Terms of Reference:

- 1. The terms of reference of the Taskforce are to develop an Election Dispute Resolution (EDR) Bench Book for the following objectives:
 - (a) Provide summary of procedure in the EDR process.

- To highlight key legal issues and legal provisions from the Constitution, legislation and regulations governing EDR.
- To distill and present EDR jurisprudence in thematic areas of the EDR process.
- (d) To provide a quick reference of key resources and authorities for key thematic areas in EDR.
- 2. In the performance of its functions, the Taskforce-
- (a) shall hold such number of meetings in such places and at such times as the Committee may consider necessary for the proper discharge of its functions;
- (b) may use official reports of any previous studies, policies and legislation relevant to its mandate;
- (c) may conduct forums and receive views from members of the bar and the bench and receive oral and written submissions from any person with relevant information; and
- (d) may seek the assistance of expert(s) as is necessary for better fulfilment of its task.
- 3. The Committee shall regulate its own procedure.
- 4. The Committee shall prepare and submit to the Chairperson Judiciary Committee on Elections, monthly progress reports.

5. Reporting

In the performance of its functions, the Committee shall be responsible to the Chairperson of the Judiciary Committee on Elections.

6. Terms of office

The Committee shall submit the final report and the EDR Bench Book to the Judiciary within seven (7) months from the date of gazettement.

Secretariat

The Judiciary Committee on Elections Secretariat shall provide secretariat support to the Committee.

National Treasury

- 2. The Secretariat of the Steering Committee shall be at the National Treasury and shall be headed by the Financial Services Authority Director of Implementation and comprise of such staff as the Steering Committee shall appoint from the Capital Markets Authority, the Insurance Regulatory Authority, the Retirement Benefits Authority and the Sacco Societies Regulatory Authority, and any other person whom the Steering Committee considers necessary, to carry out technical work, day to day operational and administrative duties in support of the Steering Committee.
 - 3. The terms of reference of the Steering Committee are to-
 - (a) undertake all preparatory work required for the establishment and operationalisation of the Financial Services Authority;
 - (b) have overall responsibility for transition of the Capital Markets Authority, the Insurance Regulatory Authority, the Retirement Benefits Authority and the Sacco Societies Regulatory Authority to the Financial Services Authority, including the development of the legal, regulatory and institutional framework;
 - (c) oversee all areas of work required to ensure adequate planning and preparation for the establishment of the Financial Services Authority and successful transition;
 - (d) ensure that all required legal, policy, organisational integration, change management work is planned, resourced and completed on a timely basis;
 - (e) undertake a full assessment of the costs, risks and potential disruption of the transition from the Capital Markets Authority, the Insurance Regulatory Authority, the Retirement Benefits Authority and the Sacco Societies Regulatory Authority and implement mitigation strategies and activities;
 - (f) design and implement communications and public awareness activities aimed at informing all stakeholders about the anticipated change and reform;
 - (g) engage and consult various stakeholders within the financial and other sectors who are likely to be affected by the establishment of the Financial Services Authority;
 - (h) review all the laws and regulations in the capital markets, insurance, pensions and Sacco sector to ensure they are fully aligned and supportive of the Financial Services Authority and its overall framework;
 - identify office space or building from where the Financial Services Authority will be headquartered and operate from, once its law is enacted and the Authority is made operational;
 - (j) source, commit and deploy any human, financial, or expert and other resources required for the transition and operationalization of the Financial Services Authority; and
 - (k) perform any other functions necessary to ensure successful transition, establishment and implementation of the Financial Services Authority and other allied reforms.
- 4. In the performance of its functions, the Steering Committee shall hold meetings in such places and at such times as the Steering Committee shall consider necessary for the proper discharge of its functions and regulate its own procedures.
- The Steering Committee shall prepare and submit progress reports once in every quarter to the Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury.
- The Steering Committee may co-opt such persons from other Government departments and institutions as it considers necessary for the performance of its functions.

 The appointment of the Steering Committee shall take effect from the date of publication of this notice and will cease on the date of appointment of the Board of Directors of the Financial Services Authority.

THE LEADERSHIP AND INTEGRITY ACT

(No. 19 of 2012)

THE LEADERSHIP AND INTEGRITY CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STATE OFFICERS IN THE MINISTRY OF DEPENCE

PURSUANT to section 37 of the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012, the Defence Council issues the Leadership and Integrity Code of Conduct set out in the Schedule hereto, to be observed by and binding upon State officers of the Ministry of Defence.

SCHEDULB

PART I-STATEMENT OF INTENT

This Leadership and Integrity Code for State officers in the Ministry of Defence is made pursuant to the provisions of section 37 of the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012, and is intended to establish standards of integrity and ethical conduct in the leadership of the Ministry of Defence by ensuring that the State officers respect the values, principles and requirements of the Constitution in the discharge of their duties.

PART II—PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

Citation

- This Code may be cited as the Leadership and Integrity Code for State officers in the Ministry of Defence and shall come into operation upon publication.
 - 2. In this Code, unless the context otherwise requires -
 - "Act" means the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012;
- "bank account" has the meaning assigned to it under section 2 of the Act:

"business associate" has the meaning assigned to it under section 2 of the Act;

"Code" means the Leadership and Integrity Code for State officers in the Ministry of Defence;

"Commission" means the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission established under section 3 of the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission Act, 2011;

"Defence Council" means the Defence Council established under Article 241(5) of the Constitution;

"Defence Forces" means the Kenya Defence Forces established by Article 241 of the Constitution; "dependant" means a person whose means of support is partially or wholly derived from a State Officer;

"Ministry" means the Ministry of Defence;

"personal interest" means a matter in which a State officer has a direct or indirect pecuniary or non-pecuniary interest and includes the interest of his or her spouse, child, business associate or agent;

"spouse" has the meaning assigned to it under section 2 of the Act; and

"State officer" means the Cabinet Secretary for Defence, Chief of the Defence Forces, Principal Secretary for Defence, Vice Chief of the Defence Forces and the three Service Commanders of the Defence Forces:

Application of the Code

3. This Code shall apply to State officers in the Ministry.

Application of the Constitution and the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003.

- 4. (1) The provisions of Chapter Six of the Constitution shall form part of this Code.
- (2) Unless otherwise provided in this Code, the provisions of the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003, shall form part of this Code in so far as they conform to the provisions of the Act.

State officer to sign Code

- 5. (1) Pursuant to section 40 of the Act, a State officer shall sign and commit to this Code at the time of taking oath of office or within seven days of assuming office.
- (2) A serving State officer shall sign and commit to this Code seven days after the publication of the Code in the Gazette.
- (3) The declaration of commitment to the Code shall take the form and structure set out in Appendix to this Schedule.

PART II - REQUIREMENTS

Rule of law

- (1) A State officer shall respect and abide by this Code, the Constitution and the law.
- (2) A State officer shall carry out the duties of his or her office in accordance with the law.
- (3) In carrying out the duties of his or her office, a State officer shall not violate the rights and fundamental freedoms of any person unless otherwise expressly provided for in the law and in accordance with Article 24 of the Constitution.

Public trust

7. A State office is a position of public trust and the authority and responsibility vested in a State officer shall be exercised by the State officer in the best interest of the Ministry and the people of Kenya.

Responsibility and duties

8. Subject to the Constitution and any other law, a State officer shall take personal responsibility for the reasonably foresceable consequences of any actions or omissions arising from the discharge of the duties of his or her office.

Performance of duties

- 9. (1) A State officer shall in accordance with the law and to the best of his or her ability—
 - (a) carry out the duties of the office efficiently and honestly;
 - (b) carry out the duties of the office in a transparent and accountable manner;
 - (c) keep accurate records and documents relating to the functions of the office; and
 - (d) report truthfully on all matters relating to his or her office.

Professionalism

- 10. A State officer shall-
- (a) carry out duties of his or her office in a manner that maintains public confidence in the integrity of the office;
- (b) treat members of the public and other State and public officers with courtesy and respect;
- (c) not discriminate against any person, except as is expressly provided for by the law;

- (d) to the extent appropriate to the office, maintain high standards of performance and level of professionalism within the Ministry; and
- (e) if a State officer is a member of a professional body, observe and subscribe to the ethical and professional requirements of that body in so far as the requirements do not contravene the Constitution, the Act or any other law or this Code.

Financial probity

- 11. (1) A State officer shall not use his or her office to unlawfully or wrongfully enrich himself or herself or any other person.
- (2) Subject to Article 76(2)(b) of the Constitution, a State officer shall not accept a personal loan or benefit which may compromise the State officer in carrying out his or her duties;
- (3) A State Officer shall submit an initial declaration of assets and liabilities within thirty days of assuming office and thereafter in accordance with section 27 of the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003.
- (4) A declaration filed by a State officer in accordance with subparagraph (3) shall be accessible to the Commission and any other person subject to the provisions of section 30 of the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003.

Moral and ethical requirements.

- 12. A State officer shall observe and maintain the following ethical and moral requirements—
 - (a) demonstrate honesty in the conduct of his or her public affairs;
 - (b) not engage in activities that amount to abuse of office;
 - (c) accurately and honestly represent information to the public;
 - (d) not engage in wrongful conduct in furtherance of personal benefit;
 - (e) not misuse public resources;
 - (f) not engage in actions which would lead to the State officer's removal from the membership of a professional body in accordance with the law; and
 - (g) not sexually harass or have inappropriate sexual relations with other State officers, staff of the Ministry or any other person; or
 - (h) not commit any criminal offence contemplated under section 13(1)(i) of the Act.

Gifts and benefits in kind

- 13. (1) A gift or donation given to a State officer on a public or official occasion shall be treated as a gift or donation to the Ministry.
- (2) Despite subparagraph (1), a State officer may receive a gift given in an official capacity, provided that the gift—
 - (a) is within the ordinary bounds of propriety, a usual expression of courtesy or protocol and within the ordinary standards of hospitality;
 - (b) is not monetary; or
 - (c) does not exceed the value prescribed by the Commission under the Act or any other law.
- (3) Without limiting the generality of subparagraph (2), a State officer shall not—
 - (a) accept or solicit gifts, hospitality or other benefits from a person who—
 - (i) has an interest that may be achieved by the carrying out or not carrying out of the State Officer's duties;
 - (ii) carries on regulated activities with respect to which the Ministry has a role; or
 - (iii) has a contractual or legal relationship with the Ministry.
 - (b) gifts of jewelry or other gifts comprising of precious metals or stones, ivory or any other animal part protected under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora; or
 - (c) any other type of gift specified by the Commission or the Defence Council from time to time.

- (4) Subject to subparagraph (2), a State officer who receives a gift or donation shall declare the gift or donation to the Ministry within fourteen days from the date of receipt of the gift.
- (5) The Ministry shall maintain a register of all gifts received by State officers as provided for in the Act and Regulations made thereunder.

Wrongful and unlawful acquisition of property

14. A state officer shall not use the office to wrongfully or unlawfully acquire or influence the acquisition of property for self or any other person.

Conflict of interest.

- 15. (1) A State officer shall use the best efforts to avoid being in a situation where personal interests conflict or appear to conflict with his or her official duties.
- (2) Without limiting the generality of subparagraph (1), a State officer shall not hold shares or have any other interest in a corporation, partnership or other body, directly or through another person, if holding those shares or having that interest would result in a conflict with the State officer's personal interests and official duties.
- (3) A State officer whose personal interest conflict with their official duties shall declare the personal interest to the Defence Council or the Commission.
- (4) The Commission or the Defence Council may give directions, in writing, on the appropriate action to be taken by the State officer to avoid the conflict of interest and the State officer shall comply with the directions, and refrain from participating in any deliberations with respect to the matter.
- (5) Despite any directions to the contrary under subparagraph (4), a State officer shall not award or influence the award of a contract to—
 - (a) himself or herself:
 - (b) the State officer's spouse ouchild:
 - (c) a business associate or agent; or
 - a corporation, private company, partnership or other body in which the State officer has a substantial or controlling interest.
- (6) Where a State officer is present at a meeting, and an issue which is likely to result in a conflict of interest is to be discussed, the State officer shall declare the interest at the beginning of the meeting or before the issue is deliberated upon.
- (7) A declaration of a conflict of interest under subparagraph (6) shall be recorded in the minutes of that meeting.
- (8) The Ministry shall open and maintain a register of conflicts of interest in a prescribed form in which an affected State officer shall register the particulars of registrable interests, stating the nature and extent of the conflict.
- (9) For purposes of subparagraph (8), the registrable interests shall include
 - (a) the interests set out in the Second Schedule of the Act;
 - (b) any connection with a person or a company, whether by relation, friendship, holding of shares or otherwise, which is subject of an investigation by the Ministry;
 - (c) any application for employment or other form of engagement with the Ministry, by a family member or friend of the State officer or by a corporation associated with a State officer:
 - (d) any application to the Ministry, by a family member or friend of the State officer, for clearance with respect to appointment or election to any public office;
 - (e) any other matter which, in the opinion of the State officer, taking into account the circumstances thereof, is necessary for registration as a conflict of interest.
- (10) The Ministry shall keep the register of conflicts of interest for five years after the last entry in each volume of the register.
- (11) A State officer shall ensure that an entry of registrable interests under subparagraph (8) is updated and to notify the Ministry of any changes in the registrable interest, within one month of each change occurring.

Participation in tenders

16. (1) A State officer shall not participate in a tender for the supply of goods or services to the Ministry.

- (2) Despite subparagraph (1), a company or entity shall not be construed as trading with the Ministry unless—
 - (a) the State officer has controlling shareholding in the company or entity; or
 - (b) the State officer is a Director of the Company.

Public collections

- 17. A State officer shall not-
- (a) solicit for contributions from the public for a private or public purpose unless the President has by a notice in the gazette declared a national disaster and allowed, a public collection for the purpose of the national disaster in accordance with the law; or
- (h) participate in a public collection of funds ir; a way that reflects adversely on that State officer's integrity, impartiality or interferes with the performance of his or her official duties.

Bank accounts outside Kenya

- 18. (1) Subject to Article 76(2) of the Constitution or any other written law, a State officer shall not open or continue to operate a bank account outside Kenya without the approval of the Commission.
- (2) A State officer who has reasonable grounds for opening or operating a bank account outside Kenya shall ar ply to the Commission for approval to open or operate such a bank account.
- (3) A State officer who operates or controls the operation of a bank account outside Kenya shall submit statements of the account annually to the Commission and authorize the Commission to verify the statements and any other relevant in formation from the foreign financial institution in which the account is held.
- (4) Subject to subparagraphs (1) s/d (2), a person who is appointed as a State officer in the Ministry and has a bank account outside Kenya shall, upon such appointment, close the bank account within six months.

Acting for foreigners

- 19. (1) A State officer 'shall not be an agent of, or further the interests of a foreign government, organization or individual in a manner that may be detrimental to the security interests of Kenya.
 - (2) For purposes of this paragraph --
 - (a) an individua, is a foreigner if the individual is not a citizen of Kenya; and,
 - (b) an organization is foreign if it is established outside Kenya or is owner or controlled by a foreign government, organization or individual.

Care of prope rty

- 20. (1) A State officer shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that public property in the State officer's custody, possession or control is taken crare of and is in good repair and condition.
- (%) A State officer shall surrender to the Ministry all public property in his or her custody, possession or control at the end of the ar pointment term.
- (3) A State officer who contravenes subparagraphs (1) or (2) shall, in addition to any other penalties provided for under the Constitution, the Act or any other law, be personally liable for any loss or damage to the public property.

Misuse of official information

- 21. (1) A State officer shall not directly or indirectly use or allow any person under the his or her authority to use any information obtained through or in connection with the office, which is not available in the public domain, for the furthering of any private interest, whether financial or otherwise.
- (2) Subject to section 49 of the Kenya Defence Forces Act, 2012, the provisions of subsection (1), shall not apply where the information is to be used for the purpose of
 - (a) furthering the Interests of the Act; or
 - (b) educational, research, literary, scientific work or other purposes not prohibited by law.

Political neutrality

22. Pursuant and subject to section 23 of the Act, an appointed State officer, in the performance of his or her duties shall not—

- act as an agent for, or further the interests of a political party or candidate in an election;
- (b) manifest support for or opposition to any political party or candidate in an election; or
- (c) engage in any political activity that may compromise or be seen to compromise the political neutrality of the office subject to any laws relating to elections.

Impartiality

23. A State officer shall, at all times, carry out the duties of the office with impartiality and objectivity in accordance with Articles 10, 27, 73(2)(b) and 232 of the Constitution and shall not practice favoritism, nepotism, tribalism, cronyism, religious bias or engage in corrupt or unethical practices.

Giving advise

24. A State officer who has a duty to give advice shall give honest, accurate and impartial advice without fear or favour.

Gainful employment

- 25. (1) A full time State officer shall not participate in any other gainful employment.
- (2) For the purposes of subparagraph (1), "gainful employment" means work that a person may pursue and perform for money or other form of compensation or remuneration which is inherently incompatible with the responsibilities of the State office or which results in the impairment of the judgment of a State officer in the execution of the functions of the State office or results in a conflict of interest in terms of section 16 of the Act.

Offers of future employment

- 26. (1) A State officer shall not allow himself or herself to be influenced in the performance of his or her duties by plans or expectations for or offers of future employment or benefits.
- (2) A State officer shall disclose, in writing, to the Ministry all offers of future employment or benefits that could place the State officer in a situation of conflict of interest.

Engagement of former state officers in similar matters

27. A former State officer shall not be engaged by or act for a person or entity in a matter in which the officer was originally engaged in as a State officer, for at least two years after leaving the Ministry.

Misleading the public

28. A State officer shall not knowingly give false or misleading information to any person.

Falsification of records

 A State officer shall not falsify any records or misrepresent information to the public.

Citizenship

- 30. (1) Pursuant to Article 78(3) of the Constitution, a State officer who acquires dual citizenship shall lose his or her position as a State officer.
- (2) A person who holds dual citizenship shall, upon appointment to a State office, not take office before officially renouncing their other citizenship in accordance with the provisions of the Kenya Citizenship and Immigration Act, 2011.

Conduct of private affairs

31. A State officer shall conduct his or her private affairs in a manner that inspires public confidence in the integrity of his or her office.

Tax, financial and legal obligations

 A State officer shall pay any taxes levies or loans due from him or her within the prescribed period.

Bullying

- 33. (1) A State officer shall not bully another State officer, a member of staff or any other person.
- (2) For purposes of subparagraph (1), "bullying" includes repeated offensive behavior which is vindictive, cruel, malicious or humiliating and is intended to undermine a person.

Acting through others

- 34. (1) A State officer shall not-
- (a) cause anything to be done through another person that would constitute a contravention of this Code, the Constitution or any other law if done by the State officer; or

- (b) allow or direct a person under his or her supervision or control to do anything that is in contravention of this Code, the Constitution or any other law.
- (2) Subparagraph (1)(b) shall not apply where anything is done without the State officer's knowledge or consent if the State officer has taken reasonable steps to prevent it.
- (3) A State officer who acts under an unlawful direction shall be responsible for his or her actions.

Reporting improper orders

- 35. (1) If a State officer considers that anything required of him or her is in contravention of the Code or is otherwise improper or unethical, the State officer shall report the matter to the Commission or the Defence Council.
- (2) The Commission or the Defence Council shall investigate the report and take appropriate action within ninety days of receiving the report.
- (3) The action contemplated in subparagraph (2) above includes referral of the matter to an agency that has jurisdiction under any written law to act on the reported matter.

Confidentiality

36. A State officer shall not disclose or cause to be disclosed any information in his or her custody to any unauthorized person.

Breach of the Code.

- 37. (1) Subject to subsection (2), a breach of this Code amounts to misconduct for which the State officer may be subjected to disciplinary proceedings.
- (2) Where an allegation of the breach of this Code has been made against a State officer in respect of whom the Constitution or any other law provides the procedure for removal or dismissal, proceedings for removal or dismissal shall be taken in accordance with the Constitution or that other law.
- (3) Despite the foregoing, a State Officer who contravenes any provision of this Code commits an offence and shall upon conviction by a court martial be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years or a fine not exceeding five million shillings or to both.
- (4) Subparagraph (3) above shall only apply to State officers who are officers commissioned in any service of the Kenya Defence Forces.

Lodging of complaints and investigations

- 38. (1) A person who alleges that a State officer has committed a breach of this Code, may lodge a complaint with the Commission or the Defence Council and the Commission or the Defence Council shall register and inquire into the complaint.
- (2) A State officer being investigated under this paragraph shall be informed by the investigating authority, of the complaint made against him or her and shall be given a reasonable opportunity to make a representation relating to the issue, before the investigation is concluded.
- (3) Where an investigation under this paragraph is initiated while the State officer is in office, it may be continued even after the person under investigation has ceased to be a State officer.
- (4) Despite subparagraphs (1), (2) and (3) and where appropriate, complaints against State officers who are officers may be reported in accordance with section 303 of the Kenya Defence Forces Act, 2012, and the regulations made thereunder.
- (5) A State officer who is subject to investigations under this paragraph may be suspended from office until the investigations are completed.

Advisory opinion

39. A State officer may, through the Defence Council, request the Commission to give an advisory opinion on any issue relating to the application of Chapter Six of the Constitution.

Promotion of ethics, integrity and best practices in the office

40. State officers in the Ministry shall collectively and individually take measures to ensure that members of staff and stakeholders of the Ministry uphold and fully implement national values and principles of governance as stipulated in Article 10 of the Constitution.

Implementation of the Code

41. The Defence Council shall be responsible for the full implementation of this Code in accordance with Part IV of the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012.

Review of the Code.

42. The Code shall be reviewed at such intervals as the Defence Council may determine or as appropriately as may be advised by the Commission.

prepare quarterly reports setting out the number of reports made to the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) under section 35 of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003 as read with section 11(1) (d) of the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission Act, 2011.

Section 36 provides that:

- The Commission shall prepare quarterly reports setting out the number of reports made to the Director of Public Prosecutions under section 35 and such other statistical information relating to those reports, as the Commission considers appropriate.
- A quarterly report shall indicate if a recommendation of the Commission to prosecute a person for corruption or economic crime was accepted or not accepted.
- The Commission shall give a copy of each quarterly report to the Attorney-General.
- The Attorney-General shall lay a copy of each quarterly report before the National Assembly.
- The Commission shall cause each quarterly report to be published in the Gazette.

This report is therefore made pursuant to section 36 of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003. The report covers the First Quarter and is for the period commencing 1st January, 2016 to 31st March, 2016.

INVESTIGATION REPORTS COVERING THE PERIOD 1ST JANUARY, 2016 TO 31ST MARCH, 2016

EACC CR. 021/48/2015 CF: MOMBASA ACC. 11/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against a Foreman in-charge of Dockers at the Kenya Ports Authority

Investigations revealed that the suspect, being a person employed by a public body to wit, Kenya Ports Authority (KPA) as a foreman in charge of Dockers corruptly solicited and received a benefit of KSA. 80,000 from the complainant as an inducement to facilitate him get employment at KPA, a matter relating to the affairs of the said public body.

A report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecution on 4th January, 2016 with a recommendation to prosecute the suspect for offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39(3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act.

On 1st March, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

CR.148/28/2015 THIKA ACC. NO. 6696/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Askaris of the Kiambu County Government

Investigations revealed that the suspects who are employees of Kiambu County Government corruptly solicited and received a benefit of KSh. 2,000 from the complainant as an inducement not to tow away his lorry and to forbear charging him with the offence of transporting goods without a delivery licence.

A report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecution on 5th January, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspects with the offences of corruptly sollclting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39(3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 22nd February, 2016, the DPP concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

CR.343/342/2015 CF: NO.ACC.15/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against a Senior Probation Officer based at Mariakani

Investigations revealed that the suspect who is a Probation Officer based at Mariakani solicited and received a benefit of KSh. 16,000 from the complainant as an inducement to prepare a favourable report in a case where the complainant was convicted of the charge of stealing by servant in a matter before Mariakanl Law Courts.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 5th February, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspect with the offences of corruptly sollciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39(3) (a) of the Anti-corruption and Economic Crimes Act.

On 14th March, 2016, the DPP concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/FI/INQ/124/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Misappropriation of KSh. 25 billion proceeds of the sale of the Sovereign Bond (Eurobond) by the National Treasury

Investigations revealed that:

The Medlum Term Debt Management Strategy 2013-2016 which was approved by the Cabinet laid the foundation on Government burrowing. It is on the basis of Medium Term Debt Management Strategy 2013-2016 that Eurobond was floated. Among the needs to be addressed by the Eurobond finances was to cover the Budget deficit that the Government was experiencing.

The National Treasury issued instructions to the Central Bank of Kenya to open off shore collection accounts for the proceeds. The CBK opened an Account No. 60314995 known as 'Sovereign Bond Proceeds Account' held at JP Morgan Chase Bank, New York for the Original Sale of US \$ 2 billion. On 27th November, 2014, CBK, under the instructions from the National Treasury, opened another Account No. 36341018 known as 'GOK/CBK Sovereign Bond Tap Proceeds Account' held at Citibank New York tap sale of US \$ 750 million.

The Government eventually raised a total of US \$2.815 billion in the year 2014. This was US \$2 billion of original sale received in JP Morgan Account on 24th June, 2015 and US \$815 million in tap sales received in the Citibank New York account on 3rd December, 2014.

On 3rd July, 2015, the Government paid a syndicated loan of US\$ 604,560,737.50 off from the JP Morgan Chase Bank.

After the payment of the syndicated loan the balance of KSh.196, 916,669,316.00 was surrendered to the National Exchequer Account on diverse dates.

Eurobond proceeds were utilized as part of the National Budget with withdrawals being approved by the Controller of Budget. The National Treasury in the Financial Year 2013/2014 and Financial Year 2014/2015 distributed funds to the various ministries and state departments. Investigations did not reveal that there was any misappropriation of the proceeds of Eurobond.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 8th February, 2016, recommending that the file be closed with a referral to the Office of the Auditor-General being an independent body with the mandate to audit accounts under Article 229 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, so as to carry out a Special Audit on the Development Projects that were implemented by ministries, departments and agencies (MDA's) in the Financial Year 2013/2014 and Financial Year 2014/2015 to ascertain the utilization and value for money.

On 25th January, 2016, the DPP directed that further Investigations be conducted.

CR. 764/601/2015 CF. NAIVASHA NO.1/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against two (2) KRA officers in Naivasha

The investigations revealed that the suspects who are KRA officers solicited and received KSh. 50,000 from the complainant to forbear charging him for not having complied with the provisions of section 69 of Legal Notice No. 110 of Value Added Tax Act (VAT) Cap. 476, Laws of Kenya.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 13th January, 2016 with recommendation for the prosecution of the two (2) KRA suspects with the offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving under section 39 (3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act.

On 19th February, 2016, the DPP concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/FI/OPS/INQ.NO. 39/2015

Inquiry into Allegation of Bribery against Nairobi City County Parking Attendants

Investigations commenced after EACC received anonymous reports from members of the public and the Nairobi City County (NCC) that parking attendants from specific parking areas were collecting fees from motorists and that they were not remitting the money to NCC.

EACC carried out an Integrity Testing on the concerned Nairobi City Parking Attendants and they failed the tests. However the nature of the tests carried out did not meet the required evidence threshold for prosecution.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 13th January, 2016 with recommendation of administrative action against the Parking Attendants and improvements of revenue collection systems of NCC.

On 23rd March, 2016, the DPP concurred with the recommendation for administrative action.

CR.148/31/2015 CF. NO. ACC25/2015, MILIMANI

Inquiry into Allegation of Corruption against an intern based at the Ministry of Lands

The investigations revealed that the suspect, an officer attached to the Ministry of Lands based at Ardhi House solicited for and received a benefit of KSh. 1,500 from the complainant so as to retrieve a file which was due for title deed processing.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 26th January, 2016 recommending prosecution of the suspect with the offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit under section 39(3) (a) of the Anti-corruption and Economic Crimes Act.

On 9th March, 2016, the DPP concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/MSA/FI/INQ/13/2013

Inquiry into Allegations that the former Magarini CDF Fund Manager abused his office by awarding bursaries to himself and another

Investigations revealed that the CDF manager awarded bursaries to himself and another person as students of Kenyatta University by Magarini Constituency Development Fund yet the two did not qualify.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 11th January, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspect with the offences of abuse of office contrary to section 46, Fraudulent Acquisition of Public Property contrary to section 45 (1) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act and uttering a false document contrary to section 353 of the Penal Code.

On 10th February, 2016, the DPP concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/PI/INQ/124/14

Inquiry into Allegations against the Director-General of the National Youth Service for servicing and maintaining a privately owned vehicle reg. No. KBS 475S at the expense of NYS at the cost of 497,335.

Investigations revealed that motor vehicle reg. KBS 475S Land Rover Discovery is privately owned by the former Director General of National Youth Service (NYS) and that the motor vehicle reg. GK Z185 Land Rover Discovery belongs to NYS. motor vehicle reg. KBS 475S was delivered for service at RMA Motors Limited but the vehicle that was registered for service was GK Z185.KBS 475S was serviced at a cost of KSh. 497,335 and the same was paid by NYS.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 13th January, 2016, recommending prosecution of the concerned NYS officials with the offences of abuse of office contrary to section 46, Fraudulent Acquisition of Public Property contrary to section 45 (1) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act and conspiracy to defraud contrary to section 63 of the Penal Code.

On 4th February, 2016, the DPP concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

CR.148/29/2015 CF NO.ACC.23/2015 MILIMANI

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against, a Public Health Officer at the City Hall, Nairobi

Investigations established that the suspect, a public health officer at the City Hall, Nairobi solicited for and received KSh. 40,000 a benefit from the complainant as an inducement to forebear charges for non-compliance with notice of inspection on sanitation of premises under the Public Health Act. Cap. 242 Laws of Kenya.

A report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecution on 2nd February, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspect with the offence of soliciting for and receiving a benefit under section 39(3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act.

On 18th April, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/MSA/ACC/14/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against a Survey Assistant with the Ministry of Lands, Mombasa

Investigation revealed that the suspect, a Survey Assistant at the Ministry of Lands Mombasa solicited and received KSh. 5,000 from the complainant in order to release a sketch map to him.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 10th February, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspect with the offence of corruptly soliciting and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act. 2003.

On 31st May, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with our recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/KSM/CF/930/185/2015

Inquiry into Allegation of Corruption against a Prosecution Counsel based in Busia Law Court

Investigation revealed that the suspect, a Prosecution Counsel based in Busia solicited for and received a benefit of KSh. 7,000 from the complainant so as to facilitate the release of a motorcycle which had been confiscated by police officers and retained at Busia Police Station.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 11th February, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspect with the offence of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 11th March, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with the recommendation to prosecute.

CR.421/142/2015, MERU AC. NO. 6/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against a Meru Paralegal Community Organization Co-ordinator

Investigations established that the suspect who is a co-ordinator Meru Paralegal Community Organization solicited for and received a benefit of KSh. 10,000 from the complainant as an inducement to make a favourable recommendation for the complainant who had a misunderstanding with the wife on the maintenance of their child.

A report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Prosecution on 15th February, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspect with the offences of soliciting and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 26th May, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

CR.421/174/2015 MERU ACC.7/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against a Police Officer serving at Archers Post Police Station

Investigations revealed that a police officer at Archers Post Police Station solicited for and received a benefit of KSh. 2000 as an inducement to release the complainant from police castody who had been arrested after committing an offence of obstruction.

A report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Prosecution on 15th February, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspect with the offence of soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 23rd March, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/OPS/INQ.NO.41/2015

Inquiry into Allegation of Bribery against Nairobi City County Parking Attendants in Westlands

Investigations commenced after EACC received anonymous reports from members of the public and the Nairobi City County (NCC) that parking attendants from specific parking areas were collecting fees from motorists and that they were not remitting the money to NCC.

EACC carried out an Integrity Testing on the concerned Nairabi City Parking attendants and they failed the tests. However the nature of the tests carried out did not meet the required evidence threshold for prosecution.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecutions on 16th February, 2016, with recommendation for closure.

On 14th June, 2016, the DPP concurred with the recommendation for closure.

EACC/INQ/OPS/08/2016

Inquiry into Allegations that the Governor of Murang'a Commity
Obstructed EACC officers from executing a search warrant

Investigations established that EACC secured orders to search the Governor's office, residence and business premises. EACC officers proceeded to the above premises to carry out the search and as they were carrying out the search, the Governor indicated to them that they would not carry away some of his documents. Shortly a group of supporters of the Governor appeared and snatched the documents that had been recovered by EACC officers and took off with them.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 18th February, 2016, with recommendation for the charge of obstruction contrary to section 66 (1) (a) of Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003 and that the findings be forwarded to the Senate so as to take appropriate action as per provisions of Article 181 of the Constitution.

On 9th March, 2016, the DPP concurred with our recommendation.

17 CR.148/2/2016 MILIMANI ACC.2/2016

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against a Draughtsman, Nairobi City County

Investigations revealed that the suspect, an employee of the Nairobi City County working as a Draughtsman solicited for KSh. 30,000 from the complainant as an inducement to allow him to continue with the construction of house at Lucky Summer Area.

A report was prepared on 22nd February, 2016 and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution recommending prosecution of the suspect with the offence of soliciting for a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 18th April, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/FI/INQ/104/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Irregular Procurement of Accommodation and Conference Facilities by the National Youth Service (NYS)

Investigations revealed that NYS officials secured M/S Narumoro River Lodge for conference facilities at a cost of KSh. 4,114,255 without adhering to laid down procurement procedures.

A report was prepared on 15th February, 2016 and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution recommending surcharging of the Acting Director-General and a charge of Abuse of Office contrary to section 46 of prosecution Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 10th March, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with our recommendations.

EACC/ISL/FI/INO.7/2014

Inquiry into Allegations of Irregular Awarding of Tender for Erection of Perimeter Fence for Proposed Site for County Government Offices and Misappropriation of Funds in Marsabit County

Investigations revealed that Marsabit County Government Tender Committee used Restricted Tendering without meeting the prescribed conditions in an attempt to regularize a flawed procurement process used to award a tender to undertake the erection of a perimeter fence on a land proposed to house county headquarters.

A report was prepared on 15th February, 2016 and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecution recommending several charges among then wilful failure to comply with applicable Procurement Procedures contrary to section 45 (2) (b), abuse of office contrary to section 46 of prosecution Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 9th March, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with our recommendations.

EACC/KSM/INO/FI/06/2014

Inquiry into Allegations of Corrupt Conduct against the Chief Manager, Finance in the Payment of Salaries to Persons who are not Employees of the Lake Victoria South Water Service Board

Investigations revealed that Chief Manager, Finance used to insert the names of his wife and a mason who was constructing his residential house, persons who were not employees of the board in the pay roll of board employees and a total of KSh. 12,009,590 was irregularly paid out.

A report was prepared on 15th February, 2016 and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecution recommending several charges among then, Fraudulent Disposal of Public Property contrary to section 45 (1) (b) and abuse of office contrary to section 46 of prosecution Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 9th March, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with the recommendations for prosecution.

CR.148/35/2015 CF. ACC.NO.30/2015

Inquiry into Allegation of Corruption against a Police Officer attached to Tassia Police Patrol Base and another

Investigation revealed that the suspect who is a police officer solicited for and received a bribe of KSh. 5,000 from the complainant as an inducement to release the complainant's brother from custody after having been arrested by officials from the Music Copyright Society of Kenya for playing music in a public place without a licence.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 23rd February, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspect for an offence of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit under section 39 (3) (a) and (b) of Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 10th May, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with the recommendation for prosecution.

CR. EACC/916/INQ/426/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Police Officers attached to the Webuye Weighbridge

Investigations revealed that police officers who are employees of National Police Service failed to discharge their duty of diverting all trucks for weighing and taking action against those that disobeyed their orders to divert.

A report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecution on 24th February, 2016, recommending that the suspects be charged with the offence of abuse of office contrary to section 46 as read with section 48 of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 13th July, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with our recommendation to prosecute.

148/33/2015 CF. NO.ACC.27/2015 MILIMANI

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Police Officers attached to Jogoo House Police Station

Investigations established that the suspects are police officers who are employees of National Police Services, solicited and received KSh. 300,000 from the complainant as an inducement to forebear the charges of possessing fake bank currency.

A report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecution on 10th March, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspects with an offence of soliciting and receiving a benefit under section 39 (3) (a) and (b) of Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 24th June, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with our recommendation to prosecute.

EACC: MOMBASA RP/INQ.022/2015 CF. CR. 1091/2015

Inquiry into Allegation of Corruption against an Employee of Kenya Power and Lighting Company Limited

Investigations established that the suspects who are employees of Kenya Power and Lighting Company corruptly solicited and received KSh.15,000 from the complainant as an inducement to forbear charging him for an illegal connection of a meter box.

A report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecution on 23rd February, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspects with the offence of soliciting and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39(3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 7th April, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions accepted recommendation for prosecution.

CR. 148/23/2015 CF THIKA ACC. 6005/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Dealing with Suspect Property against two
Police Officers attached to Kabete Police Station

The Commission commenced investigation following complaints from members of the public that Traffic Police Officers along Waiyaki Way at Kabete Police Station were taking bribes from motorists without conducting traffic inspections.

The Commission conducted surveillance on the Traffic Police Officers along the Waiyaki Way, two police officers were captured receiving bribes from motorists and thereafter the vehicles would be allowed to pass without a traffic inspection.

On 25th February, 2016, a report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecution recommending charges of dealing with suspect property under section 47 of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 22nd March, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with our recommendation to prosecute.

CR. 781/574/2015 ACC. 1583/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption during KDF Recruitment Exercise at Narok County

Investigations established that at the recruitment exercise of KDF officers in Olololunga Stadium in Narok South Sub-County the suspects offered to give KSh.100,000 to the KDF officers conducting the interviews in order to secure slots in the recruitment. Investigations further revealed that the suspects were taken to DCI Narok where they were interrogated for bribing KDF officers. DPP directed that the matter be taken over by EACC.

A report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecutions 25th February, 2016, recommending that the suspects be charged with offences of corruptly offering a benefit contrary to section 39(3) (b) of Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 14th June, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with our recommendation to prosecute.

CR 421/180/2015 MERU ACC, NO. 8/2015

Inquiry into Allegation of Corruption a Chief Adjudication and Settlement Officer Tigania East Sub-County, Meru County

Investigation revealed that the suspect is a Chief Land Adjudication and Settlement Officer, Tigania East Sub-County, Meru County corruptly solicited for a benefit of and received KSh. 30,000 as an inducement to make a ruling in favour of the complainant in a land dispute.

A report was prepared and forwarded to Director of Public Prosecution on 25th February, 2016, recommending prosecution of the suspects for soliciting and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act.

On 25th May, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecution concurred with our recommendation to prosecute.

EACC/FI/OPS/INQ.NO.39/2015

Inquiry into Allegation of Bribery against Nairobi City County Parking Attendants within Ngara Area and Kijabe Street

Investigations commenced after EACC received anonymous reports from members of the public and the Nairobi City County (NCC) that parking attendants from specific parking areas were collecting fees from motorists and that they were not remitting the money to NCC.

EACC carried out an Integrity Testing on the concerned Nairobi City Parking attendants and they failed the tests. However the nature of the tests carried out did not meet the threshold evidence required for a criminal matter.

A report was prepared and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution on 1st March, 2016, with recommendation for closure.

On 22nd March, 2016, the Director of Public Prosecutions concurred with our recommendation.

Preamble

The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission is required under section 36 of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003, to prepare quarterly reports setting out the number of reports made to the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) under section 35 of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003 as read with section 11(1):

(d) of the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission Act, 2011.

Section 36 provides that:

- The Commission shall prepare quarterly reports setting out the number of reports made to the Director of Public Prosecutions under section 35 and such other statistical Information relating to those reports, as the Commission considers appropriate.
- A quarterly report shall indicate if a recommendation of the Commission to prosecute a person for corruption or economic crime was accepted or not accepted.
- The Commission shall give a copy of each quarterly report to the Attorney-General.
- The Attorney-General shall lay a copy of each quarterly report before the National Assembly.
- The Commission shall cause each quarterly report to be published in the Gazette.

This report is therefore made pursuant to section 36 of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003. The report covers second quarter and is for the period commencing 1st April, 2016 to 30th June, 2016.

INVESTIGATION REPORTS COVERING THE PERIOD 1ST APRIL, 2016 TO 30TH JUNE, 2016

EACC/EL/25/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Officers of the Technical and Vocational Education and Training Authority.

The EACC commenced investigations on receipt of allegations that officials from the Technical and Vocational Training Authority (TVETA), had extorted money from North Pole College in order to frustrate the college's competitors so as not to register and issue them with relevant licences.

Investigations revealed that the officials of TVETA did not solicit, neither receive bribes from the college. Further financial investigations found no suspicious financial transactions on the part of the officials.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) on 4th April, 2016, recommending closure of the Inquiry Pile.

On 14th June, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for closure of the file.

EACC/FI/INQ/03/2013

Inquiry into Alleged Embezzlement of KSh. 20 million from Tigania CDF Funds meant for Tigania Water Supply Augmentation Project

Investigations established that in the financial year 2008/2009 the Tigania CDF was allocated KSh. 10 million for Tigania Water Project. That however this project was taken over by the Government for implementation at a cost of KSh. 80 million and that part of the sum allocated, KSh. 9 million was properly re-allocated to other projects within the constituency. Investigations however established that the Fund Manager and Office Manager at the CDF re-allocated KSh. 1 million to Baingeru Water Project without the relevant approval from the National Constituencies Development Fund Board.

MR/2470445

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th April, 2016, recommending that the Fund Manager and Office Manager at the Tigania CDF be charged with the offence of wilful fallure to comply with the law relating to incurring expenditure contrary to section 45 (2) (b) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 15th July, 2016, the DPP declined the recommendation for prosecution but advised that administrative action be taken against the said officials.

BACC/ISL/FI/INQ 15/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Irregular Recruitment of the Chief Officer Finance, Meru County

Investigations established that the position of Chief Officer Finance (COF) became vacant at Meru County Government following the transfer of the previous office holder. That the County Public Service Board (CPSB) then advertised for the post and six applicants applied. The board shortlisted four of the applicants and invited them for interview. Only three turned up for interview and the board accordingly interviewed them.

The investigations further established that on conclusion of the interview, some of the board members convened another interview panel that interviewed the person who finally got the job as COF. In the process of doing this the panel came up with minutes ostensibly to show that proper interview had taken place which were presented to the CPS Band County Assembly for appointment of the latest interviewee into the position of COF.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th April, 2016, recommending that the Chairperson and Member of the Meru County Public Service Board and County Executive Committee Member who interviewed and recommended the employment of the said interviewee as the Chief Officer Finance, together with the interviewee (Chief Finance Officer) himself, to be charged variously for the offences of abuse of office contrary to section 46 as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003, conspiracy to commit an offence of corruption contrary to 47A (3) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003 and deceiving principal contrary to section 41as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

It was further recommended that the members of the Meru County Assembly to be sensitized on the need to adhere to the law when carrying out their public duties as investigations established that they flouted Part II of Leadership and Integrity Act.

On 14th June, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution and sensitization of members of the Meru County Assembly on the requirements of Part II of Leadership and Integrity Act.

EACC/FI/INQ /35/2015

Inquiry into Allegations that Members of the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) Received KSh. 1.5 million from the former Interior Permanent Secretary to Expunge his name from the Committee's Report on Unexplained Expenditure at the Office of the President

Investigations revealed that the former Interior Permanent Secretary did not give any bribe to members of PAC and that no officer at the Office of the President gave the PAC Chairman bribe of KSh. 5 million so as to allegedly influence them to come up with a favourable report regarding the allegation on unexplained expenditure at the Office of the President during the Financial Year 2012/2013.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th April, 2016, recommending closure of the file with no further action.

On 31st May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation that the file be closed with no further action.

EACC/MSA/EL/INQ. 6/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Irregularities in Employment by the Taita Taveta County Public Service Board

Investigations revealed that the Taita Taveta County Government had the need to recruit Medical Social Workers. The County Public Service Board (the board) then initiated this recruitment by advertising for the posts that attracted a number of applicants including the complainant. The board then shortlisted and interviewed the

applicants. The board however at the end settled on other applicants, leaving out the complainant who had emerged as the best, on considerations based on Article 10 the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and section 65 (2) of the County Government Act. The best candidate complained.

Investigations established that the board was right in law to overlook the best candidate in recommending other applicants for the vacant positions based on the legal considerations such as regional balance, gender, ethnicity, amongst others.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th April, 2016, recommending that the file be closed with no further action.

On 6th June, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation that the file be closed with no further action.

EACC/ EL/INQ. 41/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Unethical Conduct by a Member of County Assembly (MCA) Central Gem Ward, Siaya County

Investigations revealed that the Member of County Assembly, Central Gem Ward stripped himself naked as he addressed members of the Press within the precincts of the Siaya County Assembly. This incident was reported to the Committee of Privileges of the Siaya County Assembly. This committee deliberated on this conduct and meted out the relevant sanction as per the law.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th April, 2016, recommending that EACC issues a warning letter to the MCA against further violation of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 and that the MCA tenders a public apology regarding that conduct.

On 11th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for a caution letter be issued to the MCA and also the need for him to make a public apology.

CR. 148/30/2015 ACC NO. 26/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruptly Soliciting and Receiving a Benefit against a Volunteer Children's Officer based at Westlands Nairobi

Investigations revealed that the suspect solicited for a benefit of KSh. 10,000 from the complainant but received a benefit of KSh. 6,000 as an inducement to compile a favourable evaluation report.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th April, 2016, recommending that the suspect be charged with offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 13th May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

CR: 314/302/2015 CF: NO. ACC 20/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against an Employee of SGS

Limited Based at Mariakani Weighbridge in Kilifi County

Investigations revealed that the suspect who at the time was working for SGS Ltd. in the company of a police officer had stopped the complainant wife's truck for alleged overloading and removed the reg. No. plate from that truck. He then solicited for a benefit of KSh. 50,000 which he later on reduced to KSh. 30,000 but received a benefit of KSh. 10,000 as an inducement to return the number plate.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th April, 2016, recommending that the suspect be charged with offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 31st May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/MSA/FI/INQ/12/2015

Inquiry into Allegations that Technical University of Mombasa Irregularly Procured Smart TVs

Investigations revealed that the suspects, the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Administration, Finance and Planning and the Chairperson and members of the Tender Committee for Technical University of Mombasa, procured Smart TV sets worth KSh. 4.75 million, yet the said procurement was not in the procurement plan or budget for the University's financial year 2014/2015, thereby flouting several provisions of the Public Procurement and Disposal Act, 2005.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th April, 2016 recommending that the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Administration, Finance and Planning and the Chairperson and members of the Tender Committee for Technical University of Mombasa be charged with one count of engaging in a project without prior planning contrary to section 45 (2) (c) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; four counts of wilful failure to comply with the law relating to procurement contrary to section 45 (2) (b) as read with section 48 (i) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; and one count of abuse of office contrary to section 46 as read with section 48 (i) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 14th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

BACC/FI/INO/118/2014

Inquiry into Allegations that Turkana County awarded Kabarait
Builders and Contractors a Contract to Rehabilitate KaiokolLobolo-Elive Springs Road at an Inflated Amount

Investigation established that the County Government of Turkana in the FY 2013/2014 had allocated KSh. 350 million, in the Supplementary Budget Estimates of 14th March, 2014 for the construction and up-grading of feeder roads. Thereafter the County Government advertised for the prequalification for the supply and provision of works, goods and services leading to compilation of a prequalified list.

Investigations revealed that the County Government then used the restrictive tendering method in awarding M/s. Kabarait Builders and Contractors the tender for the construction of Kalokol Lobolo Eliye Springs at KSh. 10,544,400. The contractor embarked on the construction and finally received payment in the sum of KSh. 10,122,623.60 less VAT, withholding tax and supervision fees.

Investigations further revealed the works done were worth KSh. 8, 178,000 meaning that the contractors were overpaid by KShs. 2,366,400. It was also established that an employee of the County Government, who was also in the employment of Kenya Rurai Roads Authority as Roads Superintendent, was paid KSh. 1,630,686 allegedly as supervision fees which he was not entitled to.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th April, 2016, recommending that the Head of Supply Chain, Chief Finance Officer at the Ministry of Transport, Roads, Housing and Public Works in the Turkana County Government, the Roads Superintendent at Kenya Rural Roads Authority, County Executive Member in-charge of Ministry of Transport, Roads, Housing and Public Works in the Turkana County Government and the proprietor of Kabarait Builders and Contractors Ltd., be charged variously with four counts of wilful failure to comply with the law relating to procurement contrary to section 45 (2) (b) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; two counts of unlawful acquisition of public property contrary to section 45 (1) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; and three counts of abuse of office contrary to section 46 as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 31st May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/MSA/FI/INQ/12/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against former Chief Planning Officer, Garissa County

Investigations established that the complainant visited the offices of Ministry of Lands, Roads, Housing Development and Public Works at Garissa County with a view to processing a title document to her farm when she was introduced to the suspect, Chief Planning Officer of the said Ministry. That the suspect asked the complainant for KSh. 100,000 as facilitation fees for that process and the complainant later on paid that amount.

Investigations further established that finally the suspect did not process the title as he had undertaken, causing the complainant to report the matter to EACC offices at Garissa County.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th April, 2016, recommending that the suspect to be charged with the offence of obtaining by false pretences contrary to section 313 of the Penal Code.

On 12th July, 2016, DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/MKS/FI/INO/01/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Embezzlement of Public Funds, abuse of Office By Uwezo Fund Chairman in Mwala Sub-County in Machakos County

Investigations revealed that some members of Constituency Uweze Fund Management Committee in Mwala Sub-County, Machakes County, irregularly allocated public funds to a number of youth groups and one member of the Fund allocated himself the Fund anoney without disclosing his interest to the Fund.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 5th April. 2016, recommending that the suspect to be charged with one count of wilful failure to comply with the guidelines relating to issuance of Uwezo Funds contrary to section 45 (2) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; five counts of abuse of office contrary to section 46 as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; one count of fraudulent acquisition of public property contrary to section 45 (1) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; and failure to disclose a private interest to one's principal contrary to section 42 (1) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 30th May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

CR.760/17/2016-ACC.1/2016

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against a Police Officer at
Busia Police Station

Investigations revealed that the suspect, a police officer attached at Busia Police Station, solicited from the two complainants a beautic KSh. 300,000 but only received KSh. 100,000 as an inducement to release to them their gold product which he had confiscated from them at aroad block along Busia-Kisumu Highway.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 5th April. 2016 recommending that the suspect be charged with offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 35 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 26th May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation are prosecution.

EACC/FI/INQ/62/2013

Inquiry into Allegations of Embezzlement of a Grant from National Council for Persons with Disabilities by Officials of Ahero Disabilities Group

Investigations established that the National Council for Ferroman with Disabilities under the Ministry of Labour, Social Security and Services gave a grant of KSh. 500,000 to Aheao Disabled Group that was to be applied for starting up a Micro Enterprise Scheme. That the suspects who are officials of the group however misappropriated that money.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 5th April. 2016 recommending that the Chairperson and other officials of Aband Disabled Group be charged with offences of fraudulently acquiring public property contrary to section 45 (1) (a) as read with section 45 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act. 2003 conspiracy to commit an economic crime contrary to section 47A (5) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; and making a false document contrary to section 347 (a) as read with section 349 of the Penal Code.

On 14th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/FI/INQ/05/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Biased Issuance of AIE to Western and Nyanza Regions in the Financial Year 2012/2013 and Bribery in Award of Contracts for Building Water Pans/Dams in Tarda against Officers of the Ministry of Water

Investigations revealed that there was no evidence to suggest conspiracy between the Principal Accounts Controller, Chief Finance

Officer and Permanent Secretary (who served the ministry from 2008 to 2013) of the then Ministry of Water and Irrigation and District Water Officers within formerly Nyanza and Western provinces to misappropriate alleged public money in respect of Authority to Incur Expenses of KSh. 10 million. The investigations also established no evidence of bribery on the part of the officials mentioned in regard to misuse of Authority to Incur Expenses.

Further investigations established that the former Principal Secretary in the State Department of Water and Regional Authorities and Senior Assistant Director in the Land Reclamation and Water Storage both of the Ministry of Environment, Water and Natural Resources, and Engineering Services Manager, Civil Engineering Department at Tana-Athi River Development Authority (TARDA) did not solicit for bribes prior to awarding contracts to construct dams and water pans within the TARDA areas. However the investigations established that these three officials were operating businesses and earning substantial amount of income and it was not clear if they were disclosing this income to Kenya Revenue Authority for purposes of tax payment.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 19th April, 2016, recommending that the file be closed save for referral to Kenya Revenue Authority for investigations regarding the tax issues.

On 16th June, 2016, DPP accepted the recommendation to close the file.

EACC/GSA/FI/INQ/24/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Alleged Embezziement and Misappropriation of Public Funds by Eldas CDF Manager and Committee

Investigations established that Eldas CDF Committee, in the Financial Year 2013/2014, allocated funds for street lighting and fresh produce market within Wajir County. However the Wajir County Government took over the implementation of the said projects. Eldas CDF Committee therefore applied to the National CDF Board for the re-allocation of those funds for other projects, namely purchase of desks and drilling of a borehole, which application was allowed and the funds used for the said projects. There was therefore no wrongdoing on the part of the Eldas CDF Manager and Committee.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 26th April, 2016, recommending that the file be closed with no further action.

On 14th June, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for closure of the file.

CR.832/325/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Criminal Investigation Officers Based at Kitale Police Station

Investigations revealed that the suspects, both police officers attached at Kitale Police Station, solicited from the complainant a sum of KSh. 200,000 which they later on reduced to KSh. 100,000, as an inducement so as to withdraw a criminal case the complainant was facing at Kitale Law Court. Investigations further established that the suspects however did not to receive the benefit as the suspects kept on changing the meeting points and therefore the complainant was unable to meet the suspects. Investigations therefore only established the aspect of soliciting for a benefit.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 21st April, 2016, recommending that the suspects be charged with offences of corruptly soliciting for a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 8th June, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/FI/INQ/90/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Irregularities in the Award of the Tender for Clearing, Repair and Repainting of Tank 14-Tk-301 At Kipevu Oil Storage Facility (Kosf) in Mombasa by Kenya Pipeline Company

Investigations established that Kenya Pipeline Company followed the law in the procurement process that eventually resulted to the award of the Tender for Clearing, Repair and Repainting of Tank 14tk-301 at Kipevu Oil Storage Facility (KOSF) in Mombasa.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 22nd April, 2016, recommending that the closure of the file.

On 6th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation to close the file.

EACC/JKIA/FI/INO/04/2015

Inquiry into Irregularities in the Tender Kaa/193/2013-2014
Procurement of Single Master Licensee for the Development and
Management of Duty Free Shops at Jorno Kenyatta International
Airport Terminal 1A

Investigations established that the procurement process for the tender of procurement of single master licensee for the development and management of duty free shops at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport Terminal 1A, was above board. Investigations further established that the KAA officials received no bribe in the said procurement process.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th May, 2016, recommending that the closure of the file with no further action.

On 6th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation to close the file.

CR.148/4/2016-ACC. 4/2016

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Employees of Nairobi City County

Investigations revealed that the suspects, both employees of Nairobi City County, solicited from the complainant a benefit of KSh. 165,000 but received a benefit of KSh. 80,000, as an inducement so as not to inflate the water bill and disconnect the sewer line for the complainant.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th May, 2016, recommending the suspects be charged with offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 10th June, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

CR.313/22/2016-ACC. 1/2016

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against a Private Citizen

Investigations revealed that the suspect offered and gave a benefit of KSh. 2,000 to officers from Kenya Police Service and Kenya Defence Forces manning a road block along Mombass-Malindi Highway as an inducement so as not to be arrested for unlawful possession of suspected narcotic drugs.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 4th May, 2016, recommending the suspects be charged with offences of corruptly offering and giving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (b) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 31st May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

CR.449/40/2016-MACHAKOS ACC. CF 2/2016

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Traffic Police Officers at the Kamburu Road Block along Embu-Mwingi Road

Investigations revealed that the suspects, all police officers from Masinga Police Post, were in the practice of soliciting and receiving bribes from drivers of motor vehicles at Kamburu Road Block, along Embu-Mwingi Road. Investigations further established that one suspect received a benefit from some of the drivers along that road apparently as an inducement to forbear applying the traffic law.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 6th May, 2016, recommending that one of the suspects be charged with the offence of dealing with suspect property contrary to section 47 (2) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003 and abuse of office contrary to section 46 as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003, and that administrative action be taken against the other suspects.

On 13th May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution of one of the suspects and administrative action against the others.

CR.313/393/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Revenue Officers within the Kilifi County Government

Investigations revealed that the suspects, all employees of Kilifi County Government as revenue officers, solicited from and received from the complainant a benefit of KSh. 1,500 as an inducement so as

to allow him continue operating his butchery business without paying for another licence.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 6th May, 2016 recommending that the suspects be charged with offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003, and a further offence of conspiracy to commit an offence of corruption contrary to section 47A (3) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 31st May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

CR.21/53/2015-CF: ACC. MSA 13/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against an Administration Police Officer based at Mikindani

Investigations revealed that the suspect, an Administration Police Officer employed by the National Police Service based at Mikindani, solicited from the complainant a benefit of KSh. 2,000 as an inducement so as to release to him a motorcycle he had impounded ostensibly for the reason that it had no registration number plates. Investigations further established that the suspect later on decline to receive the benefit. Investigations however established the aspect of soliciting for a benefit.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 9th May, 2016, recommending that the suspect be charged with the offence of corruptly soliciting for a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 30th May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

CASE FILE NO. 442/43/16

Inquiry into Allegations of Impersonating an EACC Investigator

Investigations revealed that two of the three suspects, impersonating themselves as employees of Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission made calls to Mlolongo Directorate of Criminal Investigations within Athi River Police Division asking for the release of a Chinese national who had been detained in police custody for the offence of being in unlawful possession of wildlife trophies. The suspects were found in possession of employment cards from Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, Kenya Bureau of Standards and Kenya Revenue Authority yet they were not employees of the said entities.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 9th May, 2016 recommending that the two of the suspects be charged with the offence of impersonating an investigator contrary to section 34 (1) as read with section 34 (2) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003, and in the alternative, the offence of acting as an investigator contrary to section 34 (1) as read with section 34 (2) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; and one of the two suspects be charged with two counts of making a document without authority contrary to section 357 (A) of the Penal Code. The third suspect has been proposed to be a prosecution witness since the evidence did not establish culpability on his part.

On 8th June, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/FI/INQ/99/2015

Inquiry into Allegations that the National Campaign Against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA) Irregularly Procured Ernest and Young as the Fund Manager to Disburse Money to Civil Society Organisations

Investigations established that there was need for NACADA to procure the services of a Fund Management Agency to manage and disburse the sum of KSh. 99 million that NACADA had set aside for Civil Society Organisations. Further investigations revealed that the suspects who are employees of NACADA breached procurement law in the procurement process of the said fund management agency.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 23rd May, 2016, recommending that the accounting officer together with members of the Tender Committee be charged with two counts of

wilful failure to comply with the law relating to procurement contrary to section 45 (2) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003, and one count of abuse of office contrary to section 46 of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003 and the members of the tender committee be charged with two counts of wilful failure to comply with the law relating to procurement contrary to section 45 (2) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 14th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/OPS/INO/NYR/5/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against a Senior Support Staff at Makurweni Law Courts

Investigations revealed that the suspect, a senior Support Staff at Makurweni Law Courts solicited for and received from the complainant a benefit of KSh. 1,500 as an inducement so as to facilitate the release of court proceedings in Makurweni Principal Magistrate's Court, Criminai Case number 30/2015.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 24th May, 2016, recommending that the suspect be charged with the offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 14th June, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

CR. 313/367/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Soliciting and Receiving a Bribe of KSh. 10,000 by an Enforcement Officer in the Rank of a Constable in Kilifi County Government

Investigations revealed that the suspect, an Enforcement Officer is the rank of a constable in Kilifi County Government solicited for and received from the complainant a benefit of KSh. 10,000 as an inducement so as not to stop the complainant from constructing his house.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 19th May; 2016, recommending that the suspect be charged with the offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benealt contrary to section 3; (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 13th May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

CR. 313/262/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruptly Soliciting and Receiving a Bribe by Employees of Kilifi County Assembly in the Malindi Town Ward Representative's Office

Investigations revealed that the suspects, both employees of the Kilifi County Government Assembly solicited for and received from the complainant a benefit of KSh. 3,000 as an inducement so as a release to him a bursary cheque of KSh. 3,000.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 19th May, 2016, recommending that the suspect be charged with the offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 13th May, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/NKR/INQ/71/29/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Bomet County
Government Officials in the Procurement for the Supply of Bullding
Materials and Rennovation of Governor's Residence

Investigations established that there were irregularities in the procurement for works in renovating a building that was to serve as the Governor's residence. Investigations further revealed that there was no budget neither plan for this procurement in the Financial Year 2013/2014.

Investigations also revealed that the officials of the County Government despite these procurement irregularities procured the services of a private limited company that finally carried out the subject renovation works. The County Government finally paid the company for the works done.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 23rd May, 2016, recommending that the Chief Officer Administration be charged with the offence of engaging in a project without prior planning contrary to section 45 (2) (c) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; Head of Accounts be charged with the offence of abuse of office contrary to section 46 of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; Chief officer Administration and Chief Finance Officer be charge with the offence of careless failure to comply with applicable procedures and guldelines relating to procurement contrary to section 45 (2) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; Head of Accounts be charged with the offences of deceiving EACC investigator contrary to section 66 (1) (b) as read with section 66 (2) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003 and making a faise document contrary to section 347 (a) of the Penal Code; members of the Tender Committee be charged with the offence of careless failure to comply with applicable procedures and guidelines relating to procurement contrary to section 45 (2) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003; the limited liability company and its proprietor be charged with the offence of carrying o business of a contractor without registration contrary to section 15 (1) as read with section 15 (3) of the National Construction Authority Act, No: 41 of 2011.

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Police Officers based at Nilmaru Police Station

Investigations revealed that the suspects, an Officer Commanding Police Station and a police officer attached at Ntimaru Police Station, solicited for and received a benefit of KSh. 20,000 from the complainant as an inducement so as not to charge him for impersonating a medical practitioner.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 2nd June, 2016, recommending that the suspects be charged with the offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 13th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution against one suspect.

EACC/FI/INO/92/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Procurement Irregularities at Kenya Pipeline Company in Awarding Tender No: Su/Qt/3068f/12 for Purchase of Three Complete Spinning Rotors for Sulzer Dalian Vertical Pump

Investigations revealed that the Kenya Pipeline Corporation (K. P. C.) had the need to procure three complete spinning rotors and that the Tender Committee approved the direct procurement be used in the procurement process. That the K. P. C., finally awarded this tender to the supplier and forwarded to it the relevant contract document for execution. That the supplier however failed to execute the contract document neither did it supply the rotors.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 17th June, 2016, recommending that the file be closed and K. P. C., to liquidate the performance bond issued in this contract.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 17th June, 2016, recommending that the suspects be charged with the offences of corruptly offering and giving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (b)

as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003 and conspiracy to commit an offence of corruption contrary to section 47A (3) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 13th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

CR. 148/10/2016-CF, ACC, MILIMANI NO. 06/2016

Inquiry into Allegations of Corruption against Committee Members for Ngel Ward Development Fund.

Investigations revealed that the suspects, both employees of Ngei Ward Development Fund under the Nairobi County Government solicited for and received a benefit of KSh. 5,000 to the complainant as an inducement to forbear charging him with him with failing to display a licence for his clinic.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 14th June, 2016, recommending that the suspects be charged with the offences of corruptly soliciting for and receiving a benefit contrary to section 39 (3) (a) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 12th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/FI/INQ/92/2015

Inquiry into Allegations that a Member of Parliament for Kapseret Constituency does not possess the Requisite Academic Qualifications and is Suspected to have Forged Certificates or Submitted a False Declaration during the 2013 General Elections

Investigations revealed that the suspect who is a Member of Parliament for Kapseret Constituency presented forged Diploma Certificate in Business Management and Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education to Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IBBC) as he sought nomination for election as a Member of Parliament.

Investigations further revealed that the suspect made a faise declaration under oath through a self-declaration form to IEBC. That the suspect also uttered the said forged documents to IEBC and Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) with intention to deceive these Commissions.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 17th June, 2016, recommending that the Member of Parliament be charged with three counts of forgery contrary to section 349 as read with section 345 of the Penal Code; three counts of uttering of false documents contrary to section 353 of the Penal Code; two counts of providing a false information contrary to section 46 (1) (d) as read with section 46 (2) of the Leadership and Integrity Act; and making a false statutory declaration contrary to section 11 of the Oaths and Statutory Declarations Act.

On 13th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

EACC/EL/INQ/33/2015

Inquiry into Allegations of Conflict of Interest and influencing Award of Tenders by an Employee of Sports Stadia Management Board to his Magazine, the East African Business Times

Investigations revealed that the suspect, an employee of Sports Stadia Management Board (the board) at the same time is a co-director at the private company The East African Business Times Ltd, holding 50% shareholding. Investigations further revealed that the suspect held positions in both Tender Committee and Integrity Assurance Committee at the Board.

Investigations also established that the board between December, 2012 and June, 2015 awarded this company contracts worth KSh. 3,797,000 yet the suspect failed to declare his interest or conflict of interest in these contracts as between his company and his employer, the board.

A report was compiled and forwarded to the DPP on 17th June, 2016 recommending that the suspect be charged with one count of failure to disclose a private interest to one's principal contrary to section 42 (1) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003 and two counts of conflict of interest contrary to section 42 (1) (b) as read with section 48 (1) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

On 14th July, 2016, the DPP accepted the recommendation for prosecution.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS TO THE KENYA GAZETTE

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the Kenya Gazette, Supplement, etc.:

- The Kenya Gazene contains Notices of a general nature which do not affect legislation. They are, therefore, submitted to the Government Printer directly.
- (2) Legislative Supplement contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government. Because of this, they must be submitted to the Government Printer through the office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) Bill Supplement contains Bills which are for introduction in the National Assembly.
- (4) Act Supplement contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of an A4 sheet no matter how small the Notice is, each page being numbered and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible and contain no alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:

- Signature must be supported by rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signatory in capital letters.
- (ii) Must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to Notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition, of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D-

Kenya Gazette

- "D 34. (1) Communications for the Kenya Gazette should reach the Government Printer not later than 9 a.m. on Friday of the week before publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the Gazette.
- (2) Ministries will be required to pay for the Kenya Gazette and to meet the cost of advertising in it.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
