The successful candidate shall be the head of the ministry's public relations section and shall be in charge of the public relations and protocol matters. He/she shall also be responsible for co-ordination of information and ministerial policy guidelines, arranging interviews for the minister and assistant ministers and other senior officers, preparing briefs for interview, arrangements for press reports and coverage, among others.

Information Officer I (One Post) (No. 81/96)

Computer Operations Officer I (Two Posts) (No. 94/96)

Requirements for appointment:

For appointment to the grade of computer operations officer II, job group "J", one must have—

- (i) served as computer operations officer III, job group "H", for a minimum period of three (3) years;

(f) Supervising, directing and training of staff at lower levels.

Successful applicants must be ready to work in district or provincial level.

Occupational Health and Safety Officer I (Two Posts) (No. 104/96)

Salary scale.—K£5,694 to 8,127 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Requirements for appointment:

Applicants must be Kenyan citizens in possession of bachelor's degree in science or engineering from a recognized university or equivalent institution.

They must have served in the grade of occupational health and safety officer II, job group "K" and have shown professional competence and ability required for this level.

Duties and responsibilities:

(a) Enforcement of the Factories and Other Places of Work Act and its subsidiary legislation to ensure a safe work environment.
