negotiations should be based on the existing salary scales as approved by the PAC.

The court would like the parties to conclude their negotiations or reach a deadlock and report back to the court within three months from the date of this ruling.
