(CAP. 53:05)

NATIONAL CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY (REGISTRATION OF FOREIGN FIRMS (CONTRACTORS)) REGULATIONS, 2024

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 29 of the National Construction Industry Act, I, JACOB HARA, Minister of Transport and Public Works, with the advice of the Council, make the following Regulations—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Construction Industry (Registration of Foreign firms (Contractors)) Regulations, 2024 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st April, 2024.

Citation and commencement

2. In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation

“construction” means processes involved in the planning, designing, measurements, procurement, erection, building, production, alteration, maintenance, repairs, renovations or demolition of buildings and engineering infrastructure and includes site preparation, excavation, drilling, the supply of products and materials, the supply of equipment and machinery and the installation and repair of fixtures of a building or engineering infrastructure and supervision of such works;

“contractor” means a person who undertakes to carry out construction for another person or for himself whether for a reward or not; and

“firm” means a foreign firm registered as a contractor in accordance with these Regulations.

3.—(1) A person who intends to carry on business in construction as a foreign firm contractor shall apply to the Council for registration as a civil, building or electrical contractor.

Application for registration

(2) An application for registration shall be in Form 1 prescribed in the *First Schedule* and shall be accompanied by—

(a) a certified copy of a certificate of incorporation issued under the Companies Act for registration as a foreign company;

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(b) a certified copy of a business permit for the foreign company issued by the Government of Malawi;

(c) a notarized copy of a certificate of incorporation of the foreign firm in the country of origin;

(d) a certified copy of a Tax Registration Certificate issued by the Malawi Revenue Authority;

(e) proof of valid bank account, in the name of the foreign firm, held at a bank registered in Malawi;

(f) notarized copy of Memorandum and Articles of Association;

(g) proof of authorization to carry on business in construction from the country of domicile or origin;

(h) notarized copies of academic qualifications or valid professional registration certificates for all shareholders, directors and staff, issued by the relevant professional boards or institutions in Malawi;

(i) in the case of an application for an electrical contractor, certified copies valid permits issued by Malawi Energy Regulatory Authority;

(j) particulars and contact details of all directors and shareholders including certified copies of their passports; and

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(k) proof of payment of the application fee prescribed in the National Construction Industry (Fees) Regulations.

(3) The Council shall only register foreign firms where at least one of the directors has a qualification in the fields prescribed in the *Second Schedule*.

(4) Where an applicant submits a document, which is in a language other than English, the applicant shall attach the document translated into the English language and the translated copies are duly notarized by a licensed notary public.

Registration

4.—(1) Upon receipt of an application under regulation 3, the Council shall assess the application and verify the authenticity of the information submitted in the application.

(2) Notwithstanding the provision of subregulation (1), the Council may conduct a physical verification to ascertain the authenticity of the information submitted by the applicant.

(3) In assessing and verifying the application, the Council shall consider the qualifications for registration listed under section 23(1) of the Act.

(4) In addition to the qualifications for registration listed under section 23(1) of the Act, the Council shall consider the following—

(a) particulars of at least three duly completed projects within the past five years;

(b) compliance with relevant regulatory Authorities;

(c) availability of transportation;

(d) adequate office space and office equipment; and

(e) adequate personal protective equipment.

(5) Where the Council is satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements, the Council shall—

(a) issue a certificate of registration to the applicant subject to terms and conditions as the Council may prescribe; and

(b) register the applicant as a civil, building or electrical contractor.

(6) The certificate of registration issued under subregulation (5) shall be valid from 1st April to 31st March of the following year.

(7) The certificate of registration shall be issued to the applicant upon payment of the registration fee prescribed under the National Construction Industry (Fees) Regulations.

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(8) The certificate issued under subregulation (5) shall be *prima facie* evidence of registration with the Council.

(9) A certificate of registration issued under this regulation shall not be transferable.

(10) Notwithstanding the provision of subregulation (1), the Council may reject an application where—

(a) any person whose presence is required, is not present, or any document the production of which has been demanded, has not been produced; or

(b) the application contains information which is incomplete, inconsistent or misleading.

(11) Where the Council is not satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements for registration, the Council may—

(a) reject the application;

(b) inform the applicant in writing with reasons for its decision; and

(c) give the applicant a maximum of twenty-one days to make good the reasons for which the application was rejected.

(12) A foreign firm that contravenes conditions imposed under subregulation (5) shall be subject to suspension or revocation of the certificate of registration to execute the contract.

5.—(1) Where a foreign firm domiciled outside Malawi and not registered by the Council, is awarded a contract to be executed in Malawi, the foreign firm shall, before execution of the contract, register with the Council for registration, to execute the contract.

(2) The foreign firm applying for registration to execute a contract under subregulation (1) shall operate with a Malawian firm through a Joint Venture arrangement or subcontracting arrangement in accordance with the National Construction Industry (Subcontracting and Joint Venture between Foreign Contractor and Malawian Contractor) Regulations.

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(3) An application for registration for purposes of subregulation (1) shall be in Form 2 in the *Third Schedule* and shall, in addition to requirements in regulation 3, be accompanied with the following documents—

(a) a certified copy of the contract to be executed in Malawi;

(b) a certified copy of the Joint Venture Agreement or Subcontract Agreement with a Malawian firm in accordance with the National Construction Industry (Subcontracting and Joint Ventures between Foreign Contractors and Malawian Contractors) Regulations; and

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(c) evidence of successful completion of similar projects in the past five years.

(4) The Council shall, where it is satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements for registration—

(a) issue a certificate of registration to execute the contract to the applicant subject to terms and conditions as the Council may prescribe; and

(b) register the applicant as a civil, building or electrical contractor.

(5) The Council shall only register a foreign firm in class 8.

(6) The certificate of registration to execute the contract issued under subregulation (4) shall be—

(a) specific to the project to be executed under the contract awarded;

(b) valid for the duration of the contract period; and

(c) subject to payment of annual renewal fees prescribed in the National Construction Industry (Fees) Regulations.

(7) A foreign firm issued with a certificate of registration to execute the contract under this regulation shall not be eligible for registration under regulation 4 until the contract for which the registration under this regulation was issued has been successfully completed.

(8) The certificate of registration to execute the contract shall be issued to the applicant upon payment of the registration fee prescribed in the National Construction Industry (Fees) Regulations.

(9) The certificate of registration to execute the contract issued under subregulation (4) shall be *prima facie* evidence of registration with the Council.

(10) A certificate of registration to execute the contract issued under this Regulation shall not be transferable.

(11) Where the Council is not satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements for registration, the Council may—

(a) reject the application; and

(b) inform the applicant in writing with reasons for its decision.

(12) A foreign firm that contravenes conditions & conditions imposed under subregulation (4) shall be subject to suspension or revocation of the certificate of registration to execute the contract.

6.—(1) A firm shall, upon expiry of the certificate, or thirty days before the expiry of the certificate, submit to the Council an application for renewal of the certificate.

(2) An application for renewal of a certificate shall be made in Form 4 in the *Fourth Schedule* and shall be supported by—

(a) proof of payment of the renewal fee prescribed under the National Construction Industry (Fees) Regulations;

(b) a certified copy of a valid tax clearance certificate;

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(c) evidence of payment of levy for any construction project undertaken in the previous financial year;

(d) evidence of project registration for any construction project undertaken in the previous financial year; and

(e) valid permits issued by the Malawi Energy Regulatory Authority.

(3) Where the Council is satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements for renewal, the Council shall issue a certificate to the applicant subject to terms and conditions as the Council may prescribe.

(4) Notwithstanding the requirements in subregulation (2), the Council may reject an application for renewal of registration where—

(a) the applicant or its directors have been convicted of an offence under the Companies Act or any other written law;

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(b) the applicant has not paid levy in accordance with the National Construction Industry Levy Order; or

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(c) the applicant has not registered the project in accordance with the National Construction Industry (Project Registration) Regulations.

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(5) Notwithstanding the requirements for renewal under this regulation, a firm registered as a contractor to execute a contract under regulation 5 shall, upon expiry of the certificate, or thirty days before the expiry of the certificate, pay to the Council, a renewal fee prescribed in the National Construction Industry (Fees) Regulations.

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(6) The Council shall not renew a certificate of registration to execute a contract where the foreign firm registered as a contractor has contravened the terms and conditions of the Joint Venture arrangement, subcontracting arrangement or the certificate of registration.

7.—(1) A firm registered under these Regulations shall notify the Council of any change in the particular submitted under regulation 4 and 5 within fourteen days of the change.

(2) The Council may make any necessary alteration or correction in the register in relation to any entry made therein.

8.—(1) A firm registered as a contractor under regulations 4 and 5 which ceases to carry on business in the construction industry in Malawi shall notify the Council, in writing, within sixty days of the cessation of business.

(2) The Council shall, upon receipt of the notification under subregulation (1) revoke the certificate of registration and strike off the name of the firm from the register.

9.—(1) A person who, for whatever reasons, intends to take over a firm registered as, shall apply for registration of that business in his or her own name and that application shall be treated as a new application.

Change of

(2) In the assessment of an application for change of ownership under subregulation (1), the Council shall not take into consideration the experience of the previous owner of the firm.

Striking off

10.—(1) Subject to the Act, the Council may suspend, or strike off from the register, a firm registered under these Regulations.

(2) Where a firm is suspended from the register, the suspension may be lifted by the Council, upon the—

(a) expiry of the suspension period; or

(b) rectification of grounds leading to suspension, or implementing conditions stated in suspension letter.

(3) A foreign firm registered as a contractor whose certificate of registration has been revoked and whose name has been struck off from the Register may apply to the Council for a fresh registration in accordance with regulation 3.

(4) The Council shall be allowed to receive and consider an application for a fresh registration under subregulation (3) after the expiry of seven years from the date the firm's name was struck off from the register.

NATIONAL CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY (REGISTRATION OF MALAWIAN FIRMS (CONTRACTORS)) REGULATIONS, 2024

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 29 of the National Construction Industry Act, I, JACOB HARA, Minister of Transport and Public Works, with the advice of the Council, make the following Regulations—

Citation and

ment

1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Construction Industry (Registration of Malawian firms (Contractors)) Regulations, 2024 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st April, 2024.

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“construction” means processes involved in the planning, designing, measurements, procurement, erection, building, production, alteration, maintenance, repairs, renovations or demolition of buildings and engineering infrastructure and includes site preparation, excavation, drilling, the supply of products and materials, the supply of equipment and machinery and the installation and repair of fixtures of a building or engineering infrastructure and supervision of such works;

“contractor” means a person who undertakes to carry out construction for another person or for himself whether for a reward or not; and

“firm” means a Malawian firm registered as a contractor in accordance with these Regulations.

3.—(1) A person who intends to carry on business in construction as a Malawian firm contractor shall apply to the Council for registration in the category and class prescribed in the *First Schedule*.

(2) An application for registration shall be in Form 1 prescribed in the *Second Schedule* and shall be accompanied by—

- (b) proof of valid bank account in the name of the firm;
- (c) certified copy of orientation course certificate issued by the Council;
- (d) qualifications of permanent key personnel;
- (e) proof of ownership of plant and equipment;
- (f) in the case of a body corporate—

- (i) certified copy of certificate of incorporation issued under the Companies Act;
- (ii) certified copy of Memorandum and Articles of Association;
- (iii) certified copies of academic qualifications or valid professional registration certificates for all shareholders and

directors, issued by the relevant professional boards or institutions, or valid licences or permits issued by relevant regulatory authorities in Malawi; and

(iv) particulars and contact details of all directors and shareholders including certified copies of their national identification cards;

(g) in the case of a partnership—

(i) certified copy of the business registration certificate issued under the Business Registration Act;

(ii) a copy of the partnership agreement;

(iii) certified copies of academic qualifications or valid professional registration certificates for the partners, issued by the relevant professional boards or institutions, or valid licences or permits issued by relevant regulatory authorities in Malawi; and

(iv) particulars and contact details of the partners, including certified copies of their national identification cards; and

(h) in the case of a sole proprietor—

(i) certified copy of certificate of the business registration certificate issued under the Business Registration Act;

(ii) certified copies of academic qualifications or valid professional registration certificates of the sole proprietor, issued by the relevant professional boards or institutions or valid licences or permit issued by relevant regulatory authorities in Malawi; and

(iii) particulars and contact details of the sole proprietor, including certified copies of their national identification cards.

4.—(1) Upon receipt of an application under regulation 3, the Council shall assess the application and verify the authenticity of the information submitted in the application.

Registration

(2) Notwithstanding the provision of subregulation (1), the Council may conduct a physical verification to ascertain the authenticity of the information submitted by the applicant.

(3) In assessing and verifying the application, the Council shall consider the qualifications for registration listed under section 23(1) of the Act.

(4) In addition to the qualifications for registration listed under section 23(1) of the Act, the Council may consider the following—

(a) availability of transportation;

(b) adequate office space and office equipment; and

(c) adequate personal protective equipment.

(5) The Council shall register an applicant as a contractor in a category and class in accordance with the minimum academic qualifications of, at least, one of the directors, partners or sole proprietors, as the case may be, as prescribed in the *Third Schedule*.

- (6) Where the Council is satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements referred to in subregulations (3), (4), and (5), the Council shall—
- (a) issue a certificate of registration to the applicant, subject to terms and conditions as the Council may prescribe; and
 - (b) register the applicant as a contractor, in accordance with the category and class of registration prescribed in the First Schedule.
- (7) The Council shall only register a new applicant into Class 1 to 5 prescribed in the *First Schedule*.
- (8) The Council shall register an applicant into Class 6 to 8 where an applicant, who is already registered with the Council, makes an application for upgrading in accordance with the requirements stipulated under regulation 6.
- (9) Where the Council determines that an application has not met the registration requirements for the class in which the applicant had applied for, the Council may register that applicant in a class of registration that is lower than the class applied for.
- (10) The Council shall not register any firm into Class 7 or Class 8, unless that firm is incorporated under the Companies Act.
- (11) The certificate of registration issued under subregulation (6) shall be valid from 1st April to 31st March of the following year.
- (12) The certificate of registration shall be issued to the applicant upon payment of the registration fee prescribed under the National Construction Industry (Fees) Regulations.
- (13) The certificate issued under subregulation (6) shall be prima facie evidence of registration with the Council.
- (14) A certificate of registration issued under this regulation shall not be transferable.
- (15) Notwithstanding the provision of subregulation (1), the Council may reject an application where—
- (a) any person whose presence is required, is not present, or any document the production of which has been demanded, has not been produced; or
 - (b) the application contains information which is incomplete, inconsistent or misleading.
- (16) Where the Council is not satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements for registration, the Council may—
- (a) reject the application;
 - (b) inform the applicant, in writing, with reasons for its decision; and
 - (c) give the applicant a maximum of twenty-one days to make good the reasons for which the application was rejected.

(5) Where the Council is satisfied that the firm registered as a contractor has met the upgrading criteria in subregulation (2), the Council shall issue a certificate of registration for the class applied for.

(6) The certificate of registration under this regulation shall be issued to the applicant upon submission of proof of payment of the difference between the renewal fee of the current class and the renewal fee of the class applied for, as prescribed under the National Construction Industry (Fees) Regulations.

(7) The Council may reject an application where—

(a) any person whose presence is required, is not present, or any document the production of which has been demanded, has not been produced; or

(b) the application contains information which is incomplete, inconsistent or misleading.

(8) Where the Council is not satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements upgrading, the Council may—

(a) reject the application;

(b) inform the applicant, in writing, with reasons for its decision; and

(c) give the applicant a maximum of twenty-one days to make good the reasons for which the application was rejected.

7.—(1) A firm registered under these Regulations shall notify the Council of any change in the particular submitted under regulation 3, within fourteen days of the change.

NATIONAL CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY ACT

(CAP. 53:05)

NATIONAL CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY (REGISTRATION OF MALAWIAN FIRMS (CONSULTANTS)) REGULATIONS, 2024

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 29 of the National Construction Industry Act, I, Jacob Hara, Minister of Transport and Public Works, with the advice of the Council, make the following Regulations—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Construction Industry (Registration of Malawian firms (Consultants)) Regulations, 2024 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st April, 2024.

Citation and commencement

2. In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation

“construction” means processes involved in the planning, designing, measurements, procurement, erection, building, production, alteration, maintenance, repairs, renovations or demolition of buildings and engineering infrastructure and includes site preparation, excavation, drilling, the supply of products and materials, the supply of equipment and machinery and the installation and repair of fixtures of a building or engineering infrastructure and supervision of such works;

“consultant” means a person who provides professional services in the planning, design, measurement, management and supervision of construction; and

“firm” means a Malawian firm registered as a consultant in accordance with these Regulations.

3.—(1) A person who intends to carry on business in construction as a Malawian firm consultant shall apply to the Council for registration in the category prescribed in the *First Schedule*.

Application for registration

(2) An application for registration shall be in Form 1 prescribed in the *Second Schedule* and shall be accompanied by—

(a) a certified copy of a Tax Registration Certificate;

(b) proof of valid bank account in the name of the firm;

(c) in the case of a body corporate—

(i) certified copy of certificate of incorporation issued under the Companies Act;

Cap. 46:03

(ii) certified copy of Memorandum and Articles of Association;
(iii) certified copies of academic qualifications and valid professional registration certificates for all shareholders issued by the relevant Professional Boards or institutions or valid licences or permits issued by relevant regulatory authorities in Malawi; and

(iv) particulars and contact details of all directors and shareholders including certified copies of their nation identification cards;

(d) in the case of a partnership—

Cap. 46:02

(i) certified copy of the Business Registration Certificate issued under the Business Registration Act;

(ii) a copy of the partnership agreement;

(iii) certified copies of academic qualifications or valid professional registration certificates for the partners, issued by the relevant professional Boards or Institutions, or valid licences or permits issued by relevant regulatory authorities in Malawi; and

(iv) particulars and contact details of the partners, including certified copies of their national identification cards;

(e) in the case of a sole proprietor—

Cap. 46:02

(i) certified copy of certificate of the Business Registration Certificate issued under the Business Registration Act;

(ii) certified copies of academic qualifications or valid professional registration certificates of the sole proprietor, issued by the relevant professional boards or institutions or valid licences or permit issued by relevant regulatory authorities in Malawi; and

(iii) particulars and contact details of the sole proprietor, **including** certified copies of their national identification cards.

Registration

4.—(1) Upon receipt of an application under regulation 3, the Council shall assess the application and verify the authenticity of the information submitted in the application.

(2) Notwithstanding the provision of subregulation (1), the Council may conduct a physical verification to ascertain the authenticity of the information submitted by the applicant.

(3) Where the Council is satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements for registration, the Council shall—

(a) issue a certificate of registration to the applicant subject to terms and conditions as the Council may prescribe; and

(b) register the applicant as a consultant in accordance with the category of registration prescribed in the *First Schedule*.

(4) The Council shall register an applicant in accordance with the qualifications for registration as a consultant prescribed in the *First Schedule*.

(5) The certificate of registration issued under subregulation (3) shall be valid from 1st April to 31st March of the following year.

(6) The certificate of registration shall be issued to the applicant upon payment of the registration fee prescribed under the National Construction Industry (Fees) Regulations.

G. N. 44/2023

(7) The certificate of registration issued under subregulation (3) shall be *prima facie* evidence of registration with the Council.

(8) A certificate of registration issued under this regulation shall not be transferable.

(9) Notwithstanding the provision of subregulation (1), the Council may reject an application where—

(a) any person whose presence is required, is not present, or any document the production of which has been demanded, has not been produced; or

(b) the application contains information which is incomplete, inconsistent or misleading.

(10) Where the Council is not satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements for registration, the Council may—

(a) reject the application;

(b) inform the applicant in writing with reasons for its decision; and

(c) give the applicant a maximum of twenty-one days to make good the reasons for which the application was rejected.

5.—(1) A firm registered under these Regulations shall, upon expiry of the certificate, or thirty days before the expiry of the certificate, submit to the Council an application for renewal of the certificate of registration. Renewal of certificate

(2) An application for renewal of a certificate of registration shall be made in Form 1 in the *Third Schedule* and shall be supported by—

(a) proof of payment of the renewal fee prescribed under the National Construction Industry (Fees) Regulations; G.N. 44/2023

(b) a certified copy of a valid tax clearance certificate;

(c) evidence of payment of levy for any construction project undertaken in the previous financial year;

(d) evidence of project registration for any construction project undertaken in the previous financial year; and

(e) valid licences issued by relevant professional boards or institutions in Malawi.

(3) Where the Council is satisfied that the applicant has met the requirements for renewal, the Council shall issue a certificate of registration to the applicant subject to terms and conditions as the Council may prescribe.

(4) Notwithstanding the requirements in subregulation (2), the Council may reject an application for renewal of registration where—

(a) the applicant's Business Registration Certificate issued under the Business Registration Act has been canceled or has expired; Cap 46:02

(b) in the case of a body corporate, the body corporate or its directors have been convicted of an offence under the Companies Act or any other written law; Cap 40:03

(c) the applicant did not register any project undertaken in the previous financial year in accordance with National Construction Industry (Project Registration) Regulations; G.N. 36/2023

(d) the certificate of registration has been suspended or revoked; or

(e) the applicant has not paid levy in accordance with the National Construction Industry Levy Order.

6.—(1) A firm registered under these Regulations shall notify the Council of any change in particulars submitted under regulation 3 within fourteen days of the change.

(2) The Council may make any necessary alteration or correction in the register in relation to any entry made therein.

7.—(1) A firm which ceases to carry on business in the construction industry in Malawi shall notify the Council in writing within sixty days of the cessation of business.

(2) The Council shall, upon receipt of the notification under subregulation (1) revoke the certificate of registration and strike off the name of the firm from the register.

8.—(1) Where a person who owns a firm that is registered and operating as a sole proprietor dies, the Council shall revoke its certificate of registration and strike off the name of firm from the register

(2) Subject to subregulation (1), the administrator of the deceased estate of the person who was the sole proprietor or his or her next of kin shall, within sixty days of the date of the occurrence of the death, apply to the Council for approval of the continuation of the registration for purposes of completing any on-going project.

9.—(1) A person who, for whatever reasons, intends to take over a firm shall apply for registration of that business in his or her own name and that application shall be treated as a new application.

(2) In the assessment of an application for change of ownership under subregulation (1), the Council shall not take into consideration the experience of the previous owner of the firm.

10.—(1) Subject to the Act, the Council may suspend, or strike off from the register, a firm registered under these Regulations.

(2) Where a firm is suspended from the register, the suspension may be lifted by the Council, upon the—

(a) expiry of the suspension period; or

(b) rectification of grounds leading to suspension, or implementing conditions stated in suspension letter.

(3) A firm whose certificate of registration has been revoked and whose name has been struck off from the register may apply to the Council for a fresh registration in accordance with regulation 3.

(4) The Council shall be allowed to receive and consider an application for a fresh registration under subregulation (3) after the expiry of seven years from the date the firm's name was struck off from the register.

We also recognize that corruption has a devastating impact on the social and economic development of any country. We share in the growing global consensus that action is needed to strengthen transparency and accountability, particularly in international development, trade and investment.

We therefore pledge to support the efforts of the Government of the Republic of Malawi to participate, along with the NCIC and other members of the business community and financing institutions, in forming a coalition against corruption and all unethical conduct.

We welcome the action taken by the Council to strengthen transparency and accountability. In this context we will—

- (a) abide by the Code of Practice for Consultants engaged in the Construction Industry; and
- (b) formally undertake to issue instructions to all our employees, agents or other representatives in Malawi to at all times comply with the laws of Malawi and in particular to the laws governing the Construction Industry and to the Codes of Practice for the Construction Industry.
