NOTE

Incremental credits will be granted to successful candidates who are not civil servants for approved previous experience provided the maximum salary is not exceeded. They will also be eligible for benefits and privileges enjoyed by civil servants in accordance with existing government regulations.

*Vacancy in the Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources:**Senior Geologist (One Post) (No. 212/84)*

THE Transport and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Kenya Bus Services and Kenya Bus Services (Mombasa) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 18th October, 1983, and 14th May, 1984, and relied on their written and verbal submission.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 8th March, 1983, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 10th June, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties have had an overtime clause in their collective agreement for many years which partly reads as follows:

"4.1.1 for hours worked in excess of 45 hrs. per week a sum additional to the basic hourly rate which is equal to one half of the basic hourly rate i.e. time plus one half.

4.1.2 An employee required to work by the company on this rostered rest day or gazetted public holiday will be paid double time i.e. time plus time."

Sometimes in 1982 the respondents took certain steps to rectify what they alleged was a discrepancy in the payment of overtime which had resulted in payment of excessive overtime to their employees. This naturally resulted in the respondents' employees earnings dropping below the average which they used to earn prior to this rectification of the discrepancy.

The claimants took up the matter on behalf of their members and are contesting the adoption of the new method of working out overtime by the respondents and have alleged that the respondents are violating clause 4 (1) (2) of the collective agreement. They maintained that the workers are being grossly underpaid for overtime worked either on their rest days or public holidays. They accused the respondents of having breached the collective agreement by unilaterally revising their mode of calculation on overtime payment since April, 1982.

The respondents' contention is, or at least that is what they argued when the hearing of this dispute commenced, that they had been paying triple rates on overtime as far back as 1970 and it was not until early 1982 that they discovered their error and decided to rectify it from April, 1982. They added that since it was impossible to establish how or when the erroneous practice had started they had decided not to ask the employees to refund the money they had unjustifiably received in form of overtime payment. They argued that employees who worked either on rest days or public holidays shall have wages for that calculated at a double rate as the law does not state that an employee who works on gazetted public holidays would be paid in addition to the basic pay at double the time worked.

The court asked the Division of Manpower Planning and Development to carry out a factual investigation into this question of overtime at the respondents' undertaking and their report reveals that there is no documentary evidence to support triple payments as alleged by the respondents.

The court must express its astonishment that the parties should have been so confused especially the respondents with all their qualified accountants to allege that they were paying triple overtime payment to their employees. The court is constrained to express the view that it was incredible that with all the qualified accountants at the disposal of the respondents they should have made such a glaring error. As it turned out after the investigation they were not paying triple time! What they have as a matter of fact started doing from April, 1982, is that they have started applying the make up principle, that is workers' 45 hours per week are deducted from their total number of hours worked in that week and the balance of extra hours are paid by way of overtime at the higher rate of one and a half or double time. The court wonders why they did not from the very beginning disclose this instead of saying that the claimants were demanding triple time. It is only after the D.M.P.D. investigation that the respondents have now put forward the real change that they have brought about from April, 1982.

The court is satisfied that in most cases 45 hours per week are not met at the end of the week due to the respondents' duty roster/scheduling although the claimants' members are supposed to work 7.5 hours per day or a total of 45 hours a week.

The report also reveals that some workers who worked on either rest days or public holidays in different months from 1978 to 1981 were underpaid although the workers did not realize the underpayment.

The court finds it established that the method of calculating overtime payments prior to April, 1982, had been in operation for over ten years and the workers had naturally got used to fairly high monthly earnings especially when they worked on rest days or public holidays. This the respondents did although the overtime clause read exactly as it reads today.

The court finds that the collective agreement clause on overtime is quite clear and the respondents having interpreted it and implemented it in a manner which benefited the workers somewhat more it should be taken to mean that the respondents intended to remunerate workers in such a manner. The respondents having done so over ten years are clearly in the wrong in changing that system unilaterally and had it not been for industrial relations machinery having been set up in the country, they would have faced very serious industrial unrest by depriving the workers the benefits that they had enjoyed for over ten years. This practice has been in operation for such a long time that it can be deemed to be part and parcel of the relevant clause in the collective agreement.

The court has applied its mind very carefully to this dispute and finds that the claimants have a good case in that the respondents were wrong in bringing about changes from April, 1982, without embarking upon negotiations with the claimants. The court accordingly directs that the respondents should revert back to the system of overtime payments which they had adopted for over ten years, with effect from April, 1982, when they changed it and remunerate the workers affected according to the old system. The court further directs that they should continue with the old method of overtime payment until such time as they negotiate this issue with the claimants which will then be incorporated in the next collective agreement.

The parties will be at liberty to seek the assistance of Mr. Wangia of the D.M.P.D. if need be while calculating the arrears due to the workers.

The court would like to clarify that its award is not to change in any way the system of overtime payment which was being operated by both the respondents prior to April, 1982.



General Conditions

1. The grant will be prepared under the provision of the Trust Land Act and title will be issued under the Registered Land Act (Cap. 300).

2. The grant will be made in the name(s) of the allottee(s) as given in the letter of application and will be subject to special conditions set out below.

3. The term of the grant will be for ninety-nine (99) years from the first day of the month following the issue of letter of allotment.

Special Conditions

1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plan and specifications previously approved in writing by the local authority. The local authority shall not give approval unless it is satisfied that the proposals are as such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

2. The grantee shall within six calendar months of the actual registration of the lease submit in triplicate to the local authority plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and system of drainage for the disposal of sewage surface and sullage water) drawing elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within twenty-four (24) months of the actual registration of the lease complete the erection of such buildings and the construc-

tion of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the local authority provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained or implied by the Trust Land Act, if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the county council or any person authorized by the county council to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the county council in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at the time erected on the land.

4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the county council that she/he/is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the county council shall (at the grantee's expenses) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein.

Provided further that if such notice aforesaid shall be given within twelve (12) months of the commencement of the term, the county council shall refund to the grantee 50 per cent of the stand premium paid in respect of the land or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the county council shall refund to the grantee five per cent of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

5. The land and the buildings shall only be used for the purposes prescribed in the schedule hereto.

6. The buildings shall not cover a greater area of the land or such lesser area as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.

7. The land shall not be used for the purpose of any trade or business which the local authority considers to be dangerous or offensive.

8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land without prior consent in writing of the county council and the Commissioner of Lands.

9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until special condition No. 2 has been performed.

10. The grantee shall pay to the local authority on demand such sums as the local authority may estimate to be proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.

11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the local authority on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the local authority may assess.

12. Should the local authority at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the local authority on demand such proportion of the cost or such construction as the local authority may assess.

13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the local authority or the council in lieu thereof.

14. The county council or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all description whether overhead or underground and the lessee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments or main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

15. The county council reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th years of the term granted such rental will be at the rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the county council.

- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—**Kenya Gazette**

"D.14.(1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.
