Category and level.—Director category (D-1).

Organizational location.—Bureau of the comptroller sector for general administration.

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the overall supervision of the assistant director-general for general administration, the comptroller is the senior officer responsible for planning, directing and co-ordinating the activities of the bureau of the comptroller. As such his principal duties are as follows:

- (1) The calculation, assessment and collection of contributions from member states to the budget and the advances to the working capital fund.
- (2) The collection, safe custody, investment and disbursement of all funds of the organization, including those from extra-budgetary sources.
- (3) The maintenance of appropriate accounts to record such transactions and the preparation of periodical statements of account, balance sheets and other financial statements for presentation to the external auditor, the executive board, the general conference and other appropriate bodies.
- (4) All banking operations for the organization including under delegation of authority from the director-general opening and closing of bank accounts.
- (5) The maintenance of a system of internal expenditure control to ensure the continuous review of financial transactions.
- (6) The application and interpretation of the financial regulations as laid down by the general conference and the special regulations which govern the operations of extra-budgetary accounts.
- (7) The establishment and application of financial rules and procedures designed to ensure effective financial administration and the exercise of economy.
- (8) The administration and detailed operation of the social security system including the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund, Unesco Medical Benefits Fund, the staff compensation fund, a group life assurance scheme and other staff insurance policies.
- (9) The preparation of documents on financial and social security matters for the executive board and the general conference. Advising the director-general and the assistant director-general for general administration when these subjects are discussed and, when necessary, representing the director-general in these organs.
- (10) Co-ordination with the United Nations and specialized agencies on financial and social security matters.
- (11) Acts as chairman of the Unesco staff pension committee, the board of management of the medical benefits fund, the advisory board on compensation claims, the contracts committee, the headquarters contracts committee and as the representative of the director-general on the board of management of the Unesco staff savings and loan service.
- (12) The placing of all insurance business and negotiations with insurance companies, brokers and agents.
- (13) Relations with the competent authorities of member states on matters concerning tax and exchange regulations.
 - (14) Responsible for liaison with the external auditor.
- (15) Assuming any other relevant responsibility including advising the director-general on financial matters when requested.

Qualifications and experience required:

- (a) An authoritative knowledge of matters in the financial field, including a university degree, professional accreditation and attainment of high standards in the profession.
- (b) Wide and responsible professional experience in the field of finance, including both accountancy and administration.
- (c) Several years' experience in financial and accounting management at high level preferably in an international organization.

(d) A thorough knowledge of English or French and a good working knowledge of the other.

Salary and allowances.—Initial appointment will be at D-1 grade with a net annual salary equivalent to US\$49,406 (US\$45,387 if without dependants), plus the prescribed allowances: post adjustment, variable according to grade and step depending upon the cost of living at the duty station and the dollar exchange rate, at present US\$4,451 for staff members with dependants (US\$4,101 if without dependants); family allowance of US\$700 for each dependent child (if there is no dependent spouse, this indemnity is not payable in respect of the first dependent child). - 3. The term of the grant will be for ninety-nine (99) years from the first day of the month following the issue of the letter of allotment.

Special Conditions

- 1. No building shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any building otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE No. 52 of 1984

Parties:

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers and

Coffee Research Foundation

Issues in dispute:

Wrong conversion table of Waruhiu report on salary.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Coffee Research Foundation shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 9th January, 1985, 12th and 29th March, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

Award

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 24th January, 1984, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 31st May, 1984, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties entered into a collective agreement which was effective from 1st October, 1978, for a period of two (2) years and it expired on 30th September, 1980.

The parties to this dispute entered into re-negotiations to amend the said collective agreement reaching an agreement on all the issues except the one now before the court. The court caused extensive and exhaustive inquiries to be made into all related aspects of this dispute by the Division of Manpower Planning and Development and the court heard the parties as stated above. The dispute covers 63 employees out of a labour-force of 300 who are claimants' members.

In this dispute the claimants maintain that the conversion method adopted by the respondents was not in accordance with the recommendations of Waruhiu Report. The climants strongly argued that the creation of a new salary structure with 10 and 11 points had serious adverse effects on the employees annual increaments as opposed to old salary structure that had fifteen (15) salary pay points. To clarify their position the claimants emphasized that in some instances many salary points were grouped together and simultaneously converted into a single salary point. The claimants' contention is that the conversion was to be implemented on salary pay point to point for all the job groups.

The respondents submitted that the conversion tables evolved by the respondents are the fairest that could be worked out in view of the fact that both parties had agreed on the new salary structure. The respondents maintained that in the absence of counter-proposal of any conversion tables from the claimants theirs was the only appropriate one.

The respondents pleaded with the court that if the claimants' submission was accepted this would require another new salary structure in the place of the one agreed by the parties and approved by the Parastatals Advisory Committee (PAC).

The court is satisfied that the parties had reached and agreed on a new salary structure with 11 scales. The court also notes that though the claimants were challenging the respondents conversion tables, they themselves had not produced conversion tables which could fit in the salary structure agreed upon by the parties, until 9th January, 1985, when they were directed by the court to produce the said tables. The claimants produced their version of conversion tables on 12th March, 1985.

The court has carefully considered this dispute and is satisfied that the said 63 employees moved quite high up their scales and as such were able to reach maximum of the scales earlier than would have been the case with the old salary structure. The court finds that the employees were correctly converted and nobody was financially disadvantaged in any way by the conversion tables adopted by the respondents.

The court has also noted the fact that the agreement out of which this dispute arose has already expired and rules that the parties should see that negotiations for the next collective agreement are reopened immediately. In the meantime the court finds that the respondents conversion tables are proper and should remain in force. The court accordingly rejects the claimants demand.

Dismissal of Messrs. Gabriel Dikirr and J. Meyoki.

THE Kenya Union of Domestic, Hotels, Educational Institutions, Hospitals and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Tourist Promotion Services (Management) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 4th April, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. In addition they called the following witnesses:

Claimants.—G. Dikirr.

Respondents.-J. N. Karungu.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 2nd May, 1984, duly signed by the parties was received by the court together with the statutory certificate signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner on 20th August, 1984.

The first grievant Gabriel Dikirr was employed as a driver's attendant from 1st November, 1974. He was promoted to a bar waiter, the position he held until he was dismissed on 3rd March, 1983. The circumstances that led to his dismissal took place on 22nd March, 1983, at Mara Serena Lodge where Mr. Dikirr was working. A guest at the lodge complained to the manager that he was overcharged for spirits. The claimants pointed out that on the day in question, their member Mr. Dikirr was serving table No. 22 where the guest who complained about overcharging was sitting with others. Mr. Dikirr was called by the manager and asked to produce all the money he had on him at that time and he gave it to the manager. He was on the spot suspended from working. The following morning he received a dismissal letter from the manager. Mr. Dikkir was a member of the works committee and the claimants feel he was victimized because of his involvement in union matters. Mr. Dikirr reported the matter to the shopsteward who convened the works committee to go and see the manager who refused to see them. The claimants then took up the matter with the group personnel manager. On 13th May, 1983, the parties met at the lodge and interviewed workers who were working with Mr. Dikirr on the day in question. After discussing the matter the parties did not agree so the matter was referred to the Joint Industrial Council which in turn appointed a sub-committee which consisted of one official of the claimants and one official of the Kenya Association of Hotelkeepers and Caterers. The sub-committee met at the lodge on 21st June, 1983, and after their investigation and discussions, resolved that the management should reinstate Mr. Dikirr and transfer him to another Serena establishment or they reduce the summary dismissal to termination and pay Mr. Dikirr nine (9) months salary by way of compensation. The claimants accepted the recommendation by the sub-committee but the respondents refused and now the dispute is before the court.

The respondents pointed out that Mr. Dikirr was the one serving table No. 22 and that the complaints were directed against him and that Mr. Dikirr intentionally gave wrong change to the guest and also failed to give a receipt. The respondents also told the court that Mr. Dikirr when asked by the manager to produce all the money he had on him, became unco-operative and refused to give the money until he was persuaded by the shopsteward. The respondents felt that their stand was justified because their nature of work needed honest workers.

The court finds that Mr. Dikirr served the respondent for nine (9) years without a warning. The court also finds that Mr. Dikirr or the works committee were not given a hearing by the management. What is interesting in this dispute is that the respondents are members of the Kenya Association of Hotelkeepers and Caterers and the matter was referred to the Joint Industrial Council. The association's executive director, Mr. Havelock took up the investigation himself with the union. After his investigations and discussions with the union official.

this association's director found the dismissal of Mr. Dikirr to be wrongful and recommended reinstatement or payment of nine (9) months salary as compensation, which the respondents refused. After careful consideration of all the submissions the court can find no reason to differ from the said sub-committee's findings and the court awards that Mr. Dikirr be paid nine (9) months salary as compensation for the wrongful dismissal that he has suffered.

Jonathan Meyoki was employed by the respondents on 1st August, 1980, as a glass washer. The claimants disagreed that their member Mr. Meyoki deserted his place of work on 4th August, 1981, as stated in the dismissal letter. The claimants argued that the cause for Mr. Meyoki's dismissal was caused by a misunderstanding between the manager and the area game warder who is Mr. Meyoki's cousin. The management discovered that, the day following desertion by Mr. Meyoki he started working at the Buffalo Camp. Moreover Mr. Meyoki was discharged and paid all his dues which he accepted. He never complained of the dismissal until two (2) years later.

The court after considering submissions from both sides finds that there is no merit in this dispute regarding Mr. Meyoki and the court accordingly rejects the claimants demand.

Kenya National Union of Fishermen Workers and

Gupta Sea Tours Ltd.

Issue in dispute:

Dismissal of Lucy Atsewa.

THE Kenya National Union of Fishermen Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Gupta Tours Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 15th April, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

Award

3. The parties are in disagreement over the question of the alleged dismissal of Lucy Atsewa, a sales girl accussed of attempting to misappropriate company funds at Mombasa.

The respondents operate along the coast in and around Mombasa business of water sports, car hire and tourist safaris to places like Chale Island where they take tourists for their outing.

Their labour force based at Mombasa is 39 employees. At the time that this dispute arose, they were based at the cottages owned by them some 40 kilometres south of Mombasa. They had boats operating at Two Fishes and Trade Winds hotels.

The claimants submitted that Lucy Atsewa was employed by the respondents as a sales girl, with effect from 8th August, 1980, at a consolidated monthly wage of KSh. 700. The claimants stated that on 25th January, 1981, Daman Gupta, a director of the respondents engaged a young man by name of Rosario a non-Kenyan, who was to be trained by Miss Atsewa in the art of selling tickets and handling cash receipt books and their clients.

It was after two weeks when Rosario had been employed that Daman Gupta decided to dismiss Miss Atsewa under the pretext that she had misappropiated company funds amounting to KSh. 50 which it is alleged that she had not accounted for at the time Gupta had conducted a suprise check. Miss Atsewa had argued that on that particular occasion when she was caught for not issuing a receipt, one of the tourists had entered the boat late to join the four tourists on board when the captain was about to leave the sea shore and she could not therefore collect the money from him. This point was confirmed by the tourist himself when Daman Gupta called him to his office to testify.

The claimants went on to say that Daman Gupta had an intention of dismissing Miss Atsewa as she was involved in organizing members of the union, a thing Gupta did not like. However, Daman Gupta decided to warn Miss Atsewa but he never issued a proper letter of warning to her.

Finally, the claimants submitted that Miss Atsewa deserved a normal letter of warning only and should not have suffered loss of employment and other benefits. The claimants therefore plead that she should be reinstated and paid two months salary as compensation as it had been recommended by the Ministry of Labour.

The respondents stated that Lucy Atsewa was employed by them as a sales girl after she had been introduced to them as a sales girl by her sister who was a business associate of theirs. Miss Atsewa's sister was working at the Leopard Beach Hotel as a receptionist and used to give the respondents car hire business on commission. Miss Atsewa worked for the respondents for just over $6\frac{1}{2}$ months. She left the service of the respondents on 25th February, 1981. The immediate events leading to this termination were as follows according to the respondents:

On 1st February, 1981, Daman Gupta, one of the directors made a surprise visit at the Two Fishes Hotel, where Miss Atsewa was based. He found that the boat had taken clients for a ride. Mr. Gupta asked her how many people were aboard the boat. She told him that they were four. Mr. Gupta waited until the boat returned. In the meantime he checked the receipt book and found that actually four people had paid and issued with receipts. However, when the boat arrived there were five people on board. The fifth person had paid KSh. 50 for his ride but Miss Atsewa had not issued him with a receipt. Miss Atsewa's action of not making all passengers aboard pay first before enjoying the facility flouted the company's normal procedure which is that before any client boards a boat, he must have paid in cash. There is absolutely no room for credit. The respondents have no doubt that Miss Atsewa actually had an intention of not accounting for the extra KSh. 50 she had received from the fifth passenger on board. The respondents would have lost this money were it not for the surprise check.

When it was established that Miss Atsewa wanted to steal the KSh. 50 the management decided to give her a letter of warning which she refused to accept despite the fact that they gave her ample time to do so. By 25th February she still had not taken it and when the management insisted she ought to accept it, she deserted her employment.

In conclusion, the respondents submitted that the claimants statements contained in their submissions were not true and should not be relied upon. Some of the points raised such as the appointment of Miss Rosario had nothing to do with Miss Atsewa. Miss Rosario was to be trained to supervise the work on Chale Island as the work was expanding. An allegation that the firm was practising tribalism is unfounded as this assertion had no basis. The respondents submitted that an employer is within his rights to check and ensure that no employee is fiddling with cash and that they must follow the proper procedure laid down in performing their duties. Anyone found breaking the rules was liable to a warning or dismissal.

In view of what has been stated the court is asked to reject the claimants demands and award that as Miss Atsewa left her employment after refusing to sign her warning letter. The court should make a nil award in respect of all the claimants' demands.

The court has carefully considered the parties submissions and has come to the conclusion that Miss Atsewa had attempted to pocket the money purported to have been paid by the fifth tourist found on board when Mr. Gupta made a surprise visit. However, as she was treated leniently by her employer by only issuing her a warning letter which she refused to accept the court awards her one month's pay for loss of employment as she had served the respondents for six (6) months only.




