THE LANDLORD AND TENANT (SHOPS, HOTELS AND CATERING ESTABLISHMENTS) ACT

(Cap. 301)

APPOINTMENT

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Landlord and Tenant (Shops, Hotels and Catering Establishments) Act, the Minister for Commerce and Industry appoints, in respect of the areas specified in the first column of the Schedule, the persons named in the second column to be members of the Business Premises Rent Tribunal for a period of three years, with effect from the dates respectively specified in the third column.
