COLLECTION OF TRADE UNIONS DUES

 - (v) to make written returns to the registrar of trade unions within one (1) month of making all payments to that trade union and to the organization.

- The sum equivalent to two per cent (2%) from each employee's gross earnings per month subject to a maximum of one hundred (100) shillings per month less the sum of (5) shillings subject to two (2) below.
- The sum of five (5) shillings from each employee per month of the total sums so deducted in every month.

APPEAL No. 6 OF 1991

The Kenya Union of Employees of Voluntary Associations, Trade Unions and Allied Organizations

The Kenya Union of Domestic, Hotels, Educational Institutions, Hospitals and Allied Workers

(Interested Party)

THE Kenya Union of Employees of Voluntary Associations Trade Unions and Allied Organizations, shall hereinafter be referred to as the appellant.

- 2. The Honourable Minister for Labour, shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondent.
- 3. The Kudheiha workers, shall hereinafter be referred to as the interested party.

APPEAL

The appellant have lodged this application for leave to appeal under section 5 subsections (5) and (32) of the Trade Disputes Act (Cap. 234), challenging the validity of the minister's decision to invoke the provisions of section 5 (1) (a) and (c) in rejecting a dispute over alleged dismissals of:

- (1) Ng'ang'a Muiruri; and (2) John Bosco Munywoki.

The dispute has been filed against the Thika Maternity Hos-

The appellant made very detailed and comprehensive submissions during the hearing of this application for leave to appeal on 11th September, 1991, which the court considered

The appellant submitted that under sections 5 (5) and 32 they had a right of appeal against the minister's decision made under section 5 (1) (a) and (c) of the Trade Disputes Act. The appellant further stated that the court had in the past dismissed a number of their applications for leave to appeal on the grounds that the appellants have no right of appeal where the minister rejects the report of a trade dispute under section 5 (1) (a) and (c).

The respondents and the interested party averred that the appellant had no right of appeal against an order made under section 5 (1) (a) and (c) of the Trade Disputes Act. They argued that the appellant's right of appeal is only allowed when an order is made under section 5 (1) (b). They felt that the appellant was wasting time in view of the fact that the court had ruled in five (5) previous similar cases that no right of appeal exists under section 5 1 (a) and (c). The appellant was accused of indirectly trying to appeal against the court's rulings in the previous cases. They requested the court to dismiss the leave to appeal against the minister's decision.

The appellant having failed to put forward any worthwhile arguments in favour of the application for leave to appeal the court has no hesitation in dismissing this application.

The application is accordingly dismissed.

THE respondents were incorporated as a limited liability company in 1982, and their main object is the manufacture of shoes. They have a workforce of 280 employees. In 1985, the respondents accorded the claimants recognition, and since then to date the parties have had dealings between themselves.

Mr. Alexandar B. Lumiti (hereinafter referred to as "the grievant") was initiably employed in June, 1984, by the respondents as a casual worker at a daily wage of Sh. 37.50 payable fortnightly. On 2nd May, 1986, the grievant was placed on permament terms of employment in the assembly department at which his duties included, amongst others, lasting-i.e. joining of the uppers and the soles of shoes, marking and glueing them etc. In February 1988, he was transferred to the stitching department where the was responsible for ensuring that the uppers of shoes were in good condition for assembly. The grievant was deployed further in March 1989 to the cutting department where he was assigned the duties of cutting sports shoes straips. He worked in that capacity until 4th July, 1989i.e. for a period of three months—when he was summarily dismissed for alleged carelessness and negligence in cutting the said straps on 3rd July, 1989, which resulted in a massive loss or damage to the respondents. The grievant had, at the time of this dismissal, served the respondents for a period of five (5) years, and his basic salary was Sh. 1,104.50, together with a house allowance of Sh. 400 per month.

The claimants took up the matter, on behalf of the grievant, with the respondents, but after several meetings between the parties at their own level no amicable settlement was reached. In the circumstances, the claimants formally reported a trade dispute to the Manister for Labour in terms of section 4 of the disputite to the Manister for Labour in terms or section 4 or the Trade Disputes Act (Cap. 234), and C. N. Mwangi (Mrs.), of Industrial Area Labour Office, Natioobi, was appointed to act as an investigation Anising out of the parties submitsions before the investigation and her findings, the minister recommended to the parties on 21st September, 1990, that the grievant "be paid two (2) months' salary as compensation for wrongful termination of employment he suffered in addition to all terminal dues payable to him in accordance with the parties collective bargaining agreement."

The claimants accepted the minister's recommendation, even though lit fell short of their expectation, but the respondents nejected it. Consequently, on 15th October, 1990, the parties signed a Notification of Dispute Form "A", and submitted it to the court under section 14 (7) of the said Act for the adjudication of this dispute. The same, accompanied by the statutory certificates from the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner under section 14 (9) (e) and (f) of the Alct, were received by the count on 27th February, 1991, and the matter is now before the court for consideration

The chairmants, prayed the court to reinstate the grievant to his former job without loss of benefits and nights for the period he has been out of employment; or, in the alternative, award that he be palid the following terminal benefits:

- (i) Notice as per parties collective agreement.
- (ii) Days worked.
- (iiii) Leave on pro-rata basis.
- (iv) 12 months' salary as compensation for loss of employment.
- (v) Leave travelling allowance.

In response the respondents submitted that the grievant was dismissed for gross negligence because he did not seek assistanice from the section heald, under whom he worked concerning the operations in the cutting department. He had been given prior warnings about his poor work performance, but he did most heed them. Hence his dismissal as above.

Finally, the respondents submitted that the claimants' case has no menit at all, and prayed the count to reject it as baseless.

The grievant was summarily dismissed on the ground of negligent and careless performance of this work which allegedly occasioned a massive loss or damage to the respondents. The grievant's employment record speaks for itself; on 2nd May, 1986, he was placed on permanent terms of employment in the assembly department, in February 1988, he was transferred to the stritching department and in March 1989, he was transferred further to the cutting department from where he was summarily dismissed after three (3) months as aforestated. The grievant's duties in the outting department involved outting the uppers

of sports shoes straps, the skill of which he was expected to acquire after a month's one-the-job training; and the misconduct for which he was summarily dismissed was committed on one single occasion.

The simple question for consideration, therefore, is whether, on the language of section 17 (c) of the Employment Act (Cap. 226), which is reproducted below, the grievant carelessly and improperly performed his work—

Here the words "wilfully neglects to perform" or "carelessly and improperly performs" are not used in disjunctive sense. In our opinion it is habitual careless and improper performance of work which is to be treated as misconduct so as to bring it within the mischief of section 17 (c) hereinabove. The fact that the negligent or careless and improper performance of duty may continue over several months would not make it habitual negligence or careless and improper penformance of work. It is a well recognized principle of law that to carry out the intention of the legislature, it is occasionally found necessary to use the conjuction "or" and "and" one for the other. Since the above sub-clause is penal, we are, therefore, inclined to construe it favourably to the grievant, and hold that one single instance of negligent or careless and improper performance of duty, as in the present case, cannot be termed as habitual negligence or careless and improper performance of

As regards the warning letters on record to the grievant, we find only the first one, dated 8th December, 1987, relevant to this case, but it had lapsed at the time the respondents summarily dismissed the gnievant. The evidence adduced on behalf of the respondents is also of no consequence in this matter, and we disregard the same.

Accordingly, we finded that the grievants' summary dismissal was wrongful; and in view of this we award that the dismissal be reduced to normal termination of service with full terminal benefits in accordance with the provisions of the parties' collective agreement in force at the time. In addition, we direct that the respondents do pay the grievant seven (7) months' salary as compensation for the wrongful dismissal he has suffered.

The grievant is not, however, entitled to any leave and leave traveffing allowance because he had taken this annual leave for the year 1989. We award as above.

Issue in dispute:

"Study leave payment to Paul K. Ng'ethe, from June, 1985, to January, 1986."

THE Kudheiha workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Jomo Kenyatta College of Agriculture and Technology shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 12th September, 1991, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 22nd August, 1990, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 22nd May, 1991, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The grievant was employed by the respondents on 1st January. 1983, as a demonstrator (fruit growing), earning KSh. 1,390 plus a house allowance of KSh. 600 p.m., respectively. He was placed in job group "F" in the service of the respondents.

The circumstances leading to this dispute happened on 12th September, 1984, when the grievant undertook a nine (9) months advanced course in floriculture in Japan. The grievant left the country on 22nd May, 1985, resuming his duties on 21st February, 1986. This dispute revolves around the alleged failure by the respondents to pay the grievant 80 per cent of his basic salary of KSh. 1,390 p.m. for a period of nine (9) months totalling KSh. 10,008. The claimants further alleged that the respondents had violated the parties collective agreement clause 35 under study leave.

The claimants urged the court to find that the respondents acted contrary to the parties collective agreement clause 35 and make an award in their favour on this matter. The respondents urged the court to dismiss the claimant's claim as baseless and without any merit.

The facts of this dispute clearly show that the grievant had himself through his own efforts organized to go for training in flower growing in Japan through the Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers.

It is also on record that subsequently the respondents assisted him by writing officially to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education, Science and Technology, on 24th April, 1985, stating that they recommended the grievant for training and requested for Government clearance before his departure for Japan in May, 1985.

On 6th May, 1985, the grievant applied for a request for study leave and on 21st May, 1985, the Principal/Secretary Board of Governors informed him in writing that the college will grant him study leave without pay for the period, 22nd May, 1985 to 21st February, 1986.

The grievant then proceeded to Japan and after completing the course he came back and was in due course promoted to a higher grade with an increase in salary. The grievant is no longer working for the respondents having decided to leave the service.

The claimants raised this dispute on behalf of the grievant under clause 35 of the collective agreement which reads:

"When an employee is following an approved course of study, locally or outside Kenya he/she shall continue to draw 80 per cent of his basic salary during the period of the course."

The court finds that at no stage were the clearly laid down Government procedures followed in the grievant's visit to Japan for further studies. Moreover he was clearly informed that his study leave was to be without pay.

The grievant is relying on the official letters written on his behalf by the respondents to facilitate his visit to Japan to argue that the grievant went on an approved course of study.

The court finds that it would be stretching matters too far when the Government assists an employee to pursue a course in another country arrangements for which the employee has made himself to require the Government institution to consider it as a study leave with pay.

The court finds that the claimants demand for 80 per cent of the grievant's salary for the nine (9) months he was in Japan is not sustainable as it was not an officially approved study

The court notes that the claimants had stated that, at some stage in the pre-industrial court procedure the respondents had offered to pay the grievant some salary but surely that was on the promise that the claimants would settle the dispute at that stage.

The claimants having lost that opportunity the court can not help them any more.

For the foregoing reasons, the claimants' demands are rejected.
